Chip is the Executive Director of the Center for Dialogue and Resolution (CDR), an Oregon non-profit agency that has been providing conflict resolution and restorative justice services and education in Lane County since 1981. Chip was trained and certified as a mediator in 1998 by the Orange County Human Relations Commission in California and has since mediated over 250 cases. CDR was one of the founding members of RJCO's predecessor, COVOMP, and Chip was very involved in the transformation of the organization into RJCO and served for two years as its first president. In that capacity, and as Director of CDR, Chip has played a key role in expanding the use of Restorative Justice practices and philosophy beyond the traditional criminal justice arena, including into the schools and in the workplace.
