Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Mother's Day (from online Britannica)

Mother's Day, holiday in honor of mothers that is celebrated in countries throughout the world. In its modern form the holiday originated in the United States, where it is observed on the second Sunday in May. Many other countries also celebrate the holiday on this date, while some mark the observance at other times of the year. During the Middle Ages the custom developed of allowing those who had moved away to visit their home parishes and their mothers on Laetare Sunday, the fourth Sunday of Lent. This became Mothering Sunday in Britain, where it continued into modern times, although it has largely been replaced by Mother's Day.

On May 10, 1908, American activist Anna Jarvis held what is considered to be the first Mother's Day celebration.

Anna Jarvis of Philadelphia, whose mother had organized women's groups to promote friendship and health, originated Mother's Day. On May 12, 1907, she held a memorial service at her late mother's church in Grafton, West Virginia. Within five years virtually every state was observing the day, and in 1914 U.S. Pres. Woodrow Wilson made it a national holiday. Although Jarvis had promoted the wearing of a white carnation as a tribute to one's mother, the custom developed of wearing a red or pink carnation to represent a living mother or a white carnation for a mother who was deceased. Over time the day was expanded to include others, such as grandmothers and aunts, who played mothering roles. What had originally been primarily a day of honor became associated with the sending of cards and the giving of gifts, however, and, in protest against its commercialization, Jarvis spent the last years of her life trying to abolish the holiday she had brought into being.

Estimados Hermanos/as en Cristo,

Día de la Madre (de la Britannica en línea)

Día de la Madre, festividad en honor a las madres que se celebra en países de todo el mundo. En su forma moderna, la fiesta se originó en Estados Unidos, donde se celebra el segundo domingo de mayo. Muchos otros países también lo celebran en esta fecha, aunque algunos lo hacen en otras épocas del año. Durante la Edad Media se desarrolló la costumbre de permitir a los que se habían mudado visitar sus parroquias de origen y a sus madres el domingo de Laetare, el cuarto domingo de Cuaresma. Se convirtió en el Domingo de las Madres en Gran Bretaña, donde continuó hasta los tiempos modernos, aunque ha sido sustituido en gran medida por el Día de la Madre.

El 10 de mayo de 1908, la activista estadounidense Anna Jarvis organizó la que se considera la primera celebración del Día de la Madre.

Anna Jarvis, de Filadelfia, cuya madre había organizado grupos de mujeres para promover la amistad y la salud, dio origen al Día de la Madre. El 12 de mayo de 1907 celebró un servicio conmemorativo en la iglesia de su difunta madre en Grafton, Virginia Occidental. En cinco años, prácticamente todos los estados celebraban este día y, en 1914, el presidente estadounidense Woodrow Wilson lo convirtió en fiesta nacional. Aunque Jarvis había promovido el uso de un clavel blanco como homenaje a la madre, se desarrolló la costumbre de llevar un clavel rojo o rosa para representar a una madre viva o un clavel blanco para una madre fallecida. Con el tiempo, el día se amplió para incluir a otras personas, como abuelas y tías, que desempeñaban funciones maternas. Sin embargo, lo que originalmente había sido un día de honor se asoció con el envío de tarjetas y la entrega de regalos y, en protesta por su comercialización, Jarvis pasó los últimos años de su vida intentando abolir la fiesta que ella misma había creado.

Drodzy Bracia i Siostry w Chrystusie,

Dzień Matki (z Britannica online)

Dzień Matki, święto na cześć matek obchodzone w krajach na całym świecie. W swojej współczesnej formie święto to wywodzi się ze Stanów Zjednoczonych, gdzie obchodzone jest w drugą niedzielę maja. Wiele innych krajów również obchodzi to święto w tym dniu, a niektóre obchodzą je w innych porach roku. W średniowieczu rozwinął się zwyczaj pozwalania tym, którzy wyprowadzili się z domu, na odwiedzanie swoich rodzinnych parafii i swoich matek w niedzielę Laetare, czwartą niedzielę Wielkiego Postu. Stało się to Niedzielą Matek w Wielkiej Brytanii, gdzie trwało do czasów współczesnych, choć w dużej mierze zostało zastąpione przez Dzień Matki.

10 maja 1908 roku amerykańska aktywistka Anna Jarvis zorganizowała coś, co uważa się za pierwsze obchody Dnia Matki.

Anna Jarvis z Filadelfii, której matka organizowała grupy kobiet promujące przyjaźń i zdrowie, zapoczątkowała Dzień Matki. 12 maja 1907 roku zorganizowała ona nabożeństwo żałobne w kościele swojej zmarłej matki w Grafton w Zachodniej Wirginii. W ciągu pięciu lat praktycznie każdy stan obchodził ten dzień, a w 1914 roku prezydent USA Woodrow Wilson uczynił go świętem narodowym. Chociaż Jarvis promował noszenie białego goździka jako hołdu dla matki, rozwinął się zwyczaj noszenia czerwonego lub różowego goździka, aby reprezentować żyjącą matkę lub białego goździka dla matki, która zmarła. Z czasem dzień ten został rozszerzony o inne osoby, takie jak babcie i ciotki, które pełniły role matek. To, co pierwotnie było przede wszystkim dniem honoru, stało się jednak kojarzone z wysyłaniem kartek i wręczaniem prezentów, a w proteście przeciwko jego komercjalizacji Jarvis spędziła ostatnie lata swojego życia, próbując znieść święto, które powołała do życia.

Administradores de Caso

- A medida que las personas de alto riesgo, incluidas las que regresan del encarcelamiento, se abren a recibir apoyo y servicios, los administradores de casos se involucrarán, evaluarán sus necesidades y proporcionarán vínculos con servicios como asesoramiento, capacitación laboral y habilidades para la vida.
- Además del apoyo de administración casos, las derivaciones a servicios incluyen programas de justicia restaurativa, apoyo familiar, atención informada sobre el trauma, programas y servicios de GED, así como otros programas de enriquecimiento y empoderamiento.

Defensor de Víctimas

- Apoyar a las víctimas de tiroteos e incidentes violentos, conectarlas con los servicios para víctimas y ayudar con los programas elegibles.
- Brindar apoyo emocional y vinculación con asesoramiento sobre duelo, servicios de intervención y administración de casos.

Leaders of SWOP have dedicated themselves to building relationships across racial, ethnic, generational and faith differences and to bringing the common concerns of their institutions into the public life of the community. Communities Partnering 4 Peace (CP4P) is convened by Metropolitan Peace Initiatives which provides Community Violence Intervention (CVI), a comprehensive, long-term approach to reducing gun violence in communities at highest risk.

Our Services

Outreach Workers

- Identify threats to prevent shootings
- Receive notifications of a shooting incident and respond
- Intervene using strategies to deescalate tensions, control rumors, and support families of victims and perpetrators of violence to prevent the next shooting
- Connect individuals at risk of becoming victims or perpetrators of violence to services and case management to mitigate further high-risk situations

Case Management

- As high-risk individuals, including those returning from incarceration, become open to receiving support and services, case managers will engage, assess their needs, and provide linkage to services such as counseling, job training, and life skills
- In addition to case management support, referrals to services include restorative justice programs, family support, trauma-informed care, GED programs, and services as well as other enrichment and empowerment programs

Victim Advocate

- Support victims of shootings and violent incidents connect to victim services and assist with eligible programs
- Provide emotional support and linkage to grief counseling, intervention services, and case management
- Help individuals and families navigate victim services, supports, and adjusting to new major life changes

Community Programs

Diaper Distribution

- Monthly diaper distribution for community members
- Scan QR code

Youth Engagement

- Youth programs that cater to high-risk individuals
- Open Gym
- Art Classes
