¹ "For the Kingdom of Heaven is like the landowner who went out early one morning to hire workers for his vineyard. ² He agreed to pay the normal daily wage and sent them out to work. ³ "At nine o'clock in the morning he was passing through the marketplace and saw some people standing around doing nothing. ⁴ So he hired them, telling them he would pay them whatever was right at the end of the day. 5 So they went to work in the vineyard. At noon and again at three o'clock he did the same thing. ⁶ "At five o'clock that afternoon he was in town again and saw some more people standing around. He asked them, 'Why haven't you been working today?' ⁷ "They replied, 'Because no one hired us." "The landowner told them, 'Then go out and join the others in my vineyard.'

Questions for Reflection

- Where do you need to repent for comparing and resenting?
- Where do you need to thank God for all He's given?

Going Deeper: kingdomstories.db.church

Read: Read Matthew 20:1-16 through several times slowly and thoughtfully. As you read, who do you most relate to in the story? The landowner? The workers who started early? The late arrivals? The foreman?

Reflect: Take time to listen to the passage, and as you do, pay attention to the emotions that rise up as you listen. What are they? Write them down on a piece of paper or in your journal. Are there places in your life where you have experienced a similar situation? Did those same circumstances evoke similar emotions as you listened to God's Word?

Respond: Take some time in prayer and ask God to show you places where your life has been robbed of joy. This isn't about condemnation but rather an opportunity for Him to free you and replace it with His grace.
