Regathering Updates: Open Seating in the Sanctuary!

Big news! Beginning this Sunday, we are relaxing seating restrictions in the sanctuary! We have removed the ropes that designated seating in certain areas, opening up the sanctuary to provide more comfort and flexibility in our seating for our indoor services.

Our Church Council, the leadership body for our congregation, continues to faithfully provide hospitable and safe opportunities for worship and ministry. Together, we have monitored our needs, opportunities, and circumstances over the past year. Thankfully, COVID-19 cases have drastically decreased over the past month. Many people have been vaccinated and others are planning to do so. We've seen an increase in the number of people attending worship in-person, particularly inside the sanctuary. We were at near capacity inside the sanctuary over the past month. Additionally, Governor Brian Kemp's recent executive order ("Empowering a Healthy Georgia," issued on March 31, 2021) removed gathering restrictions for organizations like ours effective on April 8, 2021.

After careful and prayerful consideration, our council made the decision to open the remaining seating in our sanctuary for those who are comfortable and ready to worship inside. We will continue to provide sanitizer, gloves, and masks around the building. We will continue to provide no-touch worship aids such as lyrics and liturgy on the screen and offering stations. Masks will still be more than welcome, but not required. For the time being, we are still refraining from congregational singing, but we will have more flexibility to provide special music with groups of people who are comfortable doing so. (A side note: I can't wait to sing "It is Well with My Soul" with all of you at the top of my lungs! And then "Come Thou Fount!" Oh, and then "Church in the Wildwood!" Soon. I'll be patient, but I'm getting these rusty pipes ready.)

We continue to offer a variety of options and venues for worship to welcome as many people as possible. Seating in the fellowship hall during the 11:00 AM service will remain set up for social distancing for in-person worship with the live feed. We continue to offer our outdoor 9:00 AM service and our online service at 11:00 AM.

The Church Council also invites Sunday School classes and other small groups to reconvene. Our Sunday School Superintendent, Andy Whiten, has been connecting with Sunday School teachers and other leaders to make plans that for reconvening in comfortable ways. One class is already meeting in-person. Others can begin as they feel comfortable. Our goal is to have our classes reconvened in some fashion by the Sunday after Labor Day. As always, we want every individual to feel perfectly at peace doing whatever they feel is best for them. We trust your judgement and respect your decisions.

I am thankful to God for providing relief from the pandemic thus far. Join me in continuing to pray for an end to the pandemic and comfort for our world.

I'm excited to enter a new phase of regathering in-person. I hope you'll join us on Wednesday, April 21st for our church-wide cookout! (See inside for more info). I also look forward to seeing you in worship. Come join us!
