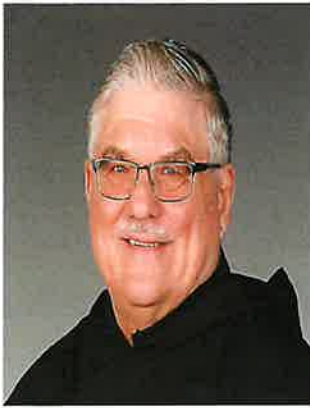

FROM THE PASTORS DESK DEL ESCRITORIO DEL PARROCO OD PROBOSCSZA BIURKA

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we honor Mary during the month of May, I found this on the web site of the Diocese of Brooklyn.

Where is the Hail Mary in the Bible?

The Hail Mary is broken up into two parts: 1. Who Mary is. 2. Our prayer to Mary. The first half of the Hail Mary (rows 1-5) is contained in Luke 1. The second half (rows 5-6) come from Luke 1, James 5 and various other Biblical texts.

Below the Hail Mary is examined line by line:

1. Hail Mary, full of Grace: Luke 1:28 (Hail, full of Grace)
The Angel Gabriel greets Mary with very respectful greeting used for royalty. The text doesn't say "Mary" after Hail but it is implied. Gabriel then proclaims Mary full of Grace (full of God's own life and love)
2. The Lord is with You: Luke 1:28 (The Lord is with you)
This is word for word. The Angel Gabriel said that the Lord is with Mary; she is full of his Grace, his own life.
3. Blessed are you among Women: Luke 1:41 (Blessed are you among women)
Elizabeth is filled with the Holy Spirit; she is inspired by the 3rd person of the Blessed Trinity to proclaim that Mary is the most blessed among all women.
4. And Blessed is the fruit of thy womb Jesus:
Luke 1:42 (and blessed is the fruit of your womb)
Elizabeth still inspired by the Holy Spirit proclaims that the fruit of Mary's womb, the developing Jesus, is blessed. The text doesn't say "Jesus" after womb, but it is implied, the fruit of her womb is Jesus.
5. Holy Mary, Mother of God: Luke 1:43 (And why is this granted me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me?)
Mary is full of God's grace; this would make her holy. Mary is the mother of the Lord Jesus Christ who is the 2nd person of the Holy Trinity. Since Jesus is God, this makes her the mother of God. She is the mother of the God-Man Jesus, not the mother of the Trinity.
6. Pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death: James 5:16 (Therefore confess your sins to one another, and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous man has great power in its effects)
St. James tells Christians to pray for one another. All the baptized are members of the body of Christ (1Cor 12:12-14), therefore it is right to pray for other members of the body. James goes on to say that the prayers of the righteous have great power. What human (other than Jesus) is more righteous than the Blessed Mother. Though she is in heaven she still hears the prayers of her children on Earth and intercedes for them.

Estimados Hermanos/as en Cristo,

Al honrar a María durante el mes de mayo, encontré esto en el sitio web de la Diócesis de Brooklyn.

¿Dónde está el Ave María en la Biblia?

El Ave María se divide en dos partes: 1. Quién es María. 2. Nuestra oración a María. La primera mitad del Ave María (filas 1-5) está contenida en Lucas 1. La segunda mitad (filas 5-6) proviene de Lucas 1, Santiago 5 y varios otros textos bíblicos.

Debajo del Avemaría se examina línea por línea:

1. Ave María, llena eres de gracia: Lucas 1:28 (Salve, llena eres de gracia)

El ángel Gabriel saluda a María con un saludo muy respetuoso que se usa para la realeza. El texto no dice "María" después de Ave, pero está implícito. Gabriel luego proclama a María llena eres de gracia (llena de la propia vida y amor de Dios)

2. El Señor está contigo: Lucas 1:28 (El Señor está contigo)

Esto es palabra por palabra. El Ángel Gabriel dijo que el Señor está con María; está llena de su Gracia, de su propia vida.

3. Bendita tú entre las mujeres: Lucas 1:41 (Bendita tú entre las mujeres)

Isabel es llena del Espíritu Santo; se inspira en la 3ª persona de la Santísima Trinidad para proclamar que María es la más bendita entre todas las mujeres.

4. Y bendito es el fruto de tu vientre Jesús: Lucas 1:42 (y bendito es el fruto de tu vientre)

Isabel, todavía inspirada por el Espíritu Santo, proclama que el fruto del vientre de María, Jesús en desarrollo, es bendito. El texto no dice "Jesús" después del vientre, pero está implícito, el fruto de su vientre es Jesús.

5. Santa María, Madre de Dios: Lucas 1:43 (¿Y por qué se me concede esto, que la madre de mi Señor venga a mí?)

María está llena de la gracia de Dios; esto la haría santa. María es la madre del Señor Jesucristo, que es la segunda persona de la Santísima Trinidad. Dado que Jesús es Dios, esto la convierte en la madre de Dios. Ella es la madre del Dios-Hombre Jesús, no la madre de la Trinidad.

6. Orad por nosotros pecadores, ahora y en la hora de nuestra muerte: Santiago 5:16 (Por tanto, confesaos vuestros pecados unos a otros, y orad unos por otros, para que seáis sanados. La oración del justo tiene gran poder en sus efectos)

St. James les dice a los cristianos que oren unos por otros. Todos los bautizados son miembros del cuerpo de Cristo (1Cor 12,12-14), por tanto, es justo orar por los demás miembros del cuerpo. Santiago continúa diciendo que las oraciones de los justos tienen un gran poder. ¿Qué ser humano (aparte de Jesús) es más justo que la Santísima Madre? Aunque está en el cielo, todavía escucha las oraciones de sus hijos en la Tierra e intercede por ellos.

Drodzy Bracia i Siostry w Chrystusie,

W maju, kiedy czcimy Maryję, znalazłem to na stronie internetowej diecezji Brooklyn.

Gdzie w Biblii jest Zdrowaś Maryjo?

Zdrowaś Maryjo dzieli się na dwie części: 1. Kim jest Maryja. 2. Nasza modlitwa do Maryi. Pierwsza połowa Zdrowaś Maryjo (rzędy 1-5) jest zawarta w Ew. Łukasza 1. Druga połowa (rzędy 5-6) pochodzi z Ew. Łukasza 1, Jakuba 5 i różnych innych tekstów biblijnych.

Poniżej Zdrowaś Maryjo jest badane wiersz po wierszu:

1. Zdrowaś Maryjo pełna łaski : Łukasza 1:28 (Zdrowaś pełna łaski)
Anioł Gabriel wita Maryję bardzo pełnym szacunku pozdrowieniem używanym dla członków rodziny królewskiej. Tekst nie mówi „Maryja” po Zdrowaś, ale jest to dorozumiane. Gabriel następnie ogłasza Maryję pełną łaski (pełną życia i miłości samego Boga)
 2. Pan jest z tobą : Łukasza 1:28 (Pan jest z tobą)
To słowo w słowo. Anioł Gabriel powiedział, że Pan jest z Maryją; jest pełna Jego Łaski, jego własnego życia.
 3. Błogosławiona jesteś między niewiastami: Łk 1:41 (Błogosławiona jesteś między niewiastami) Elżbieta jest napełniona Duchem Świętym; inspiruje ją trzecia osoba Trójcy Przenajświętszej, by głosić, że Maryja jest najbardziej błogosławioną spośród wszystkich kobiet.
 4. Błogosławiony owoc żywota Twojego Jezus: Łukasz 1:42 (i błogosławiony owoc żywota Twojego)
Elżbieta wciąż natchniona Duchem Świętym głosi, że owoc łona Maryi, rozwijający się Jezus, jest błogosławiony. Tekst nie mówi „Jezus” po łonie, ale sugeruje, że owocem jej łona jest Jezus.
 5. Święta Maryjo Matko Boża: Łk 1:43 (A dlaczego jest mi to dane, aby matka mojego Pana przyszła do mnie?)
Maryja jest pełna łaski Bożej; to uczyniłoby ją świętą. Maryja jest matką Pana Jezusa Chrystusa, który jest drugą osobą Trójcy Świętej. Ponieważ Jezus jest Bogiem, czyni ją to matką Bożą. Jest matką Boga-Człowieka Jezusa, a nie matką Trójcy.
 6. Módlcie się za nami grzesznymi teraz i w godzinę naszej śmierci: Jakub 5:16 (Dlatego wyznawajcie sobie nawzajem swoje grzechy i módlcie się za siebie, abyście zostali uzdrowieni. Modlitwa sprawiedliwego ma wielką moc w jego skutkach)
- Św. Jakub nakazuje chrześcijanom modlić się za siebie nawzajem. Wszyscy ochrzczeni są członkami Ciała Chrystusowego (1Kor 12:12-14), dlatego słuszna jest modlitwa za innych członków Ciała. Jakub mówi dalej, że modlitwy sprawiedliwych mają wielką moc. Jaki człowiek (inny niż Jezus) jest bardziej sprawiedliwy niż Matka Najświętsza. Chociaż jest w niebie, wciąż słyszy modlitwy swoich dzieci na ziemi i wstawia się za nimi.
