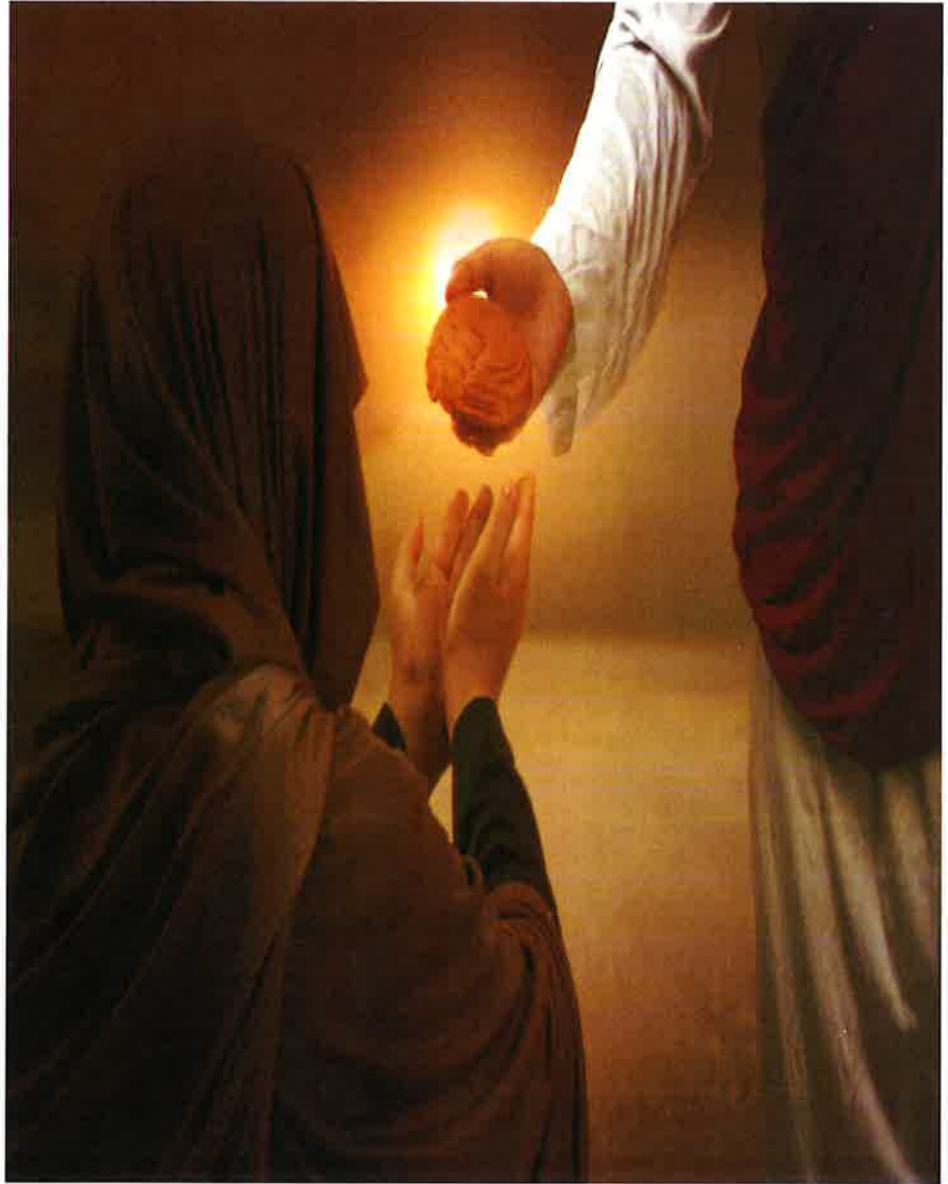

DURING THE FOLLOWING WEEKS, WE WILL BE PRESENTING THE WORKS OF MERCY OF OUR CATHOLIC CHURCH. THIS WILL INCLUDE BOTH THE CORPORAL AND SPIRITUAL WORKS OF MERCY

THE CORPORAL WORKS OF MERCY

The Corporal Works of Mercy are found in the teachings of Jesus and give us a model for how we should treat all others, as if they were Christ in disguise. They "are charitable actions by which we help our neighbors in their bodily needs" (USCCA). They respond to the basic needs of humanity as we journey together through this life.

SHELTER THE HOMELESS

There are many circumstances that could lead to someone becoming a person without a home. Christ encourages us to go out and meet those without homes, affirming their worth and helping them seek a resolution to the challenges they face.

- See if your parish or diocese is involved with a local homeless shelter and volunteer some time.
- Donate time or money to organizations that build homes for those who need shelter.
- Many homeless shelters need warm blankets for their beds. If you can knit or sew that would be an extra loving gift.
- There are millions of children and families who are on the move, fleeing from war, illness, hunger and impossible living conditions, and searching for peace and safety. Engage parish groups of children, youth, young adults, and families in doing some research on the causes and challenges that these families face to survive. Contact Catholic Social Services, or diocesan offices of peace and justice for help with your research. Seek ways to provide shelter for the homeless locally, regionally, nationally or internationally.

VISIT THE SICK

Those who are sick are often forgotten or avoided. In spite of their illness, these individuals still have much to offer to those who take the time to visit and comfort them.

- Give blood
- Spend time volunteering at a nursing home – Get creative and make use of your talents (e.g. sing, read, paint, call Bingo, etc.)!
- Take time on a Saturday to stop and visit with an elderly neighbor.
- Offer to assist caregivers of chronically sick family members on a one-time or periodic basis. Give caregivers time off from their caregiving responsibilities so they can rest, complete personal chores, or enjoy a relaxing break.
- Next time you make a meal that can be easily frozen, make a double batch and give it to a family in your parish who has a sick loved one.

LAS OBRAS DE MISERICORDIA CORPORALES

Las obras de misericordia corporales se encuentran en las enseñanzas de Jesús y nos dan un modelo de cómo debemos tratar a los demás, como si fueran Cristo disfrazado. Son «acciones caritativas con las que ayudamos a nuestros vecinos en sus necesidades corporales» (USCCA). Responden a las necesidades básicas de la humanidad en nuestro camino juntos por esta vida.

ACOGER A LOS SIN TECHO

Hay muchas circunstancias que pueden llevar a una persona a quedarse sin hogar. Cristo nos anima a salir al encuentro de los sin techo, afirmando su valor y ayudándoles a buscar una solución a los retos a los que se enfrentan.

- Averigüe si su parroquia o diócesis colabora con algún refugio local para personas sin hogar y ofrezca su tiempo como voluntario.
- Done tiempo o dinero a organizaciones que construyen viviendas para quienes necesitan refugio.
- Muchos refugios para personas sin hogar necesitan mantas cálidas para sus camas. Si sabe tejer o coser, sería un regalo muy especial.
- Hay millones de niños y familias que se desplazan, huyendo de la guerra, las enfermedades, el hambre y las condiciones de vida imposibles, en busca de paz y seguridad. Involucre a los grupos parroquiales de niños, jóvenes, adultos jóvenes y familias en la investigación de las causas y los retos a los que se enfrentan estas familias para sobrevivir. Póngase en contacto con los Servicios Sociales Católicos o con las oficinas diocesanas de paz y justicia para que le ayuden en su investigación. Busque formas de proporcionar refugio a las personas sin hogar a nivel local, regional, nacional o internacional.

VISITE A LOS ENFERMOS

Los enfermos suelen ser olvidados o evitados. A pesar de su enfermedad, estas personas aún tienen mucho que ofrecer a quienes se toman el tiempo de visitarlos y consolarlos.

- Done sangre.
- Dedique tiempo al voluntariado en un hogar de ancianos: ¡sea creativo y aproveche sus talentos (por ejemplo, cantar, leer, pintar, cantar el bingo, etc.)!
- Dedique tiempo un sábado a visitar a un vecino anciano.
- Ofrezcase para ayudar a los cuidadores de familiares con enfermedades crónicas de forma puntual o periódica. Dé a los cuidadores un respiro de sus responsabilidades para que puedan descansar, hacer sus tareas personales o disfrutar de un descanso relajante.
- La próxima vez que prepare una comida que se pueda congelar fácilmente, haga el doble y désela a una familia de su parroquia que tenga un ser querido enfermo.

Drodzy Bracia i Siostry w Chrystusie,

W CIĄGU NAJBLIŻSZYCH TYGODNI BĘDIEMY PREZENTOWAĆ DZIAŁANIA MIŁOSIERDZIA NASZEGO KOŚCIOŁA KATOLICKIEGO. BĘDĄ TO ZARÓWNO DZIAŁANIA MIŁOSIERDZIA CIELESNEGO, JAK I DUCHOWEGO.

DZIAŁANIA MIŁOSIERDZIA CIELESNEGO

Uczynki miłosierdzia względem ciała znajdują się w naukach Jezusa i dają nam wzór tego, jak powinniśmy traktować wszystkich innych, jakby byli oni Chrystusem w przebraniu. Są to „czyny miłosierdzia, poprzez które pomagamy naszym bliźnim w zaspokajaniu ich potrzeb cielesnych” (USCCA). Odpowiadają one na podstawowe potrzeby ludzkości, gdy wspólnie przemierzamy tę drogę życia.

PRZYMIJ BEZDOMNYCH

Istnieje wiele okoliczności, które mogą doprowadzić do tego, że ktoś stanie się osobą bezdomną. Chrystus zachęca nas, abyśmy wychodzili na spotkanie z osobami bezdomnymi, potwierdzając ich wartość i pomagając im znaleźć rozwiązanie problemów, z którymi się borykają.

- Sprawdź, czy Twoja parafia lub diecezja współpracuje z lokalnym schroniskiem dla bezdomnych i zgłoś się jako wolontariusz.
- Poświęć swój czas lub pieniądze na rzecz organizacji, które budują domy dla osób potrzebujących schronienia.
- Wiele schronisk dla bezdomnych potrzebuje ciepłych koców do łóżek. Jeśli potrafisz robić na drutach lub szyć, byłby to dodatkowy miły prezent.
- Miliony dzieci i rodzin są w drodze, uciekając przed wojną, chorobami, głodem i niemożliwymi warunkami życia, szukając pokoju i bezpieczeństwa. Zaangażuj grupy parafialne dzieci, młodzieży, młodych dorosłych i rodzin w badania nad przyczynami i wyzwaniem, przed którymi stoją te rodziny, aby przetrwać. Skontaktuj się z Katolickimi Służbami Socjalnymi lub diecezjalnymi biurami pokoju i sprawiedliwości, aby uzyskać pomoc w badaniach. Poszukaj sposobów zapewnienia schronienia bezdomnym na poziomie lokalnym, regionalnym, krajowym lub międzynarodowym.

ODWIEDZAJ CHORYCH

Osoby chore są często zapominane lub unikane. Pomimo swojej choroby, osoby te nadal mają wiele do zaoferowania tym, którzy poświęcają czas, aby je odwiedzać i pocieszać.

- Oddaj krew
- Spędź czas jako wolontariusz w domu opieki – bądź kreatywny i wykorzystaj swoje talenty (np. śpiewaj, czytaj, maluj, prowadź bingo itp.)!
- W sobotę poświęć czas, aby zatrzymać się i odwiedzić starszego sąsiada.
- Zaoferuj pomoc opiekunom przewlekle chorych członków rodziny, jednorazowo lub okresowo. Daj opiekunom czas wolny od obowiązków opiekuńczych, aby mogli odpocząć, załatwić osobiste sprawy lub cieszyć się relaksującą przerwą.
- Następnym razem, gdy przygotujesz posiłek, który można łatwo zamrozić, zrób podwójną porcję i podaruj ją rodzinie z Twojej parafii, która ma chorego bliskiego.

As we celebrate this Solemn Feast of Saints Peter and Paul, it is with a very heavy heart that I write to you today to announce my early retirement due to my failing health. On May 18th, I celebrated the 40th Anniversary of my Ordination to the Priesthood. Our church was filled with parishioners, family and friends for the celebration of my Solemn Mass of Thanksgiving, at which time I promised I was “not done yet.” Two days later, the Vicar for Priests and our Archdiocesan Nurse Practitioner met with me to tell me that they believed the time had come for me to retire early so that I could take better care of myself. I love my priesthood, and it breaks my heart to know that even though I was not ready to retire, people thought it was time for me to turn the page and enter this new chapter of my life. Over the past three years I have fallen deeply in love with our new parish family. Many people have thanked me for being such a powerful example for them as they struggle with their own disabilities. I have assured Father Edmond that he may continue to schedule me as much as he needs to for Masses and the celebration of other Sacraments. I continue to be blessed with the help of our parish ministers and sacristans, and especially our Acolyte Jim Cameron and most especially on weekends when my dear friend and care giver Deacon Gary Michael can assist me in getting to and from church and on the altar for Mass. I thank God on my knees for the gift of my dear friend Gary Michael who visits with me every day and helps me take care of myself and my home. Thanking God for all of this love and good help in my life, I hope to continue my priestly ministry as best I can for many years to come because, as I said at my anniversary Mass, “I’m not done yet!” Because of my inability to safely navigate stairs, I have never lived or kept an office at our parish rectory. I will be continuing to live and work from my private home in Worth. It is a 20-to-30-minute drive to and from our parish so, like many of you, I must commute in order to “get to work.” That work is by God’s grace my vocation, the love of my life. Please pray for me that I will continue to have the strength and grace that I need to, as Saint Paul wrote to Timothy, “run the good race.” In my retirement, I plan on expanding my online ministry, including a return to “Father Ralph’s Neighborhood.” New episodes will begin to drop in July, so I hope that you will subscribe to my YouTube channel so that you will not miss any of my episodes. I am also always available to talk to you over the phone. I remember the telephone being my mother’s life line to her family and friends, and I would be overjoyed if you would keep my number on “speed dial”: (773) 203-2330. While I have a box filled with your loving good wishes from my Anniversary Mass which I read over and over again, I look forward to reading your emails, cards, and letters, and to talking with you when you call. Until then, may the Grace and Peace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Love of God our Father, and the Communion of their Most Holy Spirit be with you all! May the Lord send his angels to watch over you and all those you love! And always remember how very precious you are to me and how very much I love you!
