



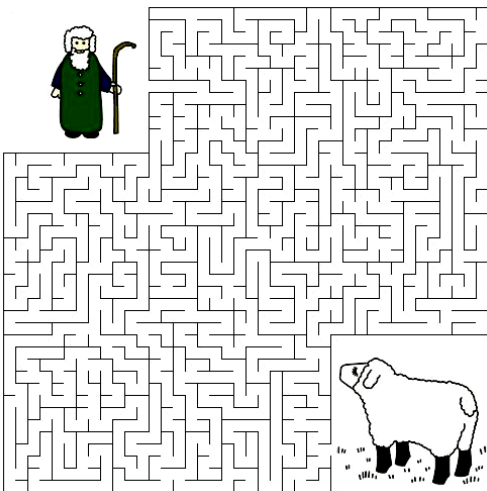

REMODELING CHILDREN'S WING

Earful from Evan

The book of Ruth contains a snapshot of God and man's relationship on a singular family scale during a disastrous time in Israel's history. Written during the time of Judges, the nation of Israel lived a perpetual cycle of falling away from God, calling out to God, and following God. Their lack of consistent faith lead the nation down a morally dismal path. God often used enemy occupation and famine as the eye opener for Israel to remember Him. It is during one of these famines that Emilech took his family to the land of Moab, but things did not improve for the family. Parallel to the story of Job, Naomi loses husband, sons, and status in a tragic turn of events. Alone in a foreign land except the foreign wives of her sons Naomi feels forgotten and abandoned by God; enter the bold and loyal Ruth. Ruth refuses to depart from Naomi's side even though the outlook for a foreign widow in the land of Israel looked bleak. Upon arrival in Judah, Naomi even changes her name to Mara, meaning bitter. In verse 20 she states: *'I went out full, and the Lord has brought me home empty'*. Ruth goes out and gleans in the fields and is noticed by Boaz. Boaz hears of the kindness she has shown to Naomi and he kindly deals with her by giving her protection, food to eat while working, and enough to take some home for Naomi. Let's look at how Naomi reacts: *19 Her mother-in-law then said to her, "Where did you glean today and where did you work? May he who took notice of you be blessed."* So she told her mother-in-law with whom she had worked and said, *"The name of the man with whom I worked today is Boaz."* *20 Naomi said to her daughter-in-law, "May he be blessed of the Lord who has not withdrawn his kindness to the living and to the dead."* In case you didn't notice, kindness is a big deal in the book of Ruth. The word in Ruth for kindness should be interpreted as 'loyal love'. A kind of genuine love that keeps promises. Loyal love was evident on multiple levels throughout this short book. God to His people on a snapshot level of a specific family in the genealogy of Jesus: Ruth to Naomi as a daughter-in-law. Ruth to Boaz in how she honored Him by choosing Him as their Kinsman Redeemer (3:10). Boaz to Ruth and Naomi multiple times in providing provisional food and again in accepting the role as kinsman redeemer. All of these exercised a love needed as part of God's people. This kindness reverses Naomi from her state of bitterness to a state of praise, to an awareness of how great, kind, and loving God has been to her. What a powerful message of what our kindness can do for others. May your kindness this week alter someone's life as Boaz did for Ruth, Ruth did for Naomi, and as God has done for us all through Jesus.
