Living the Mission: Growing as Fully Devoted Followers of Jesus Christ

At Appleton Christian Church, our mission is clear and deeply biblical:

“To glorify God as we grow fully devoted followers of Jesus Christ” (Matthew 28:19–20).

This mission is not merely a statement on paper; it is a call to a way of life. Everything we do as a church—our worship, teaching, fellowship, and outreach—flows from this purpose. We exist first and foremost to glorify God, and we do so by obeying Christ’s command to make disciples who live under His lordship in every area of life.

To be a *fully devoted follower of Jesus Christ* is not to claim spiritual perfection, but to pursue faithful obedience. It is a daily, growing commitment to love Christ, trust His Word, and walk in His ways. Scripture gives us clear guidance on what such devotion looks like. At Appleton Christian Church, we emphasize five biblical practices that mark the life of a disciple.

1. Pray Continually

Prayer is the lifeline of the believer. The Bible commands us to “pray at all times in the Spirit” (Ephesians 6:18) and to “pray without ceasing” (1 Thessalonians 5:17). Prayer is not reserved for church services or emergencies; it is the constant posture of a heart dependent on God.

A fully devoted follower understands that prayer is not about informing God of our needs—He already knows them—but about aligning our hearts with His will. Jesus Himself taught that prayer offered in faith honors God (Matthew 21:22). When we pray continually, we confess our need for His wisdom, strength, and grace.

As a church, we encourage one another to cultivate personal and corporate prayer—praying for our families, our leaders, our community, and the advancement of the gospel. A praying church is a dependent church, and dependence upon God brings glory to Him.

2. Study God’s Word

Devotion to Christ must be rooted in devotion to His Word. Scripture calls believers to “present yourself to God as one approved... rightly handling the word of truth” (2 Timothy 2:15). God’s Word is not optional nourishment for the Christian life—it is essential.

The Bible teaches that “all Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness” (2 Timothy 3:16–17). Through God’s Word, we come to know His character, understand His will, and grow in spiritual maturity.

Fully devoted followers do not rely solely on Sunday sermons for biblical intake. They read, study, and meditate on Scripture throughout the week. They allow God’s Word to shape their thinking, guide their decisions, and correct their lives. As we grow in the knowledge of God’s truth, we are better equipped to glorify Him in faithful obedience.

3. Actively Serve Christ

True faith always expresses itself through obedient action. James reminds us to “be doers of the word, and not hearers only” (James 1:22). Serving Christ is not a suggestion for the especially gifted or available; it is the calling of every believer.

God has uniquely gifted each member of the body of Christ to serve for the good of others and the glory of God. Whether through teaching, hospitality, prayer, acts of mercy, or practical service, every believer has a role to play. Galatians 6:10 urges us to “do good to everyone, and especially to those who are of the household of faith.”

A fully devoted follower looks for opportunities to serve—both within the church and beyond it. Service is an act of worship, reflecting the heart of Christ, who “came not to be served but to serve” (Mark 10:45). When we serve faithfully, God is glorified through our obedience and love.

4. Encourage and Support One Another

Christian discipleship is never meant to be lived in isolation. God has placed believers into the body of Christ so that we might build one another up in faith. Scripture calls us to “encourage one another and build one another up” (1 Thessalonians 5:11).

Fully devoted followers take seriously the responsibility to support fellow believers—bearing one another’s burdens (Galatians 6:2) and stirring one another “to love and good works” (Hebrews 10:24–25). This includes regular fellowship, accountability, prayer, and loving correction when necessary.

A church marked by encouragement reflects the love of Christ to the world. As we walk together through seasons of joy and hardship, we demonstrate the unity and compassion that Christ prayed His followers would display. Encouraging one another strengthens the church and brings glory to God.

5. Share the Hope of Christ

Finally, fully devoted followers of Jesus Christ are committed to sharing the gospel. Christ’s Great Commission commands us to “go therefore and make disciples of all nations” (Matthew 28:19–20). The gospel is not something to be kept private; it is good news meant to be proclaimed.

Peter reminds believers that we are God’s chosen people, called to “proclaim the excellencies of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light” (1 Peter 2:9). We are also instructed to be ready to give a reason for the hope that is within us (1 Peter 3:15).

Sharing the hope of Christ flows naturally from a life transformed by grace. Fully devoted followers speak of Christ with humility, love, and conviction—trusting God to work through their witness. Whether through personal relationships, acts of kindness, or intentional outreach, we joyfully declare the saving truth of the gospel.

A Call to Faithful Living

The mission of Appleton Christian Church is not fulfilled by programs alone, but by people who daily pursue faithfulness to Christ. As we pray continually, study God’s Word, serve actively, encourage one another, and share the hope of Christ, we grow as fully devoted followers—and God is glorified.

May we, as a church family, commit ourselves anew to this mission, trusting that God will use our faithful obedience to advance His kingdom and bring honor to His great name.

This year, we will begin with a sermon series on our mission here at Appleton Christian, and we pray you can all join us. I love you all, Dan
