Amy Chase Herman serves as the Deputy Director for Clackamas County Resolution Services (CCRS), a county department which provides community, workplace, and family law conflict resolution and skill development services. Amy oversees a variety of services including Victim Offender Dialogue Facilitation which utilizes trained volunteers to facilitate dialogues in cases referred from the Clackamas County Juvenile Dept. CCRS also provides Peer Mediation training to school students and Restorative Justice training to school staff and administrators. Amy holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Rhetoric and Communications focusing on small group and interpersonal communication, and a Master of Science degree in Organizational Communication. She has worked for Clackamas County for 19 years. Amy is currently serving as co-vice president for the Oregon Mediation Association (OMA) and is a past president of that organization. She is serving as secretary for the Restorative Justice Coalition of Oregon (RJCO), and secretary for the Oregon Association of Community Dispute Resolution Centers (OACDRC).
