What is Prophetic Evangelism?

This class will equip you to know how to pursue prophecy in your ministry, the different ways to operate in this gift, and how to correctly steward prophetic evangelism.

Key Points:

- The heart of prophetic ministry is to testify about Jesus—to share His word with other people.
- Prophecy includes hearing the voice of God; and being able to share His heart and mind with the people around you.
- Everyone can flow in prophecy.
- You must love people and eagerly desire to prophesy in order to flow in this gift properly.
- Prophecy strengthens, encourages, and comforts people.
- Having faith to prophesy includes taking risks.

Notes:

Prophecy and evangelism have a whole lot to do with one another.

The world needs a church that knows the heartbeat of Father God—A church, a people, who know how to share the thoughts on the heart of God to the people around them.

We do not need to be afraid to be the hands and feet of Jesus to a world who's hungry and thirsty to know that God exists—to know that God is real.

Prophecy leads to people being able to know that God loves them and connects their heart to the Father Heart of God.

There are different levels of prophecy.

a. Everyone can prophesy–hear from God and tell others.

- b. Some have the spiritual gift of prophecy. They can prophesy at any moment because they carry the gift.
- c. Then there are Prophets given to the church for the maturing of the body.

We do not minister like Old Testament Prophets. Under the new covenant, prophecy is for strengthening, encouraging, and comforting.

If you want to do prophetic evangelism, you must eagerly desire it. You say, "God, I want to prophesy. God I want to heal the sick. God I want to cast out demons. Lord, teach me."

Foretelling is telling the future. Forthtelling is like preaching. Forthtelling is proclaiming the heart—the emotions and thoughts—of God to people.

If you want to grow in prophetic words of knowledge, and healing, you must have faith. This kind of faith is spelled RISK.

We must guard our hearts against being more interested in prophesying, healing the sick, and ministry than knowing the heart of God.

We should not treat prophecy in a contemptuous, unbelieving way.

In Proverbs we see three ways that God wants us to prophesy:

- a. We prophesy is using the scriptures, using Bible stories, or using worship songs.
- b. Through visions and dreams
- c. Through words of knowledge and knowing how to take people to Jesus-not condemn them

Legalistic religion that tries to put people in a box-to control people-is witchcraft! We need to stop trying to clean people up and let the Holy Spirit do that. Our job is to love people the way that God loves us.
