
Ephesians 4

In vv.4-6 Paul lists a series of unifying principles of the Christian faith starting with the "one body" and the "one Spirit". He then proceeds to mention the unifying factors of "one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all."

[4] There is one body and one Spirit—just as you were called to the one hope that belongs to your call—[5] one Lord, one faith, one baptism, [6] one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all.

The four prepositions (3 in Greek) describe God's work with His church. He is Father of all (all adopted children), over all (Lord), through all (working through His body) and in all (by His Spirit).

- One Body- the church made up of people from all nations
- One Spirit- the Holy Spirit lives in and unites all believers
- One Hope- the gospel of the kingdom and the glorious future
- One Lord- Jesus, no other name for salvation; head of His church and future king
- One Faith- Christ is Lord; God has raised Him from the dead
- One Baptism- baptism in water that symbolizes the baptism of the Spirit
- One God, Father- The One True God has adopted us as His children



Ephesians 4

[7] But grace was given to each one of us according to the measure of Christ's gift. [8] Therefore it says, "When he ascended on high he led a host of captives, and he gave gifts to men."

Paul returns to a theme that he developed in the first two chapters of Ephesians, Christ as God's gracious gift to believers. In chapter 2, he reminds us that we are saved by grace as a gift from God. Here, he extends the theme by saying that Christ (himself, a gift) gives gifts to His people. Christ frees people from their sins and gives them gifts to grow in this new life. These gifts not only enable individual growth, but also the growth of the body, which is the emphasis of Ephesians 4.

Ephesians 4

[11] And he gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the shepherds and teachers, [12] to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ,

In this chapter, Paul focuses on the "gift" of Christ in terms of the church's leadership. These church leaders operate under the authority of the "head" (v.15), which is Christ. Paul notes the apostles (the Twelve and himself), prophets (maybe a reference to the OT prophets or NT prophets like Stephen or Agabus in Acts), evangelists (early Christian missionaries, like Philip in Acts), and shepherds/ teachers (pastors/ elders like Timothy or the Ephesian elders in Acts 20). The role of these leaders is clear: equip the saints (all church members). Body life for the church is the "work of ministry" that builds up "the body of Christ."

1 Corinthians 12:4-14

Paul, in 1 Cor. 12, elaborates further that the means by which Christ gives gifts to the church is through the Spirit. Just as in Eph.4, the Spirit unifies the body through the multi-faceted gifts.

[4] Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; [5] and there are varieties of service, but the same Lord; [6] and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who empowers them all in everyone. [7] To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. [8] For to one is given through the Spirit.... [11] All these are empowered by one and the same Spirit, who apportions to each one individually as he wills. (ESV)

1 Corinthians 12:4-14

The one body (of Christ) is gifted to serve Christ and to grow in unity and maturity (as a body) through service.

[12] For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. [13] For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and all were made to drink of one Spirit. [14] For the body does not consist of one member but of many. (ESV)

In Ephesians 4, Paul describes two benefits of the church body using the gifts from Christ (through the Spirit) to do the work of the ministry. First, the body grows in "unity of the faith." Second, the body's members grow in "knowledge of the Son of God" producing maturity (spiritual). Being unified in faith protects the church from harmful divisions and the knowledge of Christ protects the church from fleeting and false doctrines.

Ephesians 4

[15] Rather, speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, [16] from whom the whole body, joined and held together by every joint with which it is equipped, when each part is working properly, makes the body grow so that it builds itself up in love.

Returning to the theme of the needed love for one another (v.2), Paul mentions love twice in the concluding verses of this section. "Speaking the truth in love" sets the tone of the church's interactions. As the church works together in ministry and each part does it part, then the body grows and "builds itself up in love." From 2:22, we see that building up the church is the work of the Spirit as He makes us into the "dwelling place for God."

The Spirit gives:

 As the Spirit gives the church her leaders, let's follow their leadership as they point us to ministry together.

The leaders of the church are given to equip members for ministry. As we receive a new pastor, let's let him guide us and grow us in new ministries.

- 2. As the Spirit gives individual members gifts to use in the church body, let's use those gifts to bring maturity to the whole body. Individual growth and corporate maturity result from the church's members using their gifts to serve and minister to each other. Commit yourself to discovering and using your gifts within this church body.
- 3. As the Spirit gives these gifts to unify us in mutual ministry, let's serve each other with love and humility.

The motivation for ministry is not just our growth but also to express love for each other. The individual parts (members) of the church are unified by the work of the Spirit as we minister together using His gifts.
