## BIBLE STUDY REVIEWS

**DAY 1 - One Lost Sheep (Luke 15:1-7)**

We learned that Jesus is like the Good Shepherd who goes after the one who is lost. Just as a shepherd searches for a missing sheep, Jesus seeks people who are far from God. Kids were challenged to see that Jesus cares for every person individually.

## Talk About It:

- What does this story show us about how much Jesus cares for one person?
- Have you ever felt lost, alone, or far from God?
- Who is someone you know that needs to hear about Jesus?

**DAY 2 - The Lost Coin (Luke 15:8-10)**

We learned that every person is precious to God. The woman in the story searched carefully for her lost coin because it had great value. In the same way, God values every person and rejoices when someone turns to Him.

## Talk About It:

- What does this story teach us about how God sees people?
- Why is it important to remember that every person matters to God?
- How can our family show kindness and care to people who may feel forgotten?

**DAY 3 - The Lost Son (Luke 15:11-24)**

We studied the story of the son who chose his own way, made sinful choices, and then returned to his father. Kids heard clearly that sin separates us from God, but God lovingly welcomes those who repent and come to Him through Jesus. This lesson also included a simple presentation of salvation.

## Talk About It:

- What went wrong when the son chose his own way?
- What does the father's response teach us about God's love and forgiveness?
- What does it mean to repent and turn back to God?
