

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On August 28 the Church celebrates the feast of St Augustine. The priests that are serving at St Turibius are part of the world wide Augustinian Order. We are members of the Province of Our Mother of Good Counsel. The following is a brief explanation of our emblem and brief summary of Augustinian Spirituality.

THE AUGUSTINIAN EMBLEM THE EMBLEM OR SEAL OF THE AUGUSTINIAN ORDER REPRESENTS OUR AUGUSTINIAN SPIRITUALITY.

The flaming heart is the human heart. It symbolizes Augustine's love of God and his fellow brothers and sisters. The Augustinian heart is passionately alive, with the desire to know God and experience divine love in our lives.

The open book represents the Sacred Scriptures and St. Augustine's own conversion to Christianity. It symbolizes the Word of God, source of light and truth, and the quest for wisdom.

The arrow which pierces the heart represents the Spirit of God piercing our hearts, calling us to continued growth in faith, hope and love. This is the basis of that great restlessness, so typical of St. Augustine, which led him to seek God in all things and above all things.

ROOTS OF AUGUSTINIAN SPIRITUALITY

Augustinian spirituality is based on the life, writings, and teachings of Saint Augustine of Hippo, located in present-day Algeria. The root of Augustinian spirituality can be traced to Augustine's dramatic conversion to Christianity. In his Confessions, Book Eight, Chapter 12, Augustine speaks of hearing the voice of a child while sitting under a fig tree: "And suddenly I heard a voice from a neighboring house in a singing tune saying and often repeating, in the voice of a boy or a girl: 'Take and read, take and read!' ['Tolle lege! Tolle lege!']" Immediately, Augustine returned to the place where he had left the book of the Apostles, opened it and read in the silence of his heart the first passage that met his eyes: "Not in rioting and drunkenness, not in chambering and wantonness, not in strife and envying: but put you on the Lord Jesus Christ and make not provision of the flesh in concupiscence (Romans 13:13)."

Estimados Hermanos/as en Cristo,

El 28 de agosto la Iglesia celebra la fiesta de San Agustín. Los sacerdotes que sirven en San Toribio son parte de la Orden Agustina mundial. Somos miembros de la Provincia de Nuestra Madre del Buen Consejo. A continuación, se ofrece una breve explicación de nuestro emblema y un breve resumen de la espiritualidad agustiniana.

EL EMBLEMA AGUSTINO EL EMBLEMA O SELLO DE LA ORDEN AGUSTINA REPRESENTA NUESTRA ESPIRITUALIDAD AGUSTINIANA.

El corazón en llamas es el corazón humano. Simboliza el amor de Agustín por Dios y sus hermanos y hermanas. El corazón agustino está apasionadamente vivo, con el deseo de conocer a Dios y experimentar el amor divino en nuestras vidas.

El libro abierto representa las Sagradas Escrituras y la propia conversión de San Agustín al cristianismo. Simboliza la Palabra de Dios, fuente de luz y verdad, y la búsqueda de la sabiduría.

La flecha que atraviesa el corazón representa al Espíritu de Dios que atraviesa nuestros corazones, llamándonos a un crecimiento continuo en la fe, la esperanza y el amor. Esta es la base de esa gran inquietud, tan típica de san Agustín, que lo llevó a buscar a Dios en todas las cosas y sobre todas las cosas.

RAÍCES DE LA ESPIRITUALIDAD AGUSTINIANA

La espiritualidad agustiniana se basa en la vida, los escritos y las enseñanzas de San Agustín de Hipona, ubicado en la actual Argelia. La raíz de la espiritualidad agustiniana se remonta a la dramática conversión de Agustín al cristianismo. En sus Confesiones, Libro Ocho, Capítulo 12, Agustín habla de escuchar la voz de un niño sentado debajo de una higuera: "Y de repente escuché una voz de una casa vecina en una melodía que decía y repetía a menudo, en la voz de un niño o una niña: '¡Toma y lee, toma y lee!' ['¡Tole lege! ¡Tole lege! ']" Inmediatamente, Agustín regresó al lugar donde había dejado el libro de los Apóstoles, lo abrió y leyó en el silencio de su corazón el primer pasaje que encontró en sus ojos: "No en disturbios y borracheras, no en cámara y desenfreno, no en contiendas y envidia; sino vestíos del Señor Jesucristo y no provisionéis de la carne en la concupiscencia (Romanos 13:13)".

GODŁO AUGUSTYNA

GODŁO LUB PIECZĘĆ ZAKONU AUGUSTIANÓW REPREZENTUJE NASZĄ DUCHOWOŚĆ AUGUSTIANÓW.

Płonące serce to ludzkie serce. Symbolizuje miłość Augustyna do Boga i jego braci i sióstr. Serce augustianów jest namiętnie żywe, pragnienie poznania Boga i doświadczenia Bożej miłości w naszym życiu.

Otwarta księga przedstawia Pismo Święte i nawrócenie św. Augustyna na chrześcijaństwo. Symbolizuje Słowo Boże, źródło światła i prawdy oraz poszukiwanie mądrości.

Strzała, która przeszywa serce przedstawia Ducha Bożego przeszywającego nasze serca, wzywającego nas do ciągłego wzrostu wiary, nadziei i miłości. To jest podstawa tego wielkiego niepokoju, tak charakterystycznego dla św. Augustyna, który skłonił go do szukania Boga we wszystkim, a przede wszystkim.

KORZENIE DUCHOWOŚCI AUGUSTIANÓW

Duchowość augustianów opiera się na życiu, pismach i naukach świętego Augustyna z Hippony, znajdującego się w dzisiejszej Algierii. Korzeń duchowości augustyńskiej można doszukiwać się w dramatycznym nawróceniu Augustyna na chrześcijaństwo. W swoich Wyznaniach, Księga ósma, rozdział 12, Augustyn mówi o słyszeniu głosu dziecka siedzącego pod drzewem figowym: "I nagle usłyszałem głos z sąsiedniego domu w śpiewnej melodii, mówiący i często powtarzający się głosem chłopiec czy dziewczynka: "Bierz i czytaj, bierz i czytaj!" ["Tolle lege! Tolle lege! "Augustyn natychmiast wrócił do miejsca, w którym zostawił księgę Apostołów, otworzył ją i przeczytał w ciszy swego serca pierwszy fragment, który napotkał jego oczy: "Nie w zamieszkach i pijaństwach, nie w rozpusty, nie w kłótni i zawiści, ale obleczcie się w Pana Jezusa Chrystusa i nie zaopatrujcie ciała w pożądliwość (Rzymian 13:13)."



Father Tom McCarthy is an experienced teacher, administrator, retreat director and parish mission preacher. He is a native of the South Side of Chicago. He grew up in St. Adrian Parish in Marquette Park where he received his elementary education at St. Adrian School and high school education at St. Rita of Cascia High School. He graduated from Villanova University with a B.A. in Communication Arts. He also has a Master of Arts in Educational Administration from Lewis University.

Fr. Tom entered the Midwest Province of the Augustinian Order in 1987. After completing his novitiate, he attended Catholic Theological Union in Chicago and graduated with a Master of Divinity degree. In 1993 he made his solemn vows as an Augustinian Friar and in 1994 he was ordained to the priesthood.

Most notably, Fr. Tom ministered for 21 years at St. Rita of Cascia High School in Chicago as a teacher, campus minister, Principal, President and Chairman of the Board of Directors; for nine years as the Vocation Director for the Our Mother of Good Counsel (Midwest) and five years for St. Thomas of Villanova (Eastern) Province. He spent two years as the Augustinian Advisor to the Office of First- and Second-Year Initiatives - Office of Student Life at Villanova University.

Fr. Tom ministered in Rome as part of the Pontifical Council for the Promotion of the New Evangelization where he was named a Papal Missionary of Mercy by Pope Francis in 2018.
