#### **Prayer Walk**



Dear Waterloo First!

Grace and peace to you in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ!

Watching the leaves change color as the cool breeze blows in the morning and evening after a hot summer, I'm sure you're amazed at God's providence. As we move into the beautiful season of October, I'd like to share with you a special chance to grow spiritually and get in touch with God: the Prayer Walk.

The Prayer Walk will take place each Tuesday throughout

October, lasting about one hour each. During this five-week-long, immersive experience, we'll explore prayer on a deeper level.

In this series, we'll look at prayer practices throughout history, drawing on Christian wisdom and traditions. Through various prayer methods, we'll deepen our connection with God. Through this experiential approach, we'll strengthen our relationship with God. Our goal isn't just to learn about these prayer forms but to practice them.

Here is an overview of what to expect during each week of our Prayer Walk:

#### Week 1 (October 3rd): Orientation & the Labyrinth

We will begin with an Orientation, set up the Labyrinth, and explore its significance and depth of meaning. We will learn how to pray this foundational prayer with renewed understanding and devotion.

#### Week 2 (October 10th): Centering (Contemplative) Prayer

This week, we will delve into Centering Prayer, quieting our minds, and opening our hearts to God's presence. We will learn techniques to deepen our contemplative experience.

#### Week 3 (October 17th): Jesus Prayer

One of the most powerful types of prayer! During this session, we will explore the art of praying for your needs directly. We will seek God's healing, guidance, and blessings for you, our loved ones, and the world at large.

#### Week 4 (October 24th): Lectio Divina

Lectio Divina is a method of reading and meditating on Scripture. We will engage with God's Word in an innovative way, allowing it to speak to our hearts and transform our lives.

#### Week 5 (October 31st): Thanksgiving and Sharing

The final week will focus on giving thanks to God and sharing what we have experienced. We will review what we have learned, share special experiences, and talk about how we will continue growing spiritually. Finally, we will celebrate with a meal and fellowship.

I invite you to join us on this spiritual journey of discovery and growth. Whether you are a seasoned prayer warrior or new to the practice of prayer, the Prayer Walk is an opportunity for all of us to draw closer to our Heavenly Father.



**Charge Conference** – October 15<sup>th</sup> at 5:30 pm. WFUMC is the host church and will provide popcorn, cookies, water, and coffee. Determine who are required to attend the meeting (Pastor, Ad Team Chair person, SPRC member, Secretary) any others?

**Form I** – Based on a conference formula, this document delineates percentage of compensation of pastoral support for specific line items. A motion to approve the 2024 Pastoral Support Form (Form I) submitted by the SPRC Committee was seconded and passed (Sam Anderson/Sally Thurman).

Goals for 2024 - The Mission and Ministry Plan for 2023 was reviewed with many of the same goals.

Improve the Financial Condition of the Church

Engage More People in the Life of the Church – Simplify church language, on-time volunteer list, invite non-members to help with special events, different look for Rally Day

Care for the Needs of the Congregations – Spiritual growl of the congregation, improve sound system, welcome visitors, recognize gifts on the memorial registry, visitation teams, pastoral visits, responsive to staff needs and good working environment

Serve Our Community – Support collaborative youth ministry program and include neighborhood kids, monetary support of identified programs, apply for food grants,

Continue to expand collaborations with other churches and faith traditions in our community

After discussion, a motion to adopt the five goals for 2024 was seconded and passed (Kathy Breckunitch/ Pam Ulffers). They will be submitted at charge conference.

#### **Ministry Expectations**

Improve giving – Monthly financials were e-mailed for review. Current finances are in decent shape. It was noted that the utility bills decreased but insurance cost is rising significantly. The Finance Committee will choose a theme for the Annual pledge drive. Ideas may be found on the Conference website. Monies to help support utility payments are no longer available from the Foundation. Next year's budget may include a one-time designated request to the foundation.

**Engage more people in the life of the church** – A Volunteer Fair – There was nice participation. Committees will need to make sure to contact the volunteers to help with the projects they signed up to help with.

Pastor Hojin visited recovering in the hospital. One of the goals for 2024 includes visiting families with young kids and college kids. The church also helped a couple of gentlemen with the WHO fund.

#### **Leading - Committee Reports**

#### Education -

**Rally Day –** There has been a decrease in participation over the last several years. Will look at a different way to kick off the Sunday School year.

#### Matthew 25 - Very active

- The primary focus is completing the birthing and personal kits. A group of women have been diligently sewing blankets and plan to complete 90 kits. Other items have been ordered in bulk to use with monetary donations. Kit assembly will be on October 22 during Sunday School in hopes of classes helping with this process.
- Sue Carver has agreed to become Board Chair for the Food Nook. There is another possibility to apply for the Carma Mohler Grant through the Iowa United Methodist Foundation. Demand has been increasing and now requires 4 volunteers to staff.
- Promoting the collaborative youth group through discussions with the Congregational Church representative and IHHFH Neighborhood coordinator for ideas.
- Continue to support growing minds, local missions, Crop Walk, Feed My Starving Children, the Food Bank, and Habitat for Humanity Women's Build.

#### SPRC -

**Youth -** Several individuals attended the Youth collaborative Board meeting. The youth leaders are interested in having access to funds for their outings. After discussion, a Venmo account through Veridian which will have money raised by the group will be accessible by the leaders. Use will be monitored by a member of the Youth collaborative Board.

Staff - Kristi Klinger has been a welcome addition to the office.

**Technology** – Maximum sight and sound hope to have a bid for the sound system move to the main floor. Availability for sound in Von Lackum lounge will also be included.

#### **Trustees**

**Parsonage** – Roof expected to be done by early October.

**Church** – Boilers should be installed soon. Before they can be installed, the balloons and ribbons from Jazz Sunday need to be removed from the fans. Alternatives to balloons will be reviewed as the ribbons get wrapped around the fans and are not easily removable.

The stained-glass windows by the bell choir will need to be repaired in the next couple of years. Also, a bid will be received to repair the window in the chapel.

Insurance premiums and deductibles are rising significantly. Al Smith will look at alternative companies to see if there is a better option available.


