MAY 21, 2023 ASCENSION OF THE LORD

Today's celebration is the ritual marker of the shift in the way the Disciples of Christ have experienced his risen presence. But the readings look resolutely forward, not back as if to a golden age now lost. In Acts, the disciples are prodded by angelic visitors to get to work: "Why do you stand looking up toward heaven? In the Gospel of Matthew, we hear Jesus give to the Eleven the "Great Commission": "Go into all the world and proclaim the good news to the whole creation ... make disciples ... baptize ... teach." Yes, indeed, today's scripture readings send us in another direction. Of course, the focus is very much on Jesus; how could it be otherwise? But we as His disciples are implicated. His last appearance to his disciples says it all. Jesus speaks then of the authority in heaven and on earth that has been given to Him. Mysterious words perhaps, but if we look at the life that Jesus lived for only a few years only, we get a hint of what kind of authority He is speaking about. It is His limitless obedience to God, and His unconditional life-giving service to others; it is the power of His love; it is the power of His self-giving that filled His life. It is on the basis of that kind of life that the Father accepted Him as the kind of stuff upon which a new humanity is built. If His being raised from the dead and His ascending into heaven mean anything at all, then it must be understood in the sense of this kind of life not being lost on humanity. On the contrary, it is placed by God at the center of humanity, accessible to all who put their trust and hope in Him. Once Jesus is, as it were, patented by God - that is what His resurrection and ascension mean - then Jesus turns the tables on us.

Until His resurrection, the significance of Jesus' way of living was restricted to a small group of people and to a rather limited place. Now it is universalized; now it can become a reality in us as His disciples who let ourselves be driven by the same spirit that drove Him. Jesus suggests as much in his rather abrupt command: "Go!" That is also the thrust of the remark in today's first reading when the disciples are told that it is useless to stare into the sky. It is harmless to claim Jesus as Lord, unless we let our admiration for Him spill over into the kind of life we live, patterned after the life of Jesus. From now on, it is by means of our lives, by means of our discipleship that we give concrete evidence of the fact that Jesus is not absent from our world, but still very much present in our world. Without that, the significance of the story of Jesus threatens to be reduced to once upon a time story: beautiful, very moving even, but we remain at a safe distance form it. When Jesus shares with us the Spirit that encouraged Him, it means that He takes us into a partnership with Him on the building of His life project, God's kingdom.

We must be His witnesses. Empowered by Him, and in accepting the task and challenge to change our world in His power, so that it becomes God's kind of world. Whatever makes life more human is what Jesus Christ stood for and so must we stand for. Underneath and from a Christian perspective, though, we recognize every caring action that builds up the life of others, were recognize such action as a kingdom action to which the risen Christ empowers us. And for that empowering us, Jesus is taken up into the sphere of God, where everything that's shortchanges or destroys life is, in the final analysis, overcome. Our actions in the power of Jesus are to be living witnesses to that victory. Congratulations to our children from both parishes confirmed and receiving their first communion this weekend!


