NOVEMBER AND DECEMBER

SUN 30

Prepare an Advent wreath: three purple candles, one pink candle, and some evergreens. Place all on a tray or large plate. The candles can symbolize hope, faith, joy, and love or peace. Light the first purple candle and pray to God about the things you hope for.

MON 1

Make a nativity scene with household materials. Paint paper tubes to make the Holy Family. Use bits of fabric to make clothes. Use a shoebox to make the barn and a small box for the manger. Wait for Christmas Day to put Jesus in the manger.

TUE 2

The Christmas story begins with one small family set to change the world.

On yellow strips of paper, write ways that your family can help bring light and hope to your community during Advent. Keep the papers in a jar. As you complete these actions, place them in the nativity scene you made to act as hay.

WED 3

Sing Christmas hymns together.

Pray to God to be faithful even when it is difficult.

THUR 4

Mary and Joseph were traveling far from their home when Jesus was born. Try sleeping in a different place in your house tonight. Swap beds with a sibling or sleep in a sleeping bag on the floor. Thank God for the comforts of your home.

FRI 5

As you prepare for Jesus' coming, plan a day and time for family members to celebrate the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation.

SAT 6

Feast of Saint Nicholas

Listen to a story about the legendary gift giver. Make or buy a small, thoughtful gift for someone you know.



DECEMBER

SUN 7

Light the second purple candle on the Advent wreath. Reflect on Jesus as the Light of the World.

MON 8

Feast of the Immaculate Conception

Honor Mary, Mother of God by praying the Hail Mary today. Mary is Jesus' mother. Take special care of your mother or a mother figure in your life today.

TUE 9

Feast of Saint Juan Diego

Juan Diego lived in Mexico, and Mary appeared to him. Eat a Mexican meal today and pray the Hail Mary before your meal in honor of Saint Juan Diego's devotion to Mary.

WED 10

Choose family prayer partners. Print each family member's name on an index card; decorate it; fold it in half and place in a basket. Pass the basket around and have each family member pick a name. Pray for that person during Advent.

THUR 11

On Christmas Day, children may receive new gifts and new toys. Go through the toys you have and donate ones that you have outgrown to a local charity.

FRI 12

Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe

Read the story of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Sing a favorite hymn that honors Mary.

SAT 13

Feast of Saint Lucy

Light candles in honor of Saint Lucy, whose name means "light," and talk about how you can bring light to others during Advent. Choose one way your family can brighten someone's day.
