

## 20/20 Vision for WOWC for 2020

The prayer and fasting we have entered into from January 2-23, is for the purpose of seeking the Lord for clarity of both vision and hearing what the Lord is calling this congregation to accomplish in 2020.

### What is 20/20 Vision?

**20/20 vision** is a term used to express normal visual acuity (the clarity or sharpness of vision) measured at a distance of 20 feet. If you have 20/20 vision, you can see clearly at 20 feet what should normally be seen at that distance.

“I am **realigning** My House – I am fine tuning My church to release the Heavens in your **personal life** – **family** and **business**. I have given much to MY House, **NOW** it’s a timely order of release.

Prepare your hearts to receive MY **alignment** and My Kingdom Glory will explode in your midst.

I am **aligning** your **heart** – I am **aligning** your **eyes** – I am **aligning** your **mind**.

Turn to ME ONLY as your source – I am yours for Eternity.

I have begun the process and nothing can stop it!

Isaiah 60:1-3 is on you: “Arise, shine, for your light has come! The glory of the Lord has risen on you. For behold, darkness covers the earth, and deep darkness the peoples – BUT the Lord will appear over you. Nations will come to your light, kings to the brilliance of your rising.”

THE HEAVENLIES ARE RELEASED ON YOU AND MY GLORY WILL BE SEEN ON YOU.”

There are several key words in this word to WOWC:

Alignment – Align = “To bring into line or alignment.” “To array on the side of or against a cause.”

Alignment = “The proper positioning or state of adjustment of parts or members in relation to each other.”

### What does the Bible say about having vision as God’s people?

1. Vision is vital & should be a natural - supernatural experience for God’s people.  
Proverbs 29:18 “Where there is no vision [dream, revelation, oracle], the people **perish** [get lost, go astray, and are destroyed]:”  
TLV = “Where there is no vision the people cast off **restraint** [are limited].…”

**Vision** can be synonymous with revelation, witnessing something supernatural not visible to the natural eye. Related to but not necessary synonymous with the concept of prophetic dreams or prophecy.

Dreams and visions could be described as modes of transmitting prophecy.

- Vision and dreams should be a common occurrence in the last days
  - Joel 2:28-29 “So it will be afterward, I will pour out My Spirit on all flesh; your sons and your daughters will prophesy, your old men will dream dreams, your young men shall see visions. Also on the male and female servants will I pour out My Spirit in those days. I will show wonders in the heavens and on the earth -.”

### **How to develop God’s vision for your life?**

#### 1. **Surrender your whole life to God**

Mt. 6:33 “Seek first His kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.”

#### 2. **Confess any known sin**

Psalm 66:18 “If I had not confessed the sin in my heart, the Lord would not have listened.”

John 1:9 “If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.”

#### 3. **Obediently pursue what you know to be God’s will**

John 14:21 “Whoever has My commands and obeys them, he is the one who loves Me. He who loves Me will be loved by my Father, and I too will love him and show Myself to him.”

#### 4. **Seek God through prayer, fasting and worship**

Acts 13:1-5 “In the church at Antioch there were prophets and teachers: Barnabas, Simeon called Niger, Lucius of Cyrene, Manaen (who had been brought up with Herod the tetrarch) and Saul. While they were **worshipping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said**, “Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them.” So after they had fasted and prayed, they placed their hands on them and sent them off. The two of them, sent on their way by the Holy Spirit, went down to Seleucia and sailed from there to Cyprus. When they arrived at Salamis, they proclaimed the word of God in the Jewish synagogues. John was with them as their helper.”

5. **Search the Scriptures for the revealed will of God**

Acts 17:10-11 “As soon as it was night, the brothers sent Paul and Silas away to Berea. On arriving there, they went to the Jewish synagogue. The Bereans were of more noble character than the Thessalonians, for they received the message with great eagerness and examined the Scriptures every day to see if what Paul said was true.”

6. **Be attentive to the impressions and guidance of the Holy Spirit**

John 16:13-15 “But when He, the Spirit of truth, comes, He will guide you into all truth. He will not speak on his own; He will speak only what He hears, and He will tell you what is yet to come. He will bring glory to me by taking from what is Mine and making it known to you. All that belongs to the Father is Mine. That is why I said the Spirit will take from what is Mine and make it known to you.”

7. **Honestly evaluate your gifts, talents, passion and resources**

1 Peter 4:10-11 “Each one should use whatever gift he has received to serve others, faithfully administering God’s grace in its various forms. If anyone speaks, he should do it as one speaking the very words of God. If anyone serves, he should do it with the strength God provides, so that in all things God may be praised through Jesus Christ. To Him be the glory and the power for ever and ever. Amen.”

8. **Use your mind, know the times and learn from others**

1 Chronicles 12:32 “From the tribe of Issachar, there were 200 leaders of the tribe with their relatives. All these men understood the signs of the times and knew the best course.”

9. **Translate God’s vision into faith goals and practical action steps**

Heb. 11:1 “Now faith is being sure of what we hope for and certain of what we do not see.”

10. **Believe great things about God, ask great things of God, attempt great things for God**

Ephesians 3:20 “Now to Him that is able to do exceeding and abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that works in us...”

2. The vision of the Lord is for us to look upon the Harvest field – see the needs of others.

Matthew 9:35-38:

“Jesus went through all the towns and villages, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and healing every disease and sickness. When He saw the crowds, He had compassion on them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then He said to his disciples, ‘The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, **to send out** workers into His harvest field.’”

The symbolic meaning of harvest in Scripture encompasses two main areas:

1. God’s provision for us.
  2. God’s blessing for others.
- Each day that we go to a job and earn a paycheck, we experience harvest. Each time we receive love from our family and those in our lives, we experience harvest. Each time we experience the closeness of God in a way that fills us spiritually, we experience harvest. Any time we are filled, we experience harvest.
  - Harvest then isn’t something that we experience once a year, but something that we experience on a daily basis.

The harvests we experience on a daily basis doesn’t actually belong to us — they belong to God, because He is the Lord of the harvest, not us.

- Our jobs belong to the Lord of the harvest.
- The money we earn belongs to the Lord of the harvest.
- Our spouses and children belong to the Lord of the harvest.
- It’s all *His*.

When we put God in His rightful place — we recognize Him as the Lord of *our* harvest. We recognize that He is the one who gave us hands to work, that He is the one who supplies our provisions, that our family is actually *His* family ... that it rightfully belongs to Him.

When we recognize the Lord of the harvest for who He is in our lives, we embrace the fact that while our harvest is something He gives to meet our needs, it’s also something He wants us to use to bless others.

Those things exist to be a blessing to the world around us.

### 3. Proper Vision Is To Keep Our Focus On Jesus

Hebrews 12:2 “looking to Jesus the author and finisher of our faith; who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God.”

AMPC – “Looking away from all that will distract to Jesus, Who is the Leader and Source of our faith and is also the Finisher. He, for the joy [of obtaining the prize] that set before Him, endured the cross, despising and ignoring the shame, and is now seated at the right hand of God.”

Jude 1:21 “Keep yourselves in the love of God, looking for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ to eternal life.”

Psalm 146:3 “Don’t put your confidence in powerful people; there is no help for you there.”

Psalm 118:9 “It is better to take refuge in the LORD than to trust in princes.”

Isaiah 2:22 “Don’t put your trust in mere humans. They are as frail as breath. What good are they?”

Psalm 33:16-20 No king is saved by the size of his army; no warrior escapes by his great strength. A horse is a vain hope for deliverance; despite all its great strength it cannot save. But the eyes of the LORD are on those who fear him, on those whose hope is in his unfailing love, to deliver them from death and keep them alive in famine. We wait in hope for the LORD; he is our help and our shield.”

Psalm 60:11 “O, please help us against our enemies, for all human help is useless.”
