# A Message From Our Pastor



Dear church family,

As we step into a new year, many people make resolutions. We make plans to be healthier, happier, or more disciplined. Those can be good things. But as followers of Jesus, we begin the year not merely with resolutions, but with prayerful surrender. The Christian life is not primarily about self-improvement; it is about deeper trust, deeper obedience, and deeper love for God and love for our neighbor.

That's why prayer is so vital right now. Prayer grounds us. Prayer reminds us Who is truly in charge. Prayer shapes our hearts so that our lives might reflect the heart of Christ in the world. This isn't just private spirituality. It fuels our faithfulness in our community, our compassion for those who struggle, our willingness to serve, and our openness to be used by God however God chooses.

In the Wesleyan tradition, many churches begin the year by praying together the Wesley Covenant Prayer, just like we did the first Sunday of January. This prayer is bold and dangerous. It is not sentimental. It is a prayer of surrender, trust, and availability to God's purposes in the world. As we pray it, we remember that our lives are not our own—we belong to God.

Take time to pray these words slowly and thoughtfully:

## **The Wesley Covenant Prayer**

I am no longer my own, but yours. Put me to what you will, rank me with whom you will; put me to doing, put me to suffering; let me be employed for you, or laid aside for you, exalted for you, or brought low for you; let me be full, let me be empty, let me have all things, let me have nothing. I freely and wholeheartedly yield all things to your pleasure and disposal. And now, glorious and blessed God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, you are mine and I am yours. So be it. And the covenant now made on earth, let it be ratified in Heaven. Amen.

When we pray these words, we also commit ourselves to live them. We commit ourselves to love our neighbors in real and tangible ways. We commit ourselves to be the hands and feet of Christ in Findlay and beyond. We look for those who are hurting, lonely, hungry, overwhelmed, or forgotten and we refuse to ignore them. We listen for God's nudges to serve, to give, to encourage, to show kindness, and to embody grace.

My prayer is that this year is not simply "another year," but a year where our church family grows deeper in prayer and wider in love. May we be a praying church. May we be a caring church. And may we trust God enough to say, "Here we are, Lord. Use us."




## Chapter by Chapter The Book of Mark

They will be studying, A Woman who doesn't Quit from the book of Ruth by Nicki Koziarz






## Chapter by Chapter The Book of Mark

The actions and fundraising of our small group of women at St Marks are making a difference. The contributions raised by us and all of the other UWF groups in the world help to fund more than \$5 million in grants each year to programs helping women, children, and youth across the United States and around the world.

Even though we mostly focus on our own church and community, our work directly fuels the global impact. Here's how:

#### 1. Financial Support for Global Missions

Local units raise funds through pledges, special offerings, and fundraisers.

These funds support:

- International mission projects (Micro-loans to women who have an idea for a small business.)
- National Mission Institutions (We have 3 UMC education and childcare missions in Ohio.)
- Programs for women, children, and youth worldwide

#### 2. Participation in Global Ministries of the Church

Local groups "expand concepts of mission through participation in the global ministries of the church". This means:

- Supporting global justice initiatives
- Contributing to international relief and development efforts (6K Walk for Water, Samaritan's Purse, UMCOR)
- Engaging in worldwide spiritual formation and leadership development

#### 3. Education & Advocacy That Reaches Beyond the Local Level

Local UWF circles study global issues—poverty, climate justice, racial equity, women's rights—and advocate for change. This aligns with UWF's broader values of empowerment, anti-racism, inclusion, and sustainability.

#### 4. Developing Leaders Who Influence Wider Mission Work

Local members often move into district, conference, and national leadership roles, shaping mission priorities that affect global programs. (We have 3 members who are on the board at the district level: Anita Heintzelman, Jeanne McCaffrey and Miriam Kuhn.)

#### 5. Being Part of a Connected Sisterhood

Local units are the grassroots of a worldwide network. Our collective actions—prayer, giving, service, advocacy—scale up to global impact because the UWF is structured to connect at every level of the organization.
