Living the Faith We Profess: Why Active Christianity Still Matters

In every generation, the church faces the same quiet danger: a faith that is *confessed* but not *lived*. Scripture consistently warns that belief in Christ is never meant to be merely intellectual or private. Biblical Christianity is a lived reality—a transformed life visibly shaped by the saving work of Jesus Christ. In an age marked by moral confusion, spiritual apathy, and pressure to compartmentalize faith, the call for Christian men to **actively live out their faith** has never been more urgent.

The apostle Paul makes the matter plain: “Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation” (2 Corinthians 5:17). Salvation by grace alone through faith alone (Ephesians 2:8–9) does not leave a man unchanged. Rather, grace produces transformation. We are not saved *by* good works, but we are certainly saved *for* them (Ephesians 2:10). The Christian life is not about moral self-improvement; it is about a heart made new, resulting in new desires, priorities, and actions.

Transformation Is the Evidence of Saving Faith

Scripture never presents salvation and transformation as separate paths. Romans 12:1–2 calls believers to be living sacrifices, refusing conformity to the world and embracing renewal of the mind. Galatians 2:20 reminds us that the Christian life is no longer self-directed but Christ-centered: “It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me.”

For men especially, this truth cuts through cultural distortions of masculinity that celebrate passivity or domination. Biblical manhood is neither apathetic nor authoritarian. It is sacrificial, disciplined, and Christlike. A transformed man leads differently—at home, at work, in church, and in the world.

Abiding, Not Performing

Active faith does not mean frantic religious activity. Jesus Himself tells us, “Apart from Me you can do nothing” (John 15:5). Fruitfulness flows from abiding—ongoing, dependent fellowship with Christ through Scripture, prayer, obedience, and trust. Psalm 1 describes the blessed man as one rooted deeply in God’s Word, producing fruit in season.

When men neglect this abiding relationship, faith becomes shallow and inconsistent. When they pursue it, spiritual depth and endurance follow. Active Christianity is not about earning God’s favor but living in daily dependence upon His grace.

Faith That Shapes the Home

The New Testament places unmistakable weight on a man’s influence within his family. Husbands are commanded to love their wives “as Christ loved the church and gave Himself up for her” (Ephesians 5:25). Fathers are charged to bring their children up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord (Ephesians 6:4). Deuteronomy 6 presents faith as something taught intentionally, modeled consistently, and woven into everyday life.

A man who actively lives his faith understands that leadership begins with humility and service. His witness is not loud but steady. His authority is not coercive but sacrificial. Over time, this kind of faith leaves a spiritual legacy that outlives him.

Faith at Work and in the World

Scripture does not permit a division between “church life” and “real life.” Colossians 3:23 commands believers to work heartily, as for the Lord. Integrity, honesty, diligence, and faithfulness are not optional virtues—they are acts of worship. In a watching world, a distinctly Christian life opens doors for gospel conversations that words alone cannot.

Jesus tells His followers to let their light shine before others (Matthew 5:16). This does not mean isolation from the world, nor does it mean blending in unnoticed. It means living with visible conviction, grounded in truth and marked by grace.

Brotherhood, Obedience, and Perseverance

No man was meant to live the Christian life alone. Hebrews 10:24 calls believers to stir one another up toward love and good works. The local church is not a consumer experience but a covenant community where men sharpen one another, confess sin, encourage faithfulness, and stand together.

Obedience, rightly understood, is not legalism—it is trust. Scripture promises blessing not as worldly success, but as peace, endurance, and spiritual fruit (Psalm 112:1). And the Christian life is not a sprint. Paul’s testimony at the end of his life—“I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race” (2 Timothy 4:7)—calls every man to finish well.

An Invitation to Live What We Believe

It is with this biblical vision in mind that **Appleton Christian Church** invites men to participate in a new **10-part men’s ministry series** through *His Project*. Meeting **the first Saturday of each month at 8:00 a.m.**, beginning with **breakfast and fellowship**, these sessions are designed to equip men to live out their faith with clarity, conviction, and grace.

Each lesson addresses a vital area of Christian life—from personal transformation and abiding in Christ, to marriage, fatherhood, work, evangelism, and finishing well. The series emphasizes grace over moralism, dependence over performance, and faithfulness over outward success. Every session includes Scripture-centered teaching, guided discussion, personal reflection, and practical evangelism assignments appropriate for men at every stage of life.

This is not about becoming better men by human standards. It is about becoming faithful men—men who live what they profess, love whom Christ loves, and stand firm in a changing world.

If you are ready to move beyond passive belief into active, biblical faith, **His Project** is for you. Come hungry—for breakfast, for fellowship, and for the Word of God—and join us as we pursue lives that truly reflect Christ.

Celebrate Recovery



A Note on Celebrate Recovery

As the initial excitement of the new year begins to fade, many people find that their resolutions start to slip away. Research suggests that a significant majority of individuals abandon their goals by early February, often feeling discouraged when the initial momentum stalls. Celebrate Recovery offers a different approach by providing a consistent fellowship of believers dedicated to personal growth and spiritual strengthening. While we certainly support those navigating any kind of addiction, two-thirds of our participants attend to find help with everyday struggles like anxiety, codependency, anger, work stressors, depression, food and the weight of perfectionism.

The heart of this ministry is based on the Beatitudes delivered by Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount, which connect us to God's nature, our redemption, and the transformative work that the Holy Spirit has on us. In Grand Junction, there are opportunities to connect five days a week, with Appleton Christian hosting an open share session every Friday night from 6:30 to 7:30. There is no requirement to commit to a group long term, as our doors are open to anyone, even those who simply had a difficult week and need a safe place to talk. Whether you are facing a temporary setback or a lifelong habit, this community is designed for any adult looking to find freedom and peace.

"Confess your trespasses to one another, and pray for one another, that you may be healed."

-James 5:16

During World War II, Winston Churchill once made a simple observation about American troops that has stuck with me. Speaking about America's resolve, he said that to understand the spirit behind the war effort, all you had to do was "look into the faces of any American" soldier.

That's a powerful thought—because sometimes courage shows up before a man ever says a word.

If you want a real-life example of that kind of grit, look at the 77th Infantry Division.

The 77th wasn't built on hype. They were built for hard assignments. They fought in some of the most difficult battles of the Pacific—Guam, Leyte, and Okinawa—places where victory didn't come quickly and survival wasn't guaranteed. This wasn't "easy war." It was caves, jungle, exhaustion, fear, and brutal fighting where every step forward had to be earned.

And the 77th kept stepping forward.

One reason their story stands out is because the division had a reputation for being made up of men who were a little more seasoned. Not necessarily the young faces people expected when they pictured infantry soldiers. These were men with life behind them—men who had learned endurance, steadiness, and resilience. They even picked up a nickname because of it: the "Old B**tards." Not exactly polite—but it wasn't said lightly either. It was a rough way of saying, "Those men are tough. They don't quit."

And here's what matters: they weren't in the back. They were in the fight. They were doing the hard work. Advancing. Taking ground. Getting it done.

This connects right into one of our church values: the older teach the younger. That's not just tradition—it's biblical discipleship. Paul gives clear instruction for men in Titus 2: "Older men are to be sober-minded, dignified, self-controlled, sound in faith, in love, and in steadfastness" (Titus 2:2). And then he speaks directly to the younger men too: "Likewise, urge the younger men to be self-controlled" (Titus 2:6).

That's a simple picture of the church functioning like a family: older men setting the pace with steady faith, and younger men rising to the call of disciplined godliness.

Some believers quietly start thinking, "I've done my part," or "I don't have what I used to," or "That's for the younger people now." But the gospel doesn't come with an expiration date on usefulness. The church needs older men who are still willing to step forward—men whose faith has been tested, whose love has deepened, and whose steadiness helps others stand strong. The younger need your example. They need your prayers. They need your stories. They need your steadiness. They need to look into your face and see a faith that has endured.

So here's the call to action. If you are an older man in the church, take this personally: step into Titus 2:2 on purpose. Choose one younger man to encourage this month. Invite him to coffee. Ask him how he's doing spiritually. Pray with him, not just for him. Help him become a man who is sound in faith, in love, and in steadfastness. If you are a younger man, take Titus 2:6 seriously: lean into self-control. Ask an older man to speak into your life. Be teachable. Be consistent. Build habits now that will hold you up later.

Let's be the kind of church where every generation is still in the fight together—where seasoned saints are active, visible, and engaged, and where faith is passed on with courage and love. Because sometimes the greatest strength in the room isn't the newest energy...it's the faith that has endured.
