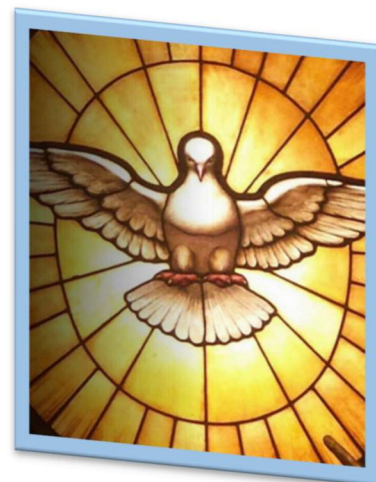

The Spirit Grieves: Ephesians 4

The Holy Spirit in
Ephesians



Ephesians 4:25-32

[25] Therefore, having put away falsehood, let each one of you speak the truth with his neighbor, for we are members one of another. [26] Be angry and do not sin; do not let the sun go down on your anger, [27] and give no opportunity to the devil. [28] Let the thief no longer steal, but rather let him labor, doing honest work with his own hands, so that he may have something to share with anyone in need. (ESV)

Ephesians 4 (A review of the Spirit's work)

In 1:13-14, Paul reminds the believers that Christ's promises are not in doubt because believers are "sealed with the promised Holy Spirit." The Spirit indwells believers and guarantees that every promise made in Christ will indeed come to be, to His praise.

[13] In him you also, when you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and believed in him, were sealed with the promised Holy Spirit, [14] who is the guarantee of our inheritance until we acquire possession of it, to the praise of his glory.

Our faith in Christ not only unites us to Christ and His life, but our faith unites us to other believers in the church by the work (and gift) of the Holy Spirit.

Ephesians 4 (A review of the Spirit's work)

In v.3, Paul describes the mysterious power that makes this loving and peaceful co-existence with other believers possible, the Spirit. [3] **eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace.** Notice the eager resolve for this unity.

Back in ch.2, Paul had noted in 2:18-19 that, “**For through him we both have access in one Spirit to the Father. So, then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God,**” and in 2:22 that in Christ believers “**are being built together into a dwelling place for God by the Spirit.**”

So, God is building a unified body by the Spirit, and believers are to strive to protect and preserve this unity, through the Spirit.

Ephesians 4 (A review of the Spirit's work)

In vv.4-6 Paul lists a series of unifying principles of the Christian faith starting with the “one body” and the “one Spirit”. He then proceeds to mention the unifying factors of “one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all.”

[4] There is **one body** and **one Spirit**—just as you were called to the **one hope** that belongs to your call—
[5] **one Lord**, **one faith**, **one baptism**,
[6] **one God** and **Father of all**, who is **over all** and **through all** and **in all**.



God is Father of all (all adopted children), over all (Lord), through all (working through His body) and in all (by His Spirit).

Ephesians 4 (A review of the Spirit's work)

[11] And he gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the shepherds and teachers, [12] to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ,

In v.11-12, Paul focuses on the “gift” of Christ in terms of the church’s leadership. Body life for the church is the “work of ministry” that builds up “the body of Christ.” The two marks of that maturity being built up are “the unity of the faith” and “the knowledge of the Son of God.”

[13] until we all attain to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to mature manhood, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ,

Ephesians 4 (A review of the Spirit's work)

[15] Rather, speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, [16] from whom the whole body, joined and held together by every joint with which it is equipped, when each part is working properly, makes the body grow so that it builds itself up in love.

Returning to the theme of the needed love for one another (v.2), Paul mentions love twice in the concluding verses of this section. “Speaking the truth in love” sets the tone of the church’s interactions. As the church works together in ministry and each part does its part, then the body grows and “builds itself up in love.”

Ephesians 4:25-32

Beginning in v.25 Paul provides five directives on handling relationships with the church so that the “unity of the Spirit” is not disrupted by the actions of the members. In each case, he provides a warning against a **negative** action and some **rationale (positive)** for a more unifying behavior.

1. Do not lie to each other. (v.25)

[25] Therefore, having **put away falsehood**, let each one of you **speak the truth with his neighbor**, for we are members one of another.

2. Do not be angry with each other (without resolution). (v.26-27)

[26] Be angry and do not sin; **do not let the sun go down on your anger**, [27] and **give no opportunity to the devil**.

3. Do not steal from each other. (v.28)

[28] Let the thief **no longer steal**, but rather let him labor, **doing honest work with his own hands**, so that he may have something to share with anyone in need.

Ephesians 4:25-32

4. Do not speak in ways that corrupt relationships. (v.29)

[29] **Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths,** but only **such as is good for building up**, as fits the occasion, that it may give grace to those who hear.

5. Do not hold grudges or stir trouble with your speech. (v.31-32)

[31] **Let all bitterness and wrath and anger and clamor and slander be put away** from you, along with all malice. [32] **Be kind to one another**, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you.

Ephesians 4:25-32

[30] And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, by whom you were sealed for the day of redemption.

Drawing on 1:13 “and believed in him, were sealed with the **promised Holy Spirit**,” Paul reminds his readers that the reason for this relational unity is that the Spirit dwells within each believer and He intends to draw them together as one people (united body).

When our relationships with each other are not marked with these redemptive attitudes and actions, then we grieve (bring sorrow to) or work against the purposes of the Spirit to unify the body.

The Spirit grieves:

1. Our behaviors and attitudes are to be shaped by the Spirit, not our natural thinking.

In 4:18-24, Paul speaks about how ignorance and hard hearts were typical of our old self. The Spirit living in us shapes our “new self” in righteousness and holiness.

2. The Spirit unifies believers through the fruit that binds us together.

Individual members of the church are not only gifted by the Spirit for service, but they also have the “fruit” of the Spirit produced in them that can bind them together (e.g., kindness, goodness, patience, self-control).

3. The Spirit is grieved when God’s people resist His work.

The purposes of the Spirit to unite us to other believers can be thwarted (at some level) by our resistance to Him. This grievous situation is corrected as we submit to the Spirit at work in us.
