Do I Need Celebrate Recovery?

Celebrate Recovery is a Christ-centered recovery program and spiritual path based on the twelve steps and the eight principles defined by the Beatitudes of Jesus. Celebrate Recovery is open to people who want to heal from their hurts, habits, and hang-ups. If you want a spiritual practice but cannot get motivated to do one, then Celebrate Recovery may help you. Why do we procrastinate? Or why are we impatient with people who procrastinate? The answers to these questions are more than mere laziness and intolerance. There are reasons we act in such ways. The answers may be in either our hurts or hang-ups.

We try to cope with the problems of life, but it turns into bitterness and resentment. How do we deal with these issues? We become self-loathing or begin hating other people. We adopt attitudes that do not reflect Jesus Christ. And we need to find our way out of these harmful habits which can lead to drug abuse, alcoholism, eating disorders, abusing people, and other behaviors that keep us from being people we know we should be. Celebrate Recovery is a way of overcoming the resentments and bitterness that cause us to destroy ourselves and other people around us.

On **Wednesday October 15th** we invite you to our kick-off event for a new season of Celebrate Recovery here at 1st UMC Maryville. Join guests from other Christ-centered recovery programs in the area and enjoy the fellowship and worship. Our hope is this will be an exciting evening that is beneficial for everyone attending. If you do not need recovery, volunteers are needed to serve and welcome those who do. Trust me when I say people in recovery need the encouragement and acceptance.

#### Where we SEND



We can change the world for the better when we focus on the good we can do. In October, we'll celebrate the ways we are making a difference in the lives of others through the ways we serve in the church, the community and throughout the world.

Whether it's serving at Welcome Table, Celebrate Recovery or Good Neighbors; volunteering at your kid's school; or going on a mission trip, the numbers of hours you spend giving your time really add up.

#### **Barrier Free Worship**

From the beginning of 1st UMC's efforts to offer day respite for individuals and families living with dementia, we have also planned to offer dementia friendly worship opportunities. We now feel called to offer what many refer to as "barrier free" worship for people living with dementia, cognitive challenges, or various expressions of neurodivergence.

On **Sunday, October 12, at 2:00 pm**, our congregation will host its first barrier free worship service at Sycamore Tree.

This service will be shorter than the typical one hour worship service, using a simpler format. We will emphasize a welcoming atmosphere, sing familiar songs, and prioritize how people feel in this time and space. If a person might tend to speak out or vocalize during worship, that's fine. If someone feels a need to get up and move, that's fine too. The whole idea is to make people feel welcome in God's presence without stigma or rules.

We will need greeters and guides to welcome worshipers. Musicians are welcome to share their gifts leading worship. Even being present as a worshiper helps to make the atmosphere more friendly and welcoming.

#### Sweet success at Dessert Jam 2025

Dessert, music and a silent auction helped give a boost to the DayBreak Dementia Respite Care Ministry. Jill Pope, the director of DayBreak, said she and others at the dementia respite care



ministry are thrilled with the support received during this first ever Dessert Jam fundraiser. "From our sponsors and donors to our attendees and servers, everyone has been generous, kind and supportive. The food was delicious. The band was excellent," said Jill.

Over 75 people attended Dessert Jam, and more than \$7,000 was raised to help fund the DayBreak mission. Jill says she is looking forward to having another Dessert Jam event next year and hopes to see you there!

#### **Memory Café**

DayBreak continues building awareness about the Memory Cafe. If you know of someone who has been diagnosed with Alzheimer's or another form of dementia and is in the early stages of symptoms, share with them that we have a support group and social time just for them and their family members.

#### What happened at District Conference?

Representatives of the sixty-two congregations of the newly realigned Smoky Mountain District of the United Methodist Church met in Sevierville on September 21st. The conference elected district officers and leaders, elected representatives to the 2026 Holston Annual Conference, and adopted a district budget.

In each of these actions, 1st UMC's leadership in the district was clearly recognized. Six members of the congregation will serve on district committees next year; the first seven representatives elected to represent the district at the Holston Conference were members of 1st Church; and the congregation will contribute \$25,347 or 14% of the district's \$180,753 budget.

# **Building with Purpose: Church Communications Conference**



The world of church communications changes rapidly and its important to make sure communication strategies are in place to keep up with all that's happening, from Artificial Intelligence to changing patterns in social media and advancements in website technology.

In mid September, Clayton Hensley (Director of Communications), Kathryn King (Chair of the Witness Team) and Rev. Don Jones (Celebrate Recovery & Nurture) traveled to Chicago to attend Church Communications Group's, CommCon '25. The theme of the three day

event was "Built with Purpose." The speakers and breakout sessions were focused on ways to take action in a variety of ways to build more meaningful and effective ways to communicate.

Kathryn King said she learned about several available tools designed specifically to help churches carry out their communications strategy. "I particularly enjoyed Mark MacDonald's keynote and session about being known for something. I look forward to working with the Witness Committee to focus on what 1st should be known for," said Kathryn.

For Clayton Hensley, this is the third conference he's attended, put on by the Church Communications group. It started as a Facebook group years ago and has grown into a multi-faceted network of "companies" focused on church and spiritual growth. One of those is Missional Marketing, a firm that is currently working with 1st UMC to help improve our performance online.

Clayton said he comes back from CommCon '25 with a renewed commitment to expanding 1st Church's communications footprint and getting more people involved in spreading the word on how the church is working to Reach, Connect, Equip and Send. 
