A Message from Pastor Paul Hudson

When Faith and Politics Intersect

"Christianity is not politics, but Christianity has something to say to politics." This is a quote I heard last month from a pastor, and I thought it was insightful. I make it my aim to keep politics out of the pulpit. However, in our times, the devil has successfully crafted ways to turn biblical values into deeply divisive political issues. In effect, certain biblical values have been taken out from God's Word and used by both sides of the political spectrum---either to exploit or attack.

The common reaction for pastors and churches is to simply avoid preaching the parts of the Bible that speak to those political issues. As a result, people are left to fashion their own truth based on either imagination, cultural currents, a favorite influencer, or alternate interpretations that are outside of Christian orthodoxy. I must say I am certainly guilty of that in my own life! I work very hard to separate ideology from biblical truth, but I have found that sometimes an ideal can sneak through and when I try to find biblical support for it, I find none! Or worst yet, I've unknowingly twisted a truth to fit the narrative I want. AAaargh! This is not good!

Nonetheless, there are indeed very clear biblical values in the orthodox Christian faith that have turned into divisive political issues. And it is the enemy's aim to stop the church from speaking about those issues on account of them being deemed 'politically divisive.'

Well, when a pastor or church fails to faithfully engage in the difficult scriptures, they are really only doing the devil a favor. I don't think it is good to avoid scriptures just because they have become political issues. That being said, I am completely against exploiting faith and the Bible for political agendas! And I definitely disagree with political churches that bombard their people with left or right agendas day in and day out. Nonetheless, the Bible must be allowed to speak what it speaks, regardless of the politics of the day.

If we are to believe that the Word of God is inspired by the Holy Spirit and authoritative, then we should work hard with humility to recognize and interpret biblical truth apart from politics. We need to form our faith upon a solid biblical foundation, not on political agendas.

This is not as easy as it may seem because we cannot take our cultural upbringing out of ourselves. We click the way we tick because we were raised to click and tick that way. Our beliefs and ideals are so ingrained that they can blur our ability to read the Word of God clearly—that goes for all sides of the political spectrum. It takes a willingness to step outside of political ideals and into the new kingdom—God's kingdom. And that requires the work of the Holy Spirit reconciling us to Christ. 2 Cor. 5:16-21 says, "So from now on we regard no one from a worldly point of view.... Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: the old has gone, the new is here! All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation. We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us. We implore you on Christ's behalf: Be reconciled to God. God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God." The Corinthian church was struggling when Paul wrote this to them because of their adoption of Roman and Greek cultural values, which resulted in a misapplication of the teachings of Christ.

As Christians, we are ambassadors for Christ. An ambassador by definition is one who represents a different governing ruler in a foreign land. We are of a different kingdom and under a different rule, which is founded upon our reconciliation to Christ. In Christ, there should be no left or right, but only the righteousness of God through Christ and his ministry of reconciliation.

1 Peter 2:9 says that we are a holy nation, God's special possession made to declare the praises of him who called us out of darkness and into his wonderful light. This is how the Bible speaks to our politics—It says, you are not reconciled to a worldly point of view or to a man-made governing rule, or to any political agenda, but to Christ. You are a new creation, a holy nation, a people of God marked by his mercy. Christ is our leader, and his kingdom is not of this world. We are his ambassadors in a foreign land.

The devil will continue to make faith and God's Word a political issue. In fact, we're coming to a time where the Bible in its entirety will be viewed as one divisive political book, if we're not there already! Pastors won't be able to preach the Word without appearing political. Christianity is already labeled as "activism" in today's world. What is your response to this?

I think 2 Tim. 2:14 is spot on as a good, biblical response. It says, "Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a worker who does not need to be ashamed and who correctly handles the word of truth." And we must not forget 1 Pet, 4:8, "love covers a multitude of sins." When your life aligns with God and you live the truth of his Word, politics will try to attack you or annoyingly latch onto you with agendas you may not ascribe to, but do not be ashamed or dismayed. I encourage you to correctly handle the word of truth in love. God's truth cannot be defeated, and His love covers a multitude of sins.

Session Highlights from our September 2025 Meeting


Our treasurer, Rick Smith, has been working on reconciling our QuickBooks reports with the bank statements and discovered QuickBooks sometimes does not get caught up with the actual deposits, as sometimes it shows up the following month. The same is sometimes true with debits. The average bank balance for the first six months of the year was \$72,000. At the end of August, it was \$46,000. Currently the balance is \$47,000. We had expenses, including a large water bill and the purchase of a large gazebo for the patio area. Our reserves are healthy, and Session is monitoring the bank account balances to recommend a transfer of funds if needed.

CPA, Dave Cram, had to reschedule his time with us to Oct. 19th-22nd. He will report his findings to the Finance Team and Session the evening of the 22nd.

Our Sunday services in August had an average attendance of 68.

Session was happy to authorize the baptisms of several children and youth. The joyous event will be on October 5th - Kingdom Kidz Sunday.
