

**FROM THE PASTORS DESK
DEL ESCRITORIO DEL PARROCO
OD PROBOSCZA BIURKA**



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This past Friday, we celebrated Independence Day. Hopefully, we were able to be with our family and friends. I would invite all of us to pray that our country will be one that lives the slogan “liberty and justice for all.”

The following is a brief history of Independence Day:

When the initial battles in the Revolutionary War broke out in April 1775, few colonists desired complete independence from Great Britain, and those who did were considered radical.

By the middle of the following year, however, many more colonists had come to favor independence, thanks to growing hostility against Britain and the spread of revolutionary sentiments such as those expressed in the best-selling pamphlet “Common Sense,” published by Thomas Paine in early 1776.

On June 7, when the Continental Congress met at the Pennsylvania State House (later Independence Hall) in Philadelphia, the Virginia delegate Richard Henry Lee introduced a motion calling for the colonies’ independence.

Amid heated debate, Congress postponed the vote on Lee’s resolution, but appointed a five-man committee—including Thomas Jefferson of Virginia, John Adams of Massachusetts, Roger Sherman of Connecticut, Benjamin Franklin of Pennsylvania and Robert R. Livingston of New York—to draft a formal statement justifying the break with Great Britain.

On July 2nd, the Continental Congress voted in favor of Lee’s resolution for independence in a near-unanimous vote (the New York delegation abstained, but later voted affirmatively). On that day, John Adams wrote to his wife Abigail that July 2 “will be celebrated, by succeeding Generations, as the great anniversary Festival” and that the celebration should include “Pomp and Parade...Games, Sports, Guns, Bells, Bonfires and Illuminations from one End of this Continent to the other.”

On July 4th, the Continental Congress formally adopted the Declaration of Independence, which had been written largely by Jefferson. Though the vote for actual independence took place on July 2nd, from then on the 4th became the day that was celebrated as the birth of American independence.

Estimados Hermanos/as en Cristo,

El pasado viernes celebramos el Día de la Independencia. Afortunadamente, pudimos estar con nuestra familia y amigos. Invito a todos a rezar para que nuestro país sea uno que viva el lema «libertad y justicia para todos».

Una historia del día de la independencia:

Cuando estallaron las batallas iniciales en la Guerra de la Independencia en abril de 1775, pocos colonos deseaban la independencia completa de Gran Bretaña, y los que lo hacían eran considerados radicales.

Sin embargo, a mediados del año siguiente, muchos más colonos habían llegado a favorecer la independencia, gracias a la creciente hostilidad contra Gran Bretaña y la propagación de sentimientos revolucionarios como los expresados en el exitoso folleto "Common Sense", publicado por Thomas Paine. a principios de 1776.

El 7 de junio, cuando el Congreso Continental se reunió en la Casa del Estado de Pensilvania (más tarde Independence Hall) en Filadelfia, el delegado de Virginia, Richard Henry Lee, presentó una moción que pedía la independencia de las colonias.

En medio de un acalorado debate, el Congreso pospuso la votación sobre la resolución de Lee, pero nombró un comité de cinco hombres, incluidos Thomas Jefferson de Virginia, John Adams de Massachusetts, Roger Sherman de Connecticut, Benjamín Franklin de Pensilvania y Robert R. Livingston de Nueva York, para redactar una declaración formal que justifique la ruptura con Gran Bretaña.

El 2 de julio, el Congreso Continental votó a favor de la resolución de Lee para la independencia en una votación casi unánime (la delegación de Nueva York se abstuvo, pero luego votó afirmativamente). Ese día, John Adams le escribió a su esposa Abigail que el 2 de julio "será celebrado, por generaciones sucesivas, como el gran festival aniversario" y que la celebración debería incluir "Pomp and Parade ... Juegos, deportes, pistolas, campanas, hogueras y Iluminaciones de un extremo de este continente al otro".

El 4 de julio, el Congreso Continental adoptó formalmente la Declaración de Independencia, que había sido redactada en gran parte por Jefferson. Aunque la votación por la independencia real tuvo lugar el 2 de julio, a partir de ese momento el 4 se convirtió en el día que se celebró como el nacimiento de la independencia estadounidense.

Drodzy Bracia i Siostry w Chrystusie,

W miniony Piątek obchodziliśmy Dzień Niepodległości. Mam nadzieję, że mogliśmy być z rodziną i przyjaciółmi. Chciałbym zaprosić nas wszystkich do modlitwy, aby nasz kraj był krajem, który żyje hasłem „wolność i sprawiedliwość dla wszystkich”.

Historia Święta Niepodległości:

Kiedy w kwietniu 1775 r. Wybuchły pierwsze bitwy wojny o niepodległość, niewielu kolonistów pragnęło całkowitej niezależności od Wielkiej Brytanii, a ci, którzy to zrobili, byli uważani za radykalnych.

Jednak w połowie następnego roku znacznie więcej kolonistów przybyło, by sprzyjać niepodległości, dzięki rosnącej wrogości wobec Wielkiej Brytanii i rozprzestrzenianiu się nastrojów rewolucyjnych, takich jak te wyrażone w bestsellerowej broszurze „Common Sense”, opublikowanej przez Thomasa Paine'a. na początku 1776 roku.

7 czerwca, kiedy Kongres Kontynentalny zebrał się w Pennsylvania State House (poźniej Independence Hall) w Filadelfii, delegat Wirginii Richard Henry Lee przedstawił wniosek wzywający do niepodległości kolonii.

Pośród gorącej debaty Kongres odłożył głosowanie nad rezolucją Lee, ale powołał pięcioosobowy komitet - w tym Thomasa Jeffersona z Wirginii, Johna Adamsa z Massachusetts, Rogera Shermana z Connecticut, Benjamina Franklina z Pensylwanii i Roberta R. Livingstona z Nowego Jorku - sporządzić formalne oświadczenie uzasadniające zerwanie z Wielką Brytanią.

2 lipca Kongres Kontynentalny prawie jednogłośnie głosował za rezolucją Lee o niepodległości (delegacja Nowego Jorku wstrzymała się od głosu, ale później głosowała za). Tego dnia John Adams napisał do swojej żony Abigail, że 2 lipca „będzie obchodzony przez następne pokolenia jako wielki jubileuszowy festiwal” i że obchody te powinny obejmować „Pomp and Parade... Games, Sports, Guns, Bells, Ogniska i Iluminacje z jednego końca tego kontynentu na drugi.”

4 lipca Kongres Kontynentalny formalnie przyjął Deklarację Niepodległości, napisaną głównie przez Jeffersona. Chociaż głosowanie za faktyczną niepodległość odbyło się 2 lipca, to od tego momentu 4-ty stał się dniem obchodzonym jako narodziny amerykańskiej niepodległości.




