2026 is upon us and with the new year comes renewed expectations, hope, and wonder (or curiosity). What is one expectation, one hope, and one “wonder” that you have for 2026 for your own life? For me personally, one expectation I have is that I will see God birth a new work in my life. Our God is the God of rebirth and renewal- Titus 3:5 says, “he saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit.” This is talking about our baptism, but it is also talking about what is happening in each and every believer every day: rebirth and renewal. As part of the church for many years, the Sewing Circle's mission is to create beautiful quilts, giving comfort and wrapping others in God's love. Our objective through the years has been to donate quilts to nursing homes, congregation members that are hospitalized, and families with new babies.

The Sewing Circle ladies today (see photos) enjoy meeting every Tuesday for fellowship and creating new quilts. We welcome new members, regardless of skill level. The Sewing Circle's goal is to sell and donate homemade quilts. The craft quilt sales are held at the church, as well as at PEP school and off-site locations. Quilts that have been donated in the past have gone to: Veterans' Administration in Santa Rosa, Orchard Retirement Home, Vacaville Rehabilitation, Police Department supplies for children, congregation members in the hospital, and new families with babies in the congregation. Quilt donations are a highlight of the holidays for care homes in Vacaville. They look forward to our donations and our smiling faces every year.


During December, the Sewing Circle has been very busy creating, donating, and selling quilts. We donated approximately 135 quilts. Our holiday sale was very successful. We sold 25 quilts, with total sales of \$450.00 plus a \$25.00 donation.

Sales are essential to keeping our quilting running smoothly. For example, we use funds for sewing machine repairs, notions, batting, and fabric. We welcome donations of quilting supplies.

If you are interested in purchasing a homemade lap quilt, they are \$30.00 each. The Sewing Circle, after the holiday break, meets on Tuesdays in the church social hall.

Thank you to church members, as well as those who have donated throughout the years.
