# Collins' Corner

### Colossians 1:9-14

And so, from the day we heard, we have not ceased to pray for you, asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of his will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding, so as to walk in a manner worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing to him: bearing fruit in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God; being strengthened with all power, according to his glorious might, for all endurance and patience with joy; giving thanks to the Father, who has qualified you to share in the inheritance of the saints in light. He has delivered us from the domain of darkness and transferred us to the kingdom of his beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.

Paul develops a theme in his prayer for the Colossians: strength found in the Lord. There is also a godly progression that comes out of this theme of the prayer. Paul prays that the Colossians would have strength only provided by God, which leads to endurance, and further leads to life in the kingdom. Strength and power are words often associated with physical might and ability. Some may have the strength to move or lift a heavy object. Others may have the power to create a beautiful work of art. That is not the meaning behind Paul's praver. The strength and power Paul prays for these Colossians to have is not physical at all, but spiritual. It is the strength and power provided by God that gives one the ability to endure unfavorable circumstances and have joyful patience in those moments. The same strength and endurance Paul prays for on behalf of the Colossians is what he demonstrated while he wrote this letter from prison. The ability to endure unfavorable circumstances because of the strength provided by God leads to a full life in his kingdom. In God's kingdom there is light, redemption, and forgiveness. Those able to participate in that kingdom are the ones who find their strength in the Lord. They are the ones possessing the ability to endure; they do not give up, but look to Jesus in all circumstances. God has chosen and qualified those people to be heirs of his kingdom. It is easy for us to overlook this feature that Paul brings out here, but we make a critical mistake if we do. We are capable, because of who our Lord is, to endure.

Find peace in that fact this week.
