





The Big Idea

In Christ, our relationships in the church are the avenue through which God ministers.

- Ministry partnerships are central to the gospel and the church's life. (vv. 7-9)
- 2. Ministry is a struggle and takes faithful partners. (10-13)
- 3. Ministry is a gift from the Lord and should unite churches. (14-18)

Ministry partnerships are central to the gospel and the church's life. (vv. 7-9)

[7] Tychicus will tell you all about my activities. He is a <u>beloved brother</u> and <u>faithful minister</u> and <u>fellow servant</u> in the Lord. [8] I have sent him to you for this very purpose, that you may know how we are and <u>that he may encourage your hearts</u>, [9] and with him Onesimus, our <u>faithful and beloved brother</u>, who is one of you. They will tell you of everything that has taken place here.

Paul emphasizes three traits of those who are engaged in ministry: beloved as brother, faithful as minister, and servant as a fellow believer. Both Tychicus and Onesimus are described with the same traits, though they come from different backgrounds (see Acts 20:4 and Philemon).

The encouragement that these men are to deliver is of the advance of the gospel and the well-being of other believers (Paul and his companions).

Paul has two types of companions: *fellow prisoners* and *fellow workers*. The fellow prisoners have been fellow workers that have been imprisoned with him. The fellow workers are often the ones carrying on further ministry in the town in Paul's name and caring for Paul (and others) while they are in prison. Epaphras demonstrates the heart of ministry: praying for others to grow in maturity and working hard for the sake of the church.

Paul provides a very specific encouragement to Archippus, to fulfill the ministry that you have been given by the Lord. Ministry is a gift or calling from the Lord. At some level, all believers are called to minister, but the Lord especially calls some to minister through preaching (see 2 Tim 4:2-5). Paul's letters were circulated among the churches, which united them in ministry and in doctrine.

Living the Christ-centered life:

Are you engaged with other Christians in a particular type of ministry? Our lives should reflect the character and activities of ministry. Faithful ministry involves skills but also a heart for the Lord and people. This heart can create a powerful bond with other believers for ministry.

Have you found ways to encourage those who are ministry with you and to you?

Paul noted that his companions had been an encouragement to him. Some of their encouragement came as they ministered together, and some came as they ministered to Paul's needs in prison.

Have you committed your resources to ministering to others?

Nympha had the church meeting in her home. Luke and Paul may have been using their other skills (physician, tent-making) to create open doors for ministry (see 4:3-5).
