

PVCPP - WHAT WE BELIEVE

Most Biblical teachings fit into either one of two categories: they are either "essential" to eternal salvation and Kingdom living, or "resultant" teachings that follow and supplement the essential teachings.

With regards to the "essentials," we desire to have unity. We hold strong to these essentials and find them crucial to the proper functioning of the church. You will find that most of our essential beliefs align very closely with those of our larger evangelical heritage.

As far as the "resultant" teachings go, we encourage liberty. Some of the resultant teachings have been debated by theologians for centuries, and it is our desire to see no divisions in the church family because of them.

THE ESSENTIALS WE BELIEVE

ABOUT GOD

God is the Creator and Ruler of the universe. He has eternally existed in three separate, distinct persons/personalities: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. The three are co-equal and are one God.

ABOUT JESUS CHRIST

Jesus Christ is the Son of God. He is co-equal with the Father. Jesus lived a sinless human life and offered Himself as the perfect sacrifice for the sins of all people by dying on a cross. He arose from the dead after three days to demonstrate His power over sin and death. He ascended to Heaven's glory and will return again someday to earth to reign as King of Kings, and Lord of Lords.

ABOUT THE HOLY SPIRIT

The Holy Spirit is co-equal with the Father and the Son of God. He is present in the world to make men aware of their need for Jesus Christ. He also lives in every Christian from the moment of salvation. He provides the Christian with power for living, understanding of spiritual truth, and guidance in doing what is right. As Christians we seek to live under His direction, influence and purpose daily. His anointing brings His gifts, enabling us to do the work of Jesus. His fullness brings His fruit, reproducing the character of Jesus in us.

ABOUT THE BIBLE

The Bible is God's Word to us. It was written by human authors, under the supernatural guidance of the Holy Spirit. It is a critical source of truth for Christian beliefs and living. Because it is inspired by God, it is truth without any mixture of error.

ABOUT HUMAN BEINGS

People are made in the image of God, to be like Him in character. People are the supreme object and crowning achievement of God's creation. Although every person has tremendous potential for good, we are all born marred by an attitude (sin) that separates humans from God and causes the problems and decay we experience in this world.

ABOUT SALVATION

Salvation is God's free gift to us but we must accept it. We can never make up for our sin by self-improvement or good works. Only by trusting in Jesus Christ as God's offer of forgiveness, can anyone be saved from sin's penalty of eternal death. When we turn from trusting in ourselves and "put our full weight" on Jesus (faith), we are saved. Eternal life begins the moment one receives Jesus Christ into their life by faith.

ABOUT ETERNAL SECURITY

Because God gives us eternal life through Jesus Christ, everyone who receives Him is secure in that salvation for eternity. If you are saved by faith in Jesus, you cannot "lose" it. Salvation is maintained by the grace and power of God, not by the self-effort of the Christian. It is the grace and keeping power of God that gives us this security.

ABOUT ETERNITY
