Yom Teruah or Rosh Hashanah is a two-day celebration that begins on the first day of Tishrei, which is the seventh month of the religious Biblical calendar. In contrast to the religious Biblical calendar, where the first month Nisan, the Passover month, marks Israel's exodus from Egypt, Rosh Hashanah marks the beginning of the civil year. A major theme of Yom Teruah is God is Creator and the Sovereign of the Universe.

Rosh Hashanah customs include sounding the shofar (a hollowed-out ram's horn), as prescribed in the Torah, following the prescription of the Hebrew Bible to "raise" a noise" on Yom Teruah. Its rabbinical customs include attending synagogue services and reciting special liturgy about teshuva, as well as enjoying festive meals. Eating symbolic foods is now a tradition, such as apples dipped in honey, hoping to evoke a sweet new year.

Attendance at our Yom Teruah or Rosh Hashanah Services is open to anyone and free of charge.
