AN UPDATE FROM SHORT MOUNTAIN

It's Tuesday at Short Mountain and we are having a great week of camp! On Sunday, we had a little bit of rain that cooled off the camp. After all the campers settled into their cabins, we divided into 16 teams and had our first team games. It was hilarious to watch our teens participate in the dizzy bat spin competition. For those who haven't had that life-changing experience, you run the length of the gym, stand a baseball bat up on its end, put your forehead down on the end of the handle, and spin in a circle 10 times as fast as you can! Then you run back to your team (trying not to fall down) and the next person does the same thing. After supper, we worshiped in the new pavilion at Short Mountain. Thanks to all of you who gave so generously to SMBC last year to build this pavilion. Jonathan Anderson, youth minister at Smithville Church of Christ, taught our evening lesson from John 4. We ended the evening with singing as we watched the stars in the nighttime sky. Then we sent the kids to their cabins for cabin devotional and to go to sleep. Only one problem: they didn't sleep. They were too excited! Sleep is really more of a theory than a practice at Short Mountain.

On Monday, a thick fog blanketed the mountain. We woke the kids up between 6:30 and 7 a.m. After breakfast, the kids went to their bible classes. Some people think all we do is play at Short Mountain, but that is simply not the case. Our kids attend two bible classes, worship each night, singing and a cabin devotional every day. That's 3 hours of bible study and worship per day! And they love it. After lunch, we had siesta (my personal favorite hour of the day). Then we let the kids swim and go out on the pond (let's not call it a lake) in canoes and kayaks. Many thanks to Joriel Shepherd who went out and helped the girls learn how to paddle. I preached on Monday night from John 8 and we talked about love and mercy and forgiveness. Then it was time for the night swim! The counselors put 1,500 glow sticks in the bottom of the pool and the kids got to swim at night. Those who didn't want to swim got to play ultimate frisbee in the dark! As you may have guessed, they slept much better on Monday night.

It's Tuesday as I am writing this bulletin article and it's already getting hot. I am sitting in Matt Collins middle school bible class. He is teaching our middle school class about their relationship with Jesus from John 15. *"I am the vine; you are the branches. If a man remains in me and I in him, he will bear much fruit"* (v. 5). We are so blessed to have Matt Collins as our youth minister! He is doing a fantastic job directing camp.

I want to thank our cooks: Don Foy, Mary Anne Lankford, Brad Fortner, and Bud Simpson. We eat great at Short Mountain! Thanks also to Johnny Bates and Tim Farris for helping to keep our camp so clean. And thanks also to the moms and dads who serve as cabin counselors. We could not make camp happen without you!
