Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I found this article and thought that it would be something to think about as we enter more deeply in this New Year.

Six "New Beatitudes"

(K. Irwin, Pope Francis and the Liturgy, 31, n61 and 151-152, n61)

31- Pope Francis, to commemorate the 450th anniversary of the Reformation (Nov. 12, 2016), he offered six "new beatitudes", one of which was, "Blessed are those who protect and care for our common home" (n. 61).

151, n61 – "The Beatitudes are in some sense the Christian *identity card*. They identify us as followers of Jesus. We are called to be blessed, to be followers of Jesus, to confront the troubles and anxieties of our age with the spirit and love of Jesus. Thus, we ought to be able to recognize and respond to new situations with fresh spiritual energy."



1. Blessed are those who remain faithful while enduring evils inflicted on them by others and forgive them from their heart (= Lonergan's Law of the Cross).

2. Blessed are those who look into the eyes of the abandoned and marginalized and show them their closeness.

3. Blessed are those who see God in every person and strive to make others also discover him (= Lonergan's "personal value" in the scale of preferences).

4. Blessed are those who protect and care for our common home.

5. Blessed are those who renounce their own comfort in order to help others.

6. Blessed are those who pray and work for full communion between Christians.

31- El Papa Francisco, para conmemorar el 450 aniversario de la Reforma (12 de noviembre de 2016), ofreció seis "nuevas bienaventuranzas", una de las cuales era: "Bienaventurados los que protegen y cuidan nuestra casa común" (n. 61).

151, n61 - "Las bienaventuranzas son, en cierto sentido, el carné de identidad cristiano. Nos identifican como seguidores de Jesús. Estamos llamados a ser bienaventurados, a ser seguidores de Jesús, a afrontar los problemas y las angustias de nuestro tiempo con el espíritu y el amor de Jesús. Así, debemos ser capaces de reconocer y responder a las nuevas situaciones con una energía espiritual fresca".

1. Dichosos los que permanecen fieles mientras soportan los males que les infligen los demás y los perdonan de corazón (= Ley de la Cruz de Lonergan)
2. Dichosos los que miran a los ojos de los abandonados y marginados y les muestran su cercanía
3. Dichosos los que ven a Dios en cada persona y se esfuerzan para que los demás también lo descubran (= "valor personal" de Lonergan en la escala de preferencias)
4. Dichosos los que protegen y cuidan nuestra casa común
5. Dichosos los que renuncian a su propia comodidad para ayudar a los demás
6. Dichosos los que rezan y trabajan por la plena comunión entre los cristianos

(K. Irwin, Pope Francis and the Liturgy, 31, n61 i 151-152, n61)

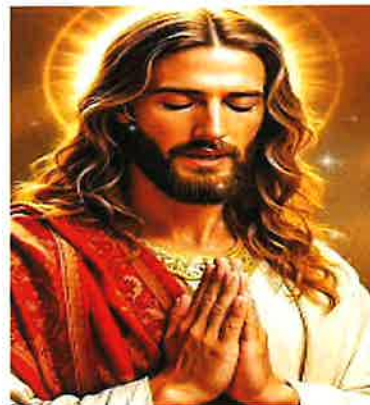
31- Papież Franciszek, aby upamiętnić 450. rocznicę reformacji (12 listopada 2016 r.), przedstawił sześć „nowych błogosławieństw”, z których jednym było: „Błogosławieni, którzy chronią i troszczą się o nasz wspólny dom” (n. 61).

151, n61 – „Błogosławieństwa są w pewnym sensie chrześcijańską kartą identyfikacyjną. Identyfikują nas jako naśladowców Jezusa. Jesteśmy powołani, aby być błogosławionymi, aby być naśladowcami Jezusa, aby stawiać czoła problemom i niepokojom naszych czasów z duchem i miłością Jezusa. Powinniśmy więc być w stanie rozpoznawać nowe sytuacje i reagować na nie z nową energią duchową”.

1. Błogosławieni są ci, którzy pozostają wierni, znosząc zło wyrządzane im przez innych i przebacząc im z serca (= Prawo Krzyża Lonerana)
2. Błogosławieni są ci, którzy patrzą w oczy opuszczonym i marginalizowanym i okazują im swoją bliskość
3. Błogosławieni są ci, którzy widzą Boga w każdym człowieku i starają się, aby inni również Go odkryli (= „wartość osobista” Lonerana w skali preferencji)
4. Błogosławieni są ci, którzy chronią i troszczą się o nasz wspólny dom.
5. Błogosławieni są ci, którzy rezygnują z własnego komfortu, aby pomagać innym.
6. Błogosławieni są ci, którzy modlą się i pracują na rzecz pełnej komunii między chrześcijanami.
