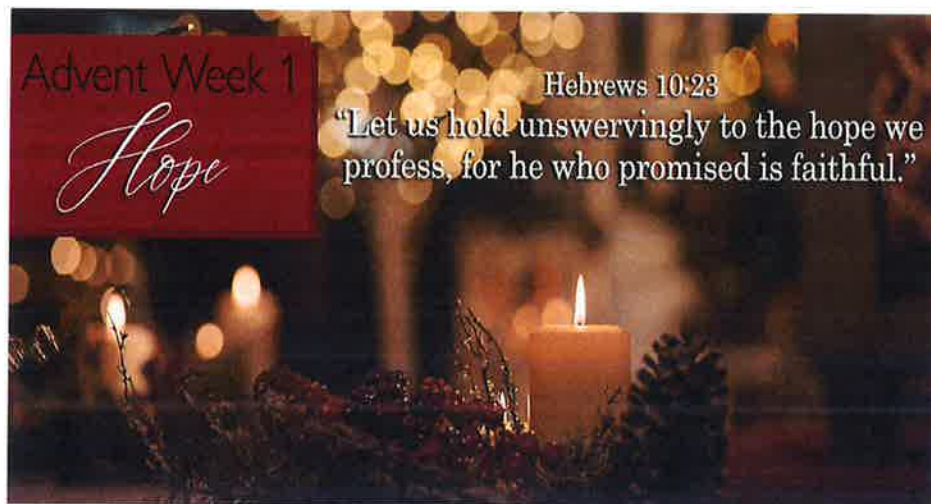

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Season of Advent

Today we begin a New Church Year. Our New Year as members of the Church begins with the Liturgical Season of Advent.

"Advent comes from the Latin word meaning "coming." Jesus is coming, and Advent is intended to be a season of preparation for His arrival. While we typically regard Advent as a joyous season, it is also intended to be a period of preparation, much like Lent. Prayer, penance and fasting are appropriate during this season.

Advent is not as strict as Lent, and there are no rules for fasting, but it is meant to be a period of self-preparation. The purple color associated with Advent is also the color of penance. The faithful should fast during the first two weeks in particular and receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

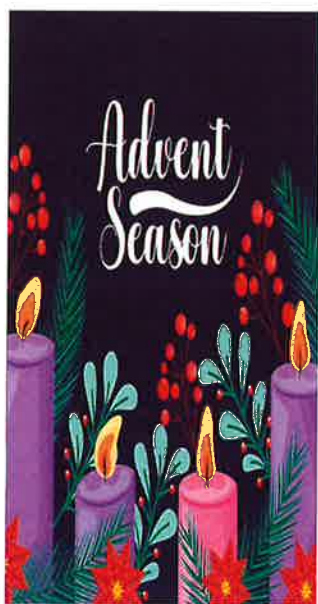
The color of the Third Sunday of Advent is rose. This color symbolizes joy and represents the happiness we will experience when Jesus comes again. The Third Sunday is a day of anticipatory celebration. It is formerly called "Gaudete" Sunday; gaudete means "rejoice" in Latin.

Finally, Sundays during Advent, just as during Lent, should not be given to fasting, but instead to celebration because we celebrate the resurrection of Our Lord every Sunday. It is important to remember, however, there are no particular rules for how the laity should observe Advent." (From Catholic Online: Definition of Advent)

We will begin our novena in Honor of the Virgin of Guadalupe on Wednesday, December 3 at 7:00 p.m. There will be the praying of the Rosary, reflections and the opportunity for the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Let us enter this time of preparing to welcome into our lives once again our newborn Lord.

Estimados Hermanos/as en Cristo,

Temporada de Adviento

Hoy comenzamos un Nuevo Año de la Iglesia. Nuestro Año Nuevo como miembros de la Iglesia comienza con la temporada litúrgica de Adviento.

"Adviento proviene de la palabra latina que significa "venir". Jesús viene, y el Adviento está destinado a ser un tiempo de preparación para su llegada. Si bien generalmente consideramos el Adviento como una temporada alegre, también se pretende que sea un período de preparación, muy similar a la Cuaresma. La oración, la penitencia y el ayuno son apropiados durante esta temporada.

El Adviento no es tan estricto como la Cuaresma, y no hay reglas para el ayuno, pero está destinado a ser un período de preparación personal. El color púrpura asociado con Adviento es también el color de la penitencia. Los fieles deben ayunar durante las primeras dos semanas en particular y recibir el Sacramento de la Reconciliación.

El color del tercer domingo de Adviento es rosa. Este color simboliza la alegría y representa la felicidad que experimentaremos cuando Jesús venga de nuevo. El tercer domingo es un día de celebración anticipatoria. Anteriormente se llamaba "Gaudete" el domingo; gaudete significa "regocijarse" en latín.

Finalmente, los domingos durante el Adviento, al igual que durante la Cuaresma, no se deben dar al ayuno, sino a la celebración porque celebramos la resurrección de Nuestro Señor todos los domingos. Sin embargo, es importante recordar que no existen reglas particulares sobre cómo los laicos deben observar el Adviento. (Católico Online: Significado del Adviento)

Comenzaremos nuestra novena en honor a la Virgen de Guadalupe el miércoles 3 de diciembre a las 7:00 p. m. Habrá rezo del rosario, reflexiones y la oportunidad de recibir el sacramento de la reconciliación.

Permítanos entrar en este momento de preparación para recibir nuevamente en nuestras vidas a nuestro Señor recién nacido.

Drodzy Bracia i Siostry w Chrystusie,

Okres Adwentu

Dzisiaj zaczynam Nowy Rok Kościoła. Nasz Nowy Rok jako członkowie Kościoła zaczyna się od liturgicznego sezonu Adwentu.

"Adwent pochodzi z łacińskiego słowa "nadchodzi". Jezus nadchodzi, a Adwent ma być sezonem przygotowania do Jego przybycia. Podczas gdy zazwyczaj uważamy Adwent za radosny poranek, jest to również okres przygotowań, podobnie jak Wielki Post. Modlitwa, pokuta i post są właściwe w tym sezonie.

"Adwent nie jest tak surowy, jak Wielki Post, a nie ma reguł na post, ale ma to być okres samopoczucia. Fioletowy kolor związany z Adwentem jest również kolorem pokuty.

W pierwszych dwóch tygodniach wierni powinni iść w najbliższy czas i otrzymać sakrament pojednania.

Kolor Trzeciej Niedzieli Adwentu wzrasta. Ten kolor symbolizuje radość i reprezentuje szczęście, którego doświadczamy, gdy Jezus powróci. Trzecia niedziela to dzień świątecznego spotkania.

Jest to dawniej zwana "niedzielną Gaudete"; gaudete oznacza "raduj się" po łacinie.

Wreszcie, niedziele podczas Adwentu, tak jak podczas Wielkiego Postu, nie należy dać na poście, ale zamiast tego celebrować, ponieważ w każdą niedzielę świętujemy zmartwychwstanie naszego Pana. Ważne jest, aby pamiętać, jednak nie ma żadnych szczególnych zasad, jak świeccy powinni przestrzegać Adwentu."

The Four Weeks of Advent

Each candle is traditionally associated with a specific theme and name:

First Candle (Purple): Hope

- This candle, often called the "Prophecy Candle," reminds believers of the Old Testament prophets (especially Isaiah) who waited in hope for the Messiah's arrival. The purple color symbolizes prayer, penance, and the anticipation of royalty.

Second Candle (Purple): Peace

- Known as the "Bethlehem Candle," this candle represents the peace that Christ brings and recalls Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem.

Third Candle (Pink/Rose): Joy

- Lit on the third Sunday, known as **Gaudete Sunday** (from the Latin word *Gaudete*, meaning "rejoice"), this "Shepherd's Candle" signifies the joy the world experienced at the announcement of Jesus' birth to the shepherds. The pink color highlights this shift from a penitential tone to joyful celebration.

Fourth Candle (Purple): Love

- This final candle, often called the "Angel's Candle," represents the boundless love of God made manifest in the birth of his Son. It serves as a reminder of the angels' message of "Peace on Earth, Good Will Toward Men".

The Christ Candle: An optional fifth candle, the "**Christ Candle**," is sometimes placed in the center of the wreath. This white candle, symbolizing purity, light, and victory, is lit on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day to celebrate the arrival of Jesus, the Light of the World.

Symbolism of the Wreath: The evergreen wreath itself is rich with symbolism:

- **Circular Shape:** Represents God's unending love and eternity, as it has no beginning or end.
- **Evergreen Branches:** Signify continuous and everlasting life, even in the midst of winter.
- **Holly Berries/Pinecones:** Other decorations, such as red berries (pointing to Jesus' sacrifice) or pinecones (symbolizing new life and resurrection), further enhance the Christian meaning.
