#### DECEMBER 18, 2022 FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT

For the past four Sundays we've heard the visions and dreams of God proclaimed from this pulpit. We've been told to "keep awake" for we do not know what day your Lord is coming. We've heard Isaiah proclaim in the days to come the mountain of the Lord's house be established as the highest mountain, and all nations shall stream to it. We've dreamt about the peaceable kingdom where God has ordered every high mountain and valley to be made low... and we heard John invite us to repent and share what we have even in moments of doubt. And this week, we finally meet Mary and Joseph!

Today's Gospel reads like a fairy tale! Joseph loves Mary, and Mary loves Joseph, and they're planning their wedding. When Mary appears with the news that she is pregnant we can't possibly begin to know the thoughts that went through both Joseph's and Mary's mind. On the one hand, Mary is pregnant by a spirit that is holy and Joseph, based on the honor code of his world he is entitled to return Mary to her father. How close was Joseph to abandoning his choice and putting Mary aside? How did Mary feel about all the possible labels and judgments that would be directed at her? How was she to explain that she was pregnant by the power of God? Who would believe a story like that? The gospels never talk about village gossip or scandal surrounding Mary and Joseph. The gospels do not fill in all the juicy details so beloved by today's readers. But let us picture for a moment what the gospels do say: God has a plan for the salvation of all humankind, and the instruments God is going to use are an ordinary young woman and her beloved.

Joseph was a stand-up guy, a regular Joe, a by-the-book rule follower, a good Jew. But like any faithful person, he let his conscience be his final guide. By feeling compassion for Mary and taking her into his home despite her unlawful condition, he was being obedient, not to the laws of his religion but to the spirit of his faith in a loving and merciful God. It takes special courage for rule followers to bend and stretch as Joseph did. The Josephs of this world, with their simple empathies for others, keep us open to life-giving possibilities and alert to the presence of God among us as we work and play and go about our daily tasks.

On the verge of Christmas and the end of Advent, now is a suitable time to reflect seriously on the meaning of the Son of God's coming into the world and your life. We work so hard at Christmas. We spend time and money to make it beautiful, enjoyable, tasty and memorable, so it's easy to think of it as something we do rather than something **God does for us.** Why not bend the cultural rules a little and show compassion towards someone? Ignore the messages to buy more and spend less time shopping. Enjoy the company of your family, and, like Joseph, take others into your home with no other expectation than to share the good tidings of God's love. Strange things at this time of year: like random acts of kindness; like gentle surprises; like a keener appreciation of generosity and an increased ability to let ourselves be surprised by joy. Allow ourselves to be surprised by God's graciousness, love, and unpredictable mystery in our lives. Strange things are supposed to happen, just ask Mary and Joseph!

Re:	Recent news of sexual abuse lawsuit

The CBC published a story today<sup>1</sup> regarding a woman who recently settled a lawsuit over alleged childhood sexual abuse by Fr. Gerhard Hartmann, while he was a priest serving at St. Peter's Parish in Nanaimo in the 1970s. This news is undoubtedly distressing for victim-survivors of sexual abuse, whom we want to assure of our support.

This news also affects all members of the clergy, parishioners, and indeed the whole Diocese, causing reactions of pain, anger, and perhaps shame, as Catholic followers of Christ. We recognize that this information may be difficult for people to hear, but may also provide an opportunity for other victim-survivors to come forward so that, in the light of truth, there may be healing and justice.

Although we are not able discuss the details of this case, several years ago the Diocese of Victoria began concrete steps to provide a victim-based approach when allegations come forward. The Diocese has instituted an independent reporting process<sup>2</sup> and a Responsible Ministry program<sup>3</sup> to screen all members of the clergy, volunteers, and employees, and create protocols to ensure safe environments for children and the vulnerable.

The decision to come forward and report sexual abuse by clergy, religious, employees, or volunteers may be difficult and often requires considerable courage. To assist with this process, the Diocese of Victoria provides an Independent Reporting Agency service managed by a team of psychologists, counsellors, and social workers.

If a person decides to involve the Diocese in their healing plan, the Church will welcome and respond to the person with trust, charity, and compassion. The process for a pastoral encounter includes compassionate listening, acknowledgment of the person's courage in coming forward, affirmation and recognition of the hurt caused, reassurance that it is never the victim-survivor's fault, expression of deep remorse and sorrow on our part, and ultimately, empowerment. The Diocese will, at the victim-survivor's direction, provide pastoral support, and healing resources for that person and their family.

In the spring of this year, an independent agent was contracted to conduct a review of historical clergy files to identify known allegations of misconduct to better respond to victim-survivors and allegations.

The Advent season heralds the dawning of the light of Christ which dispels all darkness, and is always an invitation to draw ever closer to Christ for healing and peace. We pray that those who have suffered sexual abuse and their families will find some peace and healing from past wrongs, and that all of us may experience and participate in God's mercy this holy season.
