Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Why is May the Month of Mary?

(From the National Catholic Register, May 1, 2016, Article by Marge Fenelon)

For centuries, the Catholic Church has set aside the entire month of Mary to honor Mary, Mother of God. Not just a day in May, mind you, but the entire month. The custom spans both centuries and cultures, with roots going back as far as the Ancient Greeks. In early Greece, May was dedicated to Artemis, the goddess of fecundity.

In Ancient Rome, May was dedicated to Flora, the goddess of blooms, or blossoms. They celebrated ludi floralis, or floral games, at the end of April and asked the intercession of Flora for all that blooms. In medieval times, similar customs abounded, all centering around the practice of expelling winter, as May 1 was considered the start of new growth. During this period, the tradition of Tricesimum, or “Thirty-Day Devotion to Mary,” came into being. Also called, “Lady Month,” the event was held from August 15-September 14 and is still observed in some areas.

The idea of a month dedicated specifically to Mary can be traced back to baroque times. Although it wasn’t always held during May, Mary Month included thirty daily spiritual exercises honoring Mary. It was in this era that Mary’s Month and May were combined, making May the Month of Mary with special devotions organized on each day throughout the month. This custom became especially widespread during the nineteenth century and remains in practice until today.

The ways Mary is honored in May is as varied as the people who honor her.

It’s common for parishes to have a daily recitation of the Rosary during May, and many erect a special May altar with a statue or picture of Mary as a reminder of Mary’s month. Additionally, it’s a long-standing tradition to crown the statue of Mary during May – a custom known as May Crowning. Often, the crown is made of beautiful blossoms representing Mary’s beauty and virtue. It’s also a reminder to the faithful to strive to imitate our Blessed Mother’s virtue in our own lives. May Crowning, in some areas, is a huge celebration and is usually done outside of Mass, although Mass may be celebrated before or after the actual crowning.

But May altars and crownings aren’t just “church” things. We can and should be doing the same in our homes. When we echo the customs and traditions of the Church in our homes – our domestic churches – we participate more fully in the life of the Church.

If you haven’t already, I encourage you to erect a prayer corner in your home. No matter how fancy or simple it is. The main point is that it’s a place designated for God, and more specifically, for spending time with him. Just as you need proper atmosphere to sleep, you also need proper atmosphere to pray.

For May, give Mary a special spot in your prayer corner. It can be a statue or picture, but place there some representation of our Blessed Mother. Make it appealing and a real tribute to her beauty and virtue.

Estimados Hermanos/as en Cristo,

¿Por qué mayo es el mes de María?

Durante siglos, la Iglesia católica ha reservado todo el mes de María para honrar a María, Madre de Dios. No solo un día de mayo, sino todo el mes. Esta costumbre se remonta a siglos y culturas, y sus raíces se remontan a la antigua Grecia. En la Grecia primitiva, mayo estaba dedicado a Artemisa, la diosa de la fecundidad.

En la antigua Roma, mayo estaba dedicado a Flora, la diosa de las flores. Celebraban ludi florales, o juegos florales, a finales de abril y pedían la intercesión de Flora por todo lo que florece. En la época medieval, abundaban costumbres similares, todas centradas en la práctica de expulsar el invierno, ya que el 1 de mayo se consideraba el comienzo del nuevo crecimiento. En esta época surgió la tradición del Tricesimum, o "Devoción de treinta días a María". También llamado "Mes de la Señora", se celebraba del 15 de agosto al 14 de septiembre y todavía se observa en algunas zonas.

La idea de un mes dedicado específicamente a María se remonta a la época barroca. Aunque no siempre se celebraba en mayo, el Mes de María incluía treinta ejercicios espirituales diarios en honor a María. Fue en esta época cuando el Mes de María y mayo se combinaron, convirtiendo mayo en el Mes de María, con devociones especiales organizadas cada día a lo largo del mes. Esta costumbre se extendió especialmente durante el siglo XIX y se mantiene en práctica hasta nuestros días.

Las formas de honrar a María en mayo son tan variadas como las personas que la honran.

Es habitual que en las parroquias se rece diariamente el Rosario durante el mes de mayo, y muchas erigen un altar especial de mayo con una estatua o imagen de María como recordatorio del mes de María. Además, es tradición coronar la estatua de María durante el mes de mayo, costumbre conocida como Coronación de Mayo. A menudo, la corona está hecha de hermosas flores que representan la belleza y la virtud de María. También es un recordatorio para los fieles de que debemos esforzarnos por imitar la virtud de la Virgen en nuestras vidas. La Coronación de Mayo, en algunas zonas, es una gran celebración y suele hacerse fuera de Misa, aunque la Misa puede celebrarse antes o después de la coronación propiamente dicha.

Pero los altares de mayo y las coronaciones no son sólo cosas de "iglesia". Podemos y debemos hacer lo mismo en nuestros hogares. Cuando nos hacemos eco de las costumbres y tradiciones de la Iglesia en nuestros hogares -nuestras iglesias domésticas- participamos más plenamente en la vida de la Iglesia.

Si aún no lo has hecho, te animo a erigir un rincón de oración en tu casa. No importa lo lujoso o sencillo que sea. Lo importante es que sea un lugar destinado a Dios y, más concretamente, a pasar tiempo con Él. Igual que necesitas un ambiente adecuado para dormir, también necesitas un ambiente adecuado para rezar.

Para mayo, dale a María un lugar especial en tu rincón de oración. Puede ser una estatua o un cuadro, pero coloca allí alguna representación de la Virgen. Haz que sea atractivo y un verdadero homenaje a su belleza y virtud.

Dlaczego maj jest miesiącem Maryi?

Od wieków Kościół katolicki poświęca cały miesiąc Maryi, aby czcić Maryję, Matkę Bożą. Nie tylko jeden dzień w maju, ale cały miesiąc. Zwyczaj ten obejmuje zarówno wieki, jak i kultury, a jego korzenie sięgają starożytnych Greków. We wczesnej Grecji maj był poświęcony Artemidzie, bogini płodności.

W starożytnym Rzymie maj był poświęcony Florze, bogini kwiatów. Pod koniec kwietnia obchodzono ludi floralis, czyli igrzyska kwiatowe, prosząc Florę o wstawiennictwo za wszystko, co kwitnie. W średniowieczu istniało wiele podobnych zwyczajów, wszystkie skupiały się wokół praktyki wypędzania zimy, ponieważ 1 maja był uważany za początek nowego wzrostu. W tym okresie powstała tradycja Tricesimum, czyli "trzydziestodniowego nabożeństwa do Maryi". Wydarzenie to, zwane również "Miesiącem Kobiet", odbywało się od 15 sierpnia do 14 września i nadal jest obchodzone w niektórych regionach.

Idea miesiąca poświęconego specjalnie Maryi sięga czasów baroku. Chociaż nie zawsze odbywał się w maju, Miesiąc Maryi obejmował trzydzieści codziennych ćwiczeń duchowych ku czci Maryi. To właśnie w tej epoce połączono Miesiąc Maryi z majem, czyniąc maj Miesiącem Maryi ze specjalnymi nabożeństwami organizowanymi każdego dnia przez cały miesiąc. Zwyczaj ten stał się szczególnie rozpowszechniony w XIX wieku i jest praktykowany do dziś.

Sposoby czczenia Maryi w maju są tak różnorodne, jak ludzie, którzy Ją czczą.

Powszechne jest codzienne odmawianie różańca w parafiach w maju, a wiele z nich wznosi specjalny majowy ołtarz z figurą lub obrazem Maryi na pamiątkę miesiąca Maryi. Ponadto, wieloletnią tradycją jest koronowanie figury Maryi w maju - zwyczaj ten znany jest jako koronacja majowa. Często korona wykonana jest z pięknych kwiatów reprezentujących piękno i cnotę Maryi. Jest to również przypomnienie dla wiernych, aby starali się naśladować cnoty naszej Błogosławionej Matki w naszym własnym życiu. Koronacja majowa, w niektórych regionach, jest wielką uroczystością i zwykle odbywa się poza Mszą Świętą, chociaż Msza Święta może być odprawiana przed lub po faktycznej koronacji.

Ale majowe ołtarze i koronacje to nie tylko "kościelne" rzeczy. Możemy i powinniśmy robić to samo w naszych domach. Kiedy odzwierciedlamy zwyczaje i tradycje Kościoła w naszych domach - naszych kościołach domowych - pełniej uczestniczymy w życiu Kościoła.

Jeśli jeszcze tego nie zrobiłeś, zachęcam cię do stworzenia kącika modlitewnego w swoim domu. Nieważne jak wymyślny czy prosty. Najważniejsze jest to, że jest to miejsce przeznaczone dla Boga, a dokładniej do spędzania z Nim czasu. Tak jak potrzebujesz odpowiedniej atmosfery do spania, tak samo potrzebujesz odpowiedniej atmosfery do modlitwy.

Na maj poświęć Maryi specjalne miejsce w swoim kąciku modlitewnym. Może to być figura lub obraz, ale umieść tam jakąś reprezentację naszej Błogosławionej Matki. Niech będzie ona atrakcyjna i będzie prawdziwym hołdem dla Jej piękna i cnót.
