NOVEMBER 26, 2023 CHRIST THE KING - THIRTY-FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

This Sunday, is the feast of Christ the King. In this time of history reactions toward the word 'King' are mixed. Kings in our experience have turned out to be flawed and not always worthy of emulating. But Jesus is the King of the Kingdom of God where peace and joy reign. Jesus is the King of love, of compassion, and of mercy. Jesus is the King of the Universe, of all creation and all people. The moving words of Psalm 23 witness to the tender care that God has for all. *The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want. Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, and I shall dwell in the house of the Lord my whole life long.* We refer to Jesus as Christ the King, celebrating the great love and

concern he has for us all.

But the Gospel reading for this Sunday by Matthew is a difficult one. It is the well-known description of the final judgement; the righteous will be welcomed by *the king into eternal life* and the non-righteous will be sent *away into eternal punish-ment*. This reading has often caused fear and uneasiness in many Christians. It has caused confusion and distress. We all know that we fail at times to be loving. Does this mean that we will not be considered worthy of entering heaven? Will Jesus really send people away forever? What do other scriptures tell us? We know that Jesus forgave the adulterous woman and stopped others from stoning her to death (John 8:1-11). We know that Jesus promised his followers that in his Father's house there were many rooms, and he would prepare a place for them (John 14:2-3). And most telling, when Jesus was suffering on the cross, he said: *"Father, forgive them; they do not know what they are doing."* (Luke 23:34) These and numerous other scripture readings demonstrate that Jesus is indeed all merciful and we can trust that he will never abandon us.

So why this last judgement story? What is Jesus telling us? He certainly is trying to get our attention. He wants us to realize the importance of his message. Jesus is asking us to care for all our brothers and sisters, including the least of these. God



loves each single person! He loves the marginalized and poor, the rich and the successful. He loves the homeless and the healthy, the despairing and the happy. God loves us all and depends on us to care for everyone, to show them God's love and mercy. *"Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did it to me."* We were created to choose freely to care for each sister and brother, not out of fear, but out of love.




CWL Christmas Luncheon tickets are now available. They will be sold in the foyer after all Sunday Masses on November 19th, 26th and December 3rd. They can also be
