PRACTICAL CHRISTIANITY

I AM A LAWBREAKER

For the past twenty days, I have been breaking the law. I have been driving with an expired license. I did not know it had expired. I did not choose to break the law. It was not my intention. However, the fact remains that I have transgressed the statutes of the State of Tennessee. When it was brought to my attention, I was embarrassed and motivated to get into compliance. I logged on to the Tennessee Department of Safety and Homeland Security website, clicked on the button to renew my driver's license, filled in my personal information, paid \$28, and the problem was corrected. The best part - it took three minutes to renew my license online and I did not have stand in line for hours! Thank you, Steve Jobs!

Have you ever broken the law? Some people choose to willfully defy the law of the land. Others (like me) break the law through negligence or by accident. No matter our intentions, transgressing the law is a serious offense.

Spiritually speaking, we are lawbreakers. 1 John 3.4 says, "Everyone who sins breaks the law; in fact, sin is lawlessness." Your sin may have been a willful act. You may have sinned through negligence or by accident. Nevertheless, you broke the law. Transgressing God's law is a serious offense. The good news? Jesus died on the cross to pay the penalty for our sins. Because of his sacrifice, God says, "Their sins and lawless acts I will remember no more" (Hebrews 10.17). God chooses to forgive and forget. His grace will cover all our sins. If only the State of Tennessee operated that way...

BOOK REVIEW

When is the last time you had a spiritual conversation that led someone to Christ? When is the last time you tried? If you would like to be a better evangelist, then you need to read Matthew Morine's latest book Natthew urges his readers to employ a more natural approach to evangelism.

Matthew shares his own amazing journey of spiritual awakening in the introduction. His excitement is contagious as he speaks of the joy he found in Christ. He writes with a bold yet conversational style to tell personal stories from his pre-Christian days that illustrate helpful and harmful evangelistic approaches. Morine reminds his readers that God is working before they arrive and after they leave. He places people in our path so that we might reach out to them. I respect the fact that Matthew practices what he teaches. The author intersperses his own efforts in evangelism highlighting what did and did not work. His willingness to share his own efforts is refreshing and encouraging.

This book will be encouraging for those who have tried various evangelistic techniques in the past with little success. When I finished reading this book, I was reinvigorated! "I have manifested your name to the people whom you gave me out of the world. Yours they were, and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word. Now they know that everything that you have given me is from you. As you sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world"

There are all kinds of things that Jesus did to impact the world, all kinds of things that he did that made him famous, all kinds of things that he did to help people, all kinds of things that he did to help people, all kinds of things that he did to help people, all kinds of things that he did that that we could never do. But do you notice, as he's at the end of his life, what he is talking about? He is praying on behalf of the people that God gave him. People that God sent him to. People that were placed in his life. And now, what does verse 18 say? It says that he is sending them out in the same way.

Know this: We have been given people — we have been sent people — providentially, so that we may share the gospel with them and then they may be sent. God loves you so much. God loves others so much — many of whom don't know it. In fact, God loves them so much that he SENT YOU! You make the difference.

God has uniquely placed you where you are and has providentially provided people in your life — for you. God has sent you to them. These people have the same fears that you do. They have the same stresses as you do. They have the same worries that you do. They have the same doubts that you do. They have the same insecurities that you do. That have the same relational problems that you do. They feel moments of loneliness like you do.

The problem is — they don't know God as you do. They don't know the God who can protect their heart and mind. They don't know the God who can care for their broken hearts. They don't know the God who gives purpose and peace. They don't know the God who provides a family. They don't know the God who restores and remakes. They don't know God as you do — and God has providentially provided them with you, and you with them. *Matt*

Transgression is one of the three primary words for sin we find in the bible. It usually is translated in our bibles as rebellion, offense, sin, transgression, and trespass. In Hebrew the word is pesha. What sets it apart is it usually designation of behavior representing an intentional disobedience, especially against God's law. In 2 Kings 3 Pesha is used to describe how Moab rebelled against Israel when Ahab died. The decided to break the established covenant between the nations ensuring not only a lack of conflict but a collaborative relationship. Israel once the stronger nation now must deal with a rebellious Moab. In Proverbs 18:19 it reads: A brother offended is harder to be won than a strong city. The word translated as offended is the word pesha. A brother whose trust has been broken, a brother you have treated with contempt, a brother who you were once close to but transgressed against will be hard to win back. It will be even harder than attacking a strongly fortified city. It shows how personal pesha was not only spiritually but socially and politically. When it comes to our relationship with God it gets must more serious. Transgression a conscious, willful rebelling against Him and His commands. To trespass God's instruction is to rebel against God. Eve and Adam both transgress God's command in the Garden of Eden. Man has broken the covenant relationship with God. The history of Israel contain numerous occasion of transgressions against Him directly or His word (such as the Golden Calf). In the New Testament the greek word 'parabsis' is translated transgression or trespass. It means to go bevond. A trespasser is someone who crosses a line or climbs a fence that he should not cross or climb. A trespass may be intentional or unintentional. Transgress or trespass can also mean "to fall away after being close beside." It should be easy for us to recognize we at some point in time have "crossed the line" in thought, word, or attitude many times a day. We have even willfully rebelled and broken our covenant with God when we became new creations. Rom 5: 17 For if by the transgression of the one, death reigned through the one, much more those who receive the abundance of grace and of the gift of righteousness will reign in life through the One, Jesus Christ. Even though we have transgressed against God, He has created a mediator who can restore that relationship once again. He has paid the price so our transgressions and our willful trespassing won't be held against us. How great is our Savior! Evan


