

# Hanukkah – Festival of Dedication

There are many things we can dedicate to the LORD. For instance: baby dedication, ministry, buildings, marriages, event in honor of a person, place or thing, our family and even our work. These dedications can be very important. Yet, there's One who is most important. During this Hanukkah, reflect on the One we are always to be dedicated to – Yeshua. Yeshua is calling each one of us to serve Him. Do we hear Him calling? He calls us in several ways:

A call to be dedicated or to rededicate oneself to belong to GOD. This is where we devote our whole heart and soul to the Lord by seeking Him so that He may abide in us and we in Him (John 15). We are His temple (1 Corinthians 3:16) and must be solemnly committed to do His purpose and will.



A call to love and reverence GOD. We must express our love and dedication by reflecting the love He has shown and given to us by giving it back to Him and others. GOD is dedicated in showing His love to us in which we know there is no greater love than His love. When we receive His great love, He offers and gives us the power to express that same kind of love.

A call to consecrate and dedicate our minds and our will to Him. We are to be single minded, loyal, and fervent in serving Him. When we are sincere in our faith, we will renew our mind or make new, by cleansing our thoughts. Rom 12: 2-13 explains ways of serving in different areas of the community.

### How do we celebrate this Festival of Light (Yeshua)?

- 1. We must first recognize and acknowledge that He is our "Hero", our Savior and Redeemer.
- 2. Secondly, He is the Living Temple and He has replaced the physical building. (Haggai 2:7-9)
- 3. Thirdly, He is the Light of the World. (John 8:12, Isaiah 9:2, and 1 Peter 2:9)

Yeshua demonstrated that He has fulfilled all three as the sacrificial Lamb, the Living Temple, and the Light of the world. We celebrate with great rejoicing, thanksgiving, and praise for our salvation, deliverance, eternal life, and restoration back to GOD.

Kevin Hawthorne, Ph. D., stated: "[Yeshua] Jesus, devoted redeemer of all nations has shone forth, let the whole family of the faithful celebrate." Yeshua is the Lighthouse of our lives. He is the reason for celebrating the Festival of Lights and we are to go out into the community and be that light!

# **Priorities**

Priorities are always changing and not always properly ordered. When getting a gauge on an individual and a group, it generally starts by looking at their priorities. **Even businesses have mission statements** that list their priorities to reassure customers and investors. A lot of people have issues in this field and those issues typically stem from not putting them in the right order. But most things have an appropriate time for them. The Bible states this plainly several times. Some examples are Proverbs 24:27 and Mathew 6:25-34. The Lord knows that we at times will have priorities pertaining to work, social situations, and other things; but we need to be orderly in how we prioritize them.

"For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven; a time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted; a time to kill, and a time to heal; a time to break down, and a time to build up; a time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn, and a time to dance; a time to cast away stones, and a time to gather stones together; a time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing; a time to seek, and a time to lose; a time to keep, and a time to cast away; a time to tear, and a time to sew; a time to keep silence, and a time to speak; a time to love, and a time to hate; a time for war, and a time for peace." (Eccl. 3:1-8, ESV)

As a people set apart for GOD our Father and the Lord Yeshua, we must seek what GOD wants our priorities to be. The Holy Spirit is needed to guide us in these. When it comes to importance, though, Yeshua states plainly the two greatest commandments (Mathew 22:36-40) are to love the Lord our GOD with all of our hearts, and just as interesting, Yeshua states that "the second is like it, to love our neighbor as our self". A parallel passage to this one is written in 1 John 4:20-21. This shows us that how we love our neighbor is a good gauge on our level of love for GOD our Father.

"If anyone says, "I love God," and hates his brother, he is a liar; for he who does not love his brother whom he has seen cannot love God whom he has not seen. And this commandment we have from him: whoever loves God must also love his brother." (1 John 4:20-21 ESV)

If we make loving the Lord our number one priority in our lifetime it is of great spiritual gain. Haggai may be a short read, but this book is packed with information about dedication towards the Lord and why it is for our benefit. It starts off with a rebuke about setting our priorities on things of the world, while neglecting GOD, and how fruitless it truly is. Storing up treasures on earth instead of heaven, can only bring you false peace and often results in selfishness (Luke 12:16-21).

Serving others and the Lord is of great benefit, when done with clean hands. Trying to follow the commandments of Yeshua is necessary (Matthew 7:23), in fact when the Lord described how we are to love him, another way love is shown us by commitment to His commandments (John 14:15-31). Our sin towards others, ourselves, and GOD separates us from the Lord. To finish strong takes commitment, and is a lifelong journey. In 1 Corinthians 9:25-27, Paul likens it to an athlete training for a crown an event in which the winner receives a crown. Remember that our Lord is gracious, long suffering, and loving. He forgives us of our imperfection through the blood that Yeshua shed for our sins. Yeshua is the perfect Lamb without blemish. We should keep pressing forward and rededicate our lives, as we seek to strengthen each other in the Lord (1 Thes 5:1-11).




# **Yeladim Corner**

# **Dedication**

What is 'dedication'? We tend to use this word to describe a person with singular focus on accomplishing a task. We use a form of this word, 'dedicated', to refer to the character of a person whether alive or in memoriam. We speak of dedicating a work to the memory of a significant person who has passed from this life. These uses always carry

the connotation of being special, standing apart from what is common.

The Bible tells us that the descendants of Levi were dedicated to the service of GOD. Moses and the people of GOD dedicated the Tabernacle at Mt. Sinai when it was completed, and GOD established its dedication with His own presence. The Prophet Samuel was a child of

promise, dedicated to the service of GOD as a condition of his conception. King Solomon dedicated the first Temple, along with the people, when it was completed, as did the LORD again with His Presence. Nehemiah and Ezra dedicated the walls of Jerusalem, the foundation of the new Temple and then the second Temple itself in a similar fashion. Yochanan the Immerser came preaching repentance and an immersion of re-dedication of persons to the kingdom of GOD. What greater thing can there be than to dedicate – to be dedicated to – the service of our Creator, the LORD GOD of heaven and earth?

We dedicate people and places which have special significance. We also describe this characteristic as 'holy', or having 'holiness', meaning 'set apart'. GOD also establishes the holiness of people and places, and agrees and establishes with His presence what we dedicate according to His instructions.

We are approaching the time of the year

where Am Israel celebrates the Festival of Dedication, which Yochanan refers to in his Gospel (Ch. 10:22), and is associated with a restoration of Temple service in the time of the Maccabees approximately one hundred and fifty years before the time of Yeshua.

Let us remember that

GOD Himself has established the path of the completion of dedication - of holiness – for people and places. It is GOD Himself who provides the oil. It is GOD Himself who gives us the fish and loaves of bread. It is GOD Himself who makes the immersion of repentance to have meaning and purpose, to produce holiness. Let us dedicate ourselves once again to follow this path to approach and dwell in the presence of our Heavenly Father in peace, through the Lordship of our Messiah, King, Redeemer of Israel and Savior of the Gentiles, Yeshua.

When these ingredients are combined, then the outcome is success. Yeshua is our perfect example in all areas of life, including serving. He is the highest level of authority in the universe – the King of kings and LORD of lords. Listen to these great words from our great Rabbi Yeshua:

"So if I, your **Master** and **Teacher**, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash each other's feet. I have given you an **example**—you should **do** for each other what I have done for you. "Amen, amen I tell you, a **servant** isn't greater than his master, and the one who is sent isn't greater than the one who sent him. **If you know these things, you** are blessed if you do them!" (John 13:14-17 TLV)

If being a servant wasn't too low for Yeshua it shouldn't be too low for us. Yeshua had every right to tell His talmidim (students) to wash His feet. He's their master, their teacher, and their King. Additionally, Yeshua was about to suffer betrayal, torture, and crucifixion. He could have decided he was too important and too stressed to serve...but He didn't. Yeshua chose to serve, and we should too.

During this season of Hanukkah, let's extend the love and mercy our great King Yeshua has offered to us to our family, our community, and beyond. In fact, why stop there? Let's make being a dedicated servant a regular habit and lifestyle every day of our lives. Remember Yeshua told us: "If you know these things, you are blessed if you do them."

# "Many Questions, One Answer"

### Just posing questions...

How often do you dwell in the kingdom of light? Is the radiance of His light on your life? Do you shun the very presence of evil? Do you take every thought captive for HIS glory to be revealed? Do you walk the straight and narrow (Mathew 7:14 ESV)? Do you lift up HIS WORD in your life? Is it the meditation of your heart? Have you ever prayed one day without ceasing (1 Thessalonians 5:17)? Have you ever won anyone to the LORD? Have you been outspoken for truth, righteousness, or holiness? Are your lips bridled by HIS HOLY SPIRIT? Are you grounded in faith? Do you know without a shadow of doubt that YESHUA/JESUS is LORD and HIS WORD is rock solid truth?

The kingdom of light is about HIS kingdom, HIS will, HIS way. It's about loving HIM with all your heart, mind, body, soul, strength, and loving your neighbor as yourself (Mark 12:33). It's about caring for the widow and orphan (James 1:27). It's about helping the

poor, clothing the naked, feeding the hungry, visiting the prisoner, bearing one another's burden. (Isaiah 58:7) It's about loving your enemy and praying for those who persecute you (Luke 6:27). It's about going the extra mile when someone asks you to only go a block (Mathew 5:41). It's about putting HIM first in everything you do or say. # **Recipe for Hanukkah**

# SWEET POTATO LATKES By: Isabelle Blasi

### **Ingredients:**

4 tablespoons cooking oil (divided)

1 ½ lb sweet potatoes (about 2 medium)

1/2 cup almond flour

6 green onions (whites and green parts chopped separately)

2 large eggs

1 large clove garlic (finely minced)

1 teaspoon EACH: paprika, sea salt,

1/2 tsp pepper

1/2 cup grated cheddar cheese

Applesauce or plain yogurt (to serve)

### **Preparation:**

Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Line 2 baking sheets with parchment paper. Drizzle each baking sheet with 1 tablespoon of oil.

Peel and grate the sweet potatoes using the large holes on your grater.

Place the grated sweet potatoes into a large bowl and add the almond flour, the white parts of the green onions, the eggs, garlic, paprika, salt, and pepper and mix together well.

Use a large cookie scoop or  $\frac{1}{4}$  cup measuring cup and make 18 latkes, dividing them between the 2 baking sheets. Press them down so that they are about ¼ inch thick. Drizzle the remaining 2 tablespoons of oil over the tops of the latkes.

Bake for 40 minutes, or until the tops start to brown and crisp. Sprinkle a little cheese on top of each latke then put them back in the oven for 5 minutes.

Serve the latkes hot out of the oven with some applesauce or plain yogurt and the green onions on top.

### What is your favorite Jewish holiday and why?

I was told this question was submitted by a young person at Rosh Pinah and what a great question it is! Thank you. I've been asked this question often over the years, yet my answer has remained consistent. My favorite *Jewish holiday is the holiday we are currently* celebrating. At Passover time, my favorite holiday is Passover. At Sukkot (Tabernacles), my favorite holiday is Sukkot. And at this time of the year, my favorite holiday is Hanukkah. Choosing one particular favorite Jewish holiday over another means that one holiday is better in my estimation than the others. They each have great value and meaning and are worthwhile celebrations for messianic believers. After all, the Jewish holidays are really the LORD's holy days; they are His idea, His appointed times.
