Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

At the start of each new year, many of us begin with resolutions: commitments to eat better, spend less, exercise more, or finally tackle that lingering project. Then, when Lent rolls around, we often give something up: sweets, social media, or bad habits, as a spiritual reset. The first few months of the year are often marked by an eagerness to change, improve, and grow.

But now, here we are, halfway through the year. How's it going?

Maybe some of those New Year's resolutions have faded into memory. Maybe the discipline of Lent gave way to the rhythms of spring and summer. Or maybe life simply got busy, and the focus on self-improvement has taken a backseat to daily survival.

It's around this time of year, in the heart of summer and just before the rush of back-to-school, fall schedules, and the eventual slide into Thanksgiving and Christmas, that we start to feel the weight of it all. The year isn't over yet, but we can sense its shape. The second half of the year often reveals our cracks: the overcommitments, the clutter, the weariness, the regrets.

So here's a thought: what if we made a mid-year resolution? Not as a reaction to failure, but as a recommitment to the journey of becoming. As people of faith, we don't just believe in improvement, we believe in transformation. John Wesley, the founder of the Methodist movement, taught that the Christian life is not a one-time decision but a lifelong process. He called it sanctification, the ongoing work of God's grace in us as we are shaped more and more into the image of Christ. Wesley believed we were always moving on toward perfection, always growing in love, always becoming more holy, more humble, more whole. This isn't about perfectionism, it's about purpose.

What if this summer, instead of coasting through the rest of the year, we leaned in? What if we asked ourselves, "Where is God still trying to grow me? Where is the Spirit nudging me to love more deeply, forgive more fully, or trust more completely?"

A mid-year resolution might look like:

- Recommitting to daily prayer or Scripture reading
- Letting go of a grudge or habit that's kept you stuck
- Saying "no" to hurry and "yes" to Sabbath
- Choosing to serve in a new ministry or outreach
- Rebuilding a relationship that needs healing

By the time January comes around, we don't need to start from scratch. We'll already be in motion, already being shaped by grace, already walking the road toward holiness. As Wesley once said, "By salvation I mean not barely deliverance from sin, but a renewal of our souls after the image of God." Let's not wait for a new year to begin the work of becoming everything he created us to be.
