

## Romans 3



Let God be true though every one were a liar, as it is written, "That you may be justified in your words, and prevail when you are judged."

In Romans 1-2, Paul explains how both Gentiles and Jews have broken God's law and are due judgment. In chap.3, Paul begins to deal with some questions about whether God is being just. Paul reminds his readers of God's gracious gift of the Scriptures and uses Ps 51 as a reminder of how God is just in judging sinners.

#### **Romans 3:5-8**

[5] But if our unrighteousness serves to show the righteousness of God, what shall we say? That God is unrighteous to inflict wrath on us? (I speak in a human way.) [6] By no means! For then how could God judge the world? [7] But if through my lie God's truth abounds to his glory, why am I still being condemned as a sinner? [8] And why not do evil that good may come?—as some people slanderously charge us with saying. Their condemnation is just.

In vv.5-8, Paul gives some examples of the endless ways that we try to justify ourselves. The reasoning is alluring, "If my bad brings about good, why should I be punished?" However, God's judgment is based on an objective standard, our sin ("my lie"). Sin is personal and conflicts with God's character and purposes.

#### Romans 3:9-12

[9] What then? Are we Jews any better off? No, not at all. For we have already charged that all, both Jews and Greeks, are under sin, [10] as it is written: "None is righteous, no, not one; [11] no one understands; no one seeks for God. [12] All have turned aside; together they have become worthless; no one does good, not even one."

Paul points out that though the Jews have been given the Word (oracles), they are not better off because they "are under sin" also. Using a complex integration of various psalms (starting with Ps 14), Paul charges that no one (Jew or Gentile) has an excuse because "none is righteous" and "all have turned aside."

#### Romans 3:13-18

[13] "Their throat is an open grave; they use their tongues to deceive." "The venom of asps is under their lips." [14] "Their mouth is full of curses and bitterness."

Paul uses two sets of images to describe the pattern of life of humans left to their own devices. Their speech is deceitful, and their actions are destructive. Paul concludes with the worst-case scenario as a conclusion, they have "no fear of God."

#### Romans 3:19-20

[19] Now we know that whatever the law says it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be stopped, and the whole world may be held accountable to God. [20] For by works of the law no human being will be justified in his sight, since through the law comes knowledge of sin.

In v.19, Paul points out the Bible speaks God's truth which contrasts with our version of the truth (our self-justification). The result is that the whole world is accountable before God and is judged by His standards. Though the law reveals God's truth and human sin, people sometimes misuse it as a platform for justification before God. If we cannot be justified by "works of the law", then other works will be equally inept at justifying us (sinners) before a righteous God.

#### God's righteousness is revealed in the Scriptures.

The Scriptures describe the character of God (as righteous) and His work (righteous deeds). Because His judgment of sinners is based in truth, then His judgment is just.

#### As humans we cannot justify ourselves before God.

Because all of us has strayed into unrighteousness and we have resisted the truths revealed in the Scriptures, our attempts at self-justification (religious or secular versions) will fail. We cannot meet the standard of God's righteousness on our own.

#### Rejoice in the gift of God's righteousness.

In Romans 3:21-22, we can see that God's revelation ("oracles" in 3:2) includes the access to God's righteousness. The witness of the Scriptures is that the righteousness of God is available through faith in Jesus.
