Dear Church Family,

This September, we are beginning a brand-new sermon series called By Their Fruit. Jesus tells us in Matthew 7:16, "By their fruit you will recognize them." In Galatians 5, Paul describes what that fruit looks like: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. These aren't things we simply try harder to produce on our own—they are evidence of the Holy Spirit moving and working in our lives.

Throughout the coming weeks, we'll explore each fruit of the Spirit and what it looks like when it grows in us as individuals, as families, and as a church community. Alongside the sermons, we will also have opportunities for small groups to dig deeper together, reflecting on how God is bearing fruit in their lives.

Our prayer is that this season will not just shape us inwardly but also move us outwardly. We hope you'll look for mission opportunities to show evidence of the Spirit's fruit in your daily life—at home, at work, and in our community. One of the ways you can put your faith into action is by inviting someone you know to Stronger Together: a parent support event for youth mental wellness.

As the school year begins, many families face the challenge of children struggling with anxiety and other mental health concerns. On September 14, we are hosting Stronger Together, a special evening for parents to receive encouragement, practical tips, and guidance. An expert panel—including voices from our local schools and nonprofit organizations—will provide insight, resources, and support. This is a wonderful opportunity to find community and strength for the journey.

There are also ongoing mission opportunities like food collections for City Mission and Give a Crock, and a host of other ways you can serve your church and community. I hope you're always looking for places in your life where you can make Findlay look a little bit more like the world as it should be, as we are all gardeners restoring the garden back to paradise alongside Jesus.

We invite you to join us in worship, in small groups, and in mission as we grow together in Christ. May this season be one where others can see God's Spirit at work in us—not because of what we say, but because of the fruit our lives bear.


The Chancel Choir




The recipe for September is Hearty Bean Chili Ingredients needed by Sept. 22nd.

No matter what the circumstances, grief is a painful, confusing process. At this 13 week support group program, you'll learn what to expect in the days ahead and what's "normal" with grief.


Share this information with a friend or family member who may benefit from the class. Class members do not need to be St Marks members. This is a unique outreach program offered by St Marks.

Register or get more information by calling the church office at 419-422-4236 Pre-registration is suggested so that adequate materials can be ordered, but it is not required.


Love to Read?

Rotarian Mark Miller nominated Metzger, a pastor at St Marks UMC for the award.


"While Dan is and outstanding pastor at St Marks Church, he goes beyond typical pastoral duties and has demonstrated extraordinary service to the Findlay/Hancock County Community," Miller wrote and stated in a release from the club.

Metzger's listed accomplishments included organizing a Thanksgiving meal for teachers and students at Bigelow Elementary School, bringing the Night to Shine event to the community and to St Marks as well as arranging for former University of Findlay (UF) Head Football Coach and current Ohio State University Assistant Coach Rob Keys to speak at a Community Good Friday Breakfast. Additionally, he has assisted in reorganizing the communities involvement with the National Day of Prayer, and has been instrumental in the success of Second Chance Day.

Rotarian Puck Rowe submitted a letter of support for Metzger's nomination with Rotarian Carla Benjamin seconding the notions.
