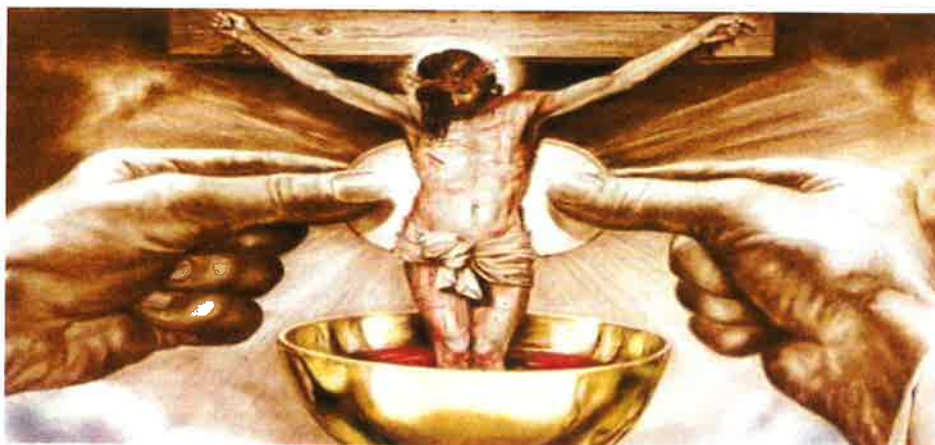

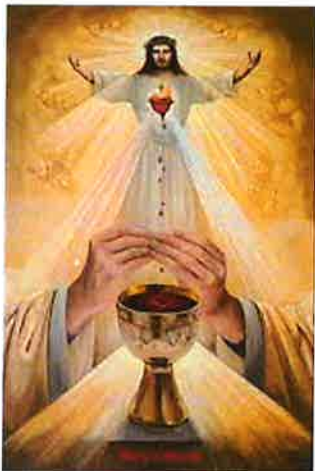

FROM THE PASTORS DESK DEL ESCRITORIO DEL PARROCO OD PROBOSZCZA BIURKA



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Today we celebrate the Body and Blood of Our Lord (Corpus Christi).
This week and next week, the history of this feast will be presented.

The origin of Corpus Christi began with a Eucharistic miracle, which is a moment of divine intervention aimed at confirming the faith in the Real Presence of the Body and Blood of Jesus in the Eucharist. While there are many websites and resources documenting Eucharistic miracles throughout history, one of the best is the compilation by Blessed Carlos Acutis: miracolieucaristici.org. Here is the description of the event in 1263:

In 1263 a German priest, Peter of Prague, stopped at Bolsena [Italy] while on a pilgrimage to Rome. He... [was] a pious priest, but one who found it difficult to believe that Christ was actually present in the consecrated Host. While celebrating Holy Mass above the tomb of St. Christina (located in the church named for this martyr), he had barely spoken the words of Consecration when blood started to seep from the consecrated Host and trickle over his hands onto the altar and the corporal. The priest was immediately confused. At first, he attempted to hide the blood, but then he interrupted the Mass and asked to be taken to the neighboring city of Orvieto, where Pope Urban IV resided. The Pope listened to the priest's account and absolved him. He then sent emissaries for an immediate investigation. When all the facts were ascertained, he ordered the bishop of the diocese to bring the Host and the linen cloth bearing the stains of blood to Orvieto. With archbishops, cardinals and other Church dignitaries in attendance, the Pope met the procession and, amid great pomp, had the relics placed in the cathedral. The linen corporal bearing the spots of blood is still reverently enshrined and exhibited in the Cathedral of Orvieto. It is said that Pope Urban IV was prompted by this miracle to commission St. Thomas Aquinas to compose the Proper for a Mass and an Office honoring the Holy Eucharist as the Body of Christ. One year after the miracle, in August of 1264, Pope Urban IV introduced the saint's composition, and by means of a papal bull instituted the feast of Corpus Christi.

This was when St. Thomas Aquinas wrote the hymn containing the verses of Tantum Ergo, which we still sing today during Eucharistic exposition! The papal bull, Transiturus, ordered Corpus Christi be celebrated annually on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday throughout the Latin Church. Why Thursday? Perhaps as a reminder that Jesus celebrated the Last Supper on the Thursday before His passion. In modern times, this feast is commonly transferred to the following Sunday to accommodate the faithful.

Estimados Hermanos/as en Cristo,

Hoy celebramos el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Nuestro Señor (Corpus Christi).
Esta semana y la próxima se presentará la historia de esta fiesta.

El origen del Corpus Christi comenzó con un milagro eucarístico, que es un momento de intervención divina destinado a confirmar la fe en la Presencia Real del Cuerpo y la Sangre de Jesús en la Eucaristía. Aunque hay muchos sitios web y recursos que documentan los milagros eucarísticos a lo largo de la historia, uno de los mejores es la recopilación del Beato Carlos Acutis: miracolieucaristici.org. He aquí la descripción del acontecimiento en 1263:

En 1263 un sacerdote alemán, Pedro de Praga, se detuvo en Bolsena [Italia] mientras peregrinaba a Roma. Era... [Era un sacerdote piadoso, pero al que le costaba creer que Cristo estuviera realmente presente en la Hostia consagrada. Mientras celebraba la Santa Misa sobre la tumba de Santa Cristina (situada en la iglesia que lleva el nombre de esta mártir), apenas había pronunciado las palabras de la Consagración cuando empezó a brotar sangre de la Hostia consagrada y a gotear por sus manos sobre el altar y el corporal. El sacerdote se sintió confuso de inmediato. Al principio, intentó ocultar la sangre, pero luego interrumpió la misa y pidió que lo llevaran a la ciudad vecina de Orvieto, donde residía el Papa Urbano IV. El Papa escuchó el relato del sacerdote y lo absolvió. A continuación, envió emisarios para una investigación inmediata. Una vez comprobados todos los hechos, ordenó al obispo de la diócesis que llevara a Orvieto la Hostia y el lienzo con las manchas de sangre. Con la asistencia de arzobispos, cardenales y otros dignatarios de la Iglesia, el Papa se reunió con la procesión y, en medio de gran pompa, hizo colocar las reliquias en la catedral. El corporal de lino con las manchas de sangre sigue siendo venerado y expuesto en la catedral de Orvieto. Se dice que el Papa Urbano IV, impulsado por este milagro, encargó a Santo Tomás de Aquino que compusiera el Propio para una Misa y un Oficio en honor de la Sagrada Eucaristía como Cuerpo de Cristo. Un año después del milagro, en agosto de 1264, el Papa Urbano IV introdujo la composición del santo, y mediante una bula papal instituyó la fiesta del Corpus Christi.

Fue entonces cuando Santo Tomás de Aquino escribió el himno que contiene los versos del Tantum Ergo, que aún hoy cantamos durante la exposición eucarística. La bula papal Transiturus ordenaba que el Corpus Christi se celebrara anualmente el jueves siguiente al Domingo de la Trinidad en toda la Iglesia latina. ¿Por qué el jueves? Quizá para recordar que Jesús celebró la Última Cena el jueves anterior a su pasión. En los tiempos modernos, esta fiesta suele trasladarse al domingo siguiente para dar cabida a los fieles.

Drodzy Bracia i Siostry w Chrystusie,

Dziś obchodzimy święto Ciała i Krwi Pańskiej (Boże Ciało).
W tym i przyszłym tygodniu zostanie przedstawiona historia tego święta.

Pochodzenie Bożego Ciała rozpoczęło się od cudu eucharystycznego, który jest momentem boskiej interwencji mającej na celu potwierdzenie wiary w rzeczywistą obecność Ciała i Krwi Jezusa w Eucharystii. Chociaż istnieje wiele stron internetowych i zasobów dokumentujących cuda eucharystyczne na przestrzeni dziejów, jednym z najlepszych jest kompilacja autorstwa błogosławionego Carlosa Acutisa: miracolieucaristici.org. Oto opis wydarzenia z 1263 roku:

W 1263 roku niemiecki ksiądz, Piotr z Pragi, zatrzymał się w Bolsenie [Włochy] podczas pielgrzymki do Rzymu.

On ... [był] pobożnym księdzem, ale trudno mu było uwierzyć, że Chrystus jest rzeczywiście obecny w konsekrowanej Hostii. Podczas odprawiania mszy świętej nad grobem św. Krystyny (znajdującym się w kościele nazwanym na cześć tej męczennicy), ledwo wypowiedział słowa konsekracji, gdy krew zaczęła wyciekać z konsekrowanej Hostii i ściekać po jego rękach na ołtarz i korporał. Kapłan był natychmiast zdezorientowany. Początkowo próbował ukryć krew, ale potem przerwał mszę i poprosił o zabranie go do sąsiedniego miasta Orvieto, gdzie przebywał papież Urban IV. Papież wysłuchał relacji księdza i rozgrzeszył go. Następnie wysłał emisariuszy w celu przeprowadzenia natychmiastowego śledztwa. Kiedy wszystkie fakty zostały ustalone, nakazał biskupowi diecezji przywieźć hostię i lniane płótno z plamami krwi do Orvieto. W obecności arcybiskupów, kardynałów i innych dostojników kościelnych papież spotkał się z procesją i z wielką pompą kazał umieścić relikwie w katedrze. Lniane korporał noszący plamy krwi jest nadal z szacunkiem przechowywany i wystawiany w katedrze w Orvieto. Mówi się, że cud ten skłonił papieża Urbana IV do zlecenia św. Tomaszowi z Akwinu skomponowania mszału i oficjum ku czci Świętej Eucharystii jako Ciała Chrystusa. Rok po cudzie, w sierpniu 1264 r., papież Urban IV wprowadził kompozycję świętego i bullą papieską ustanowił święto Bożego Ciała.

To właśnie wtedy św. Tomasz z Akwinu napisał hymn zawierający wersety Tantum Ergo, który do dziś śpiewamy podczas wystawienia eucharystycznego! Bulla papieska Transitus nakazywała obchodzić Boże Ciało co roku w czwartek po niedzieli Trójcy Świętej w całym Kościele łacińskim. Dlaczego w czwartek? Być może dla przypomnienia, że Jezus obchodził Ostatnią Wieczerzę w czwartek przed swoją męką. W dzisiejszych czasach święto to jest często przenoszone na następną niedzielę, aby dostosować się do potrzeb wiernych.

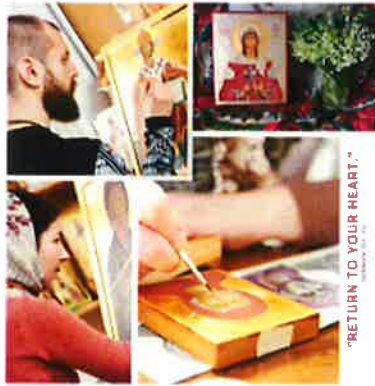
