Growing in Christ Through Service

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

As I reflect on my ten years at Appleton Christian Church, I am both humbled and filled with joy at what God has done among us. One of the most visible signs of His hand at work is the growing number of our members who are actively involved in serving the body of Christ. From teaching and helping in children's ministry, to preparing meals, working behind the scenes in tech, serving on the praise team, helping with maintenance, or ministering to those in need—there has been an unmistakable movement of the Spirit, stirring people to action.

What has become clear over time is this: Christian service is not optional for those who want to grow in Christ. It is *essential*. It is a means by which God matures us, molds us, and draws us closer to Him. We don't just serve because there's a need—we serve because it's part of God's design for how we become more like Jesus.

The Biblical Call to Service

The foundation of our service lies in the example of Jesus Himself. In **Mark 10:45**, Jesus declares, "For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life as a ransom for many." If the Lord of all creation took on the posture of a servant, how much more should we, His disciples? The Apostle Paul writes in **Galatians 5:13**, "...through love serve one another." And in **1 Peter 4:10**, we are reminded, "Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms."

These verses are not suggestions—they are calls to action. Service is not something we do once we've "arrived" spiritually. Rather, it is often through *serving* that we mature spiritually.

Service as a Pathway to Spiritual Growth

In the last decade, I've watched many individuals at Appleton Christian step into an area of service somewhat timidly—perhaps unsure of their gifts, or hesitant about whether they could make a difference. And yet, again and again, those same individuals not only grew in skill and confidence, but they grew in *Christlikeness*. Their service became a source of joy, connection, humility, and closeness with God.

Why is that?

Because when we serve others, we begin to understand the heart of Christ. We become instruments of His love. We see how the Spirit works *through* us in ways we never could have predicted.

Philippians 2:3–5 reminds us, "Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves... In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus." This mindset is not developed in isolation. It is formed as we step outside of ourselves to serve others in the name of Jesus.

The Role of Church Leadership in Equipping the Saints

Scripture is clear that the responsibility of church leadership is not merely to lead but to **equip others** to serve.

Ephesians 4:11–13 speaks directly to this:

"So Christ Himself gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers, to equip His people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ."

This is not theoretical. We have *seen* this lived out at Appleton. As the elders and ministry leaders have sought to equip the congregation for service, what we read in verse 13 has become real in our church family:

- Unity of faith We have grown closer to one another as we serve alongside each other.
- Knowledge of the Son of God Through service, members grow deeper in their understanding of Christ.
- Spiritual maturity Those who serve are strengthened in their walk, their witness, and their worship.

What an incredible promise—and what a joy to see it fulfilled in our midst.

The Ripple Effect of Service

Another beautiful pattern I've noticed is this: once someone starts serving in one area, they often step out into another. Service multiplies. And so does fruit.

One member begins by helping with communion, and soon they're serving in hospitality. Another starts by helping with setup on Sunday mornings, and before long they're discipling younger believers or mentoring a student. These are not isolated cases—they are *stories of transformation*.

In 2 Corinthians 9:12–13. Paul writes:

"This service that you perform is not only supplying the needs of the Lord's people but is also overflowing in many expressions of thanks to God. Because of the service... others will praise God..."

Service glorifies God, not only because of the work that gets done, but because of the witness it provides. As more people step up to serve, more lives are touched, more needs are met, and more praise is given to our Lord.

A Loving Challenge to the Body of Christ

So what now? If you are already serving in one or more areas, praise God—and know that your work is not in vain. If you feel the Spirit nudging you to explore new areas of service, we want to encourage and equip you to do so. There are *many* opportunities—some visible, others behind the scenes—but all vital to the life and health of the church.

And if you haven't yet stepped into a service role, this is your invitation. Not out of obligation—but out of love. Love for the Lord. Love for His people. Love for the work of His Kingdom.

Talk with one of the elders, a deacon, or a member of the ministry staff. Let us know what God is stirring in your heart. We would be honored to help you find a place where your gifts, your passions, and your faith can come together in service to Christ.

Let me close with this encouragement from 1 Corinthians 15:58:

"Therefore, my dear brothers and sisters, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain."

At Appleton Christian, we are becoming a church where *everyone* has a part to play. Let's continue to grow, to serve, and to mature together—as we follow Jesus, our Servant-King. *Dan*

After all, to be a disciple is to put yourself in the position of learning from someone else. The disciples of Jesus did just that. What amazes me though, is that the teachable were not the only ones wanting to learn from Jesus.

There were many who simply wanted Jesus not to teach them truth, but to confirm what they already knew to be true. They knew that the Messiah was going to come and build an earthly kingdom, overthrow the enemies of God's people, and reign over a new kingdom. They listened intently to anything that confirmed what they already knew but seemed to be blind when Jesus revealed his true mission, which he did repeatedly. They were unteachable.

Judas, sat with the master for years, hearing all the same teachings and witnessing the same miracles, yet he proved to be unlearned by the time he sold Jesus for a few pieces of silver. Was he simply an evil robot carrying out the plan with no will of his own. That is not what the scriptures teach. Rather he was a man with an unteachable spirit who could encounter the living God and never grasp his teachings.

As modern-day disciples, we too can fall into the trap of unteachability. We can become so lazy that we never pursue more knowledge, deeper obedience, or more experience with our Lord. Our attitudes are not marked with a receptivity to learning and humility. After all, we live in a time when to admit you don't have it figured out is a weakness.

We must overcome this through the power of the Holy Spirit. IF not, then we will continue to get up every morning and go to bed every night and never grow closer towards Jesus. We will continue to struggle with the same old sins, never finding freedom, and then wondering what's wrong, why are we not farther along in our faith journey.

The question is how? How do we become a disciple? One we ask the teacher. We pour our hearts out to the lord in prayer, asking him to teach us. He will, he promised that if we seek, we will find. But we must seek. Then we move forward in trust by humbling ourselves and allowing those whose faith has been revealed as more mature than ours to speak into our lives. How? Again, we ask them. Go to the one whose faith you admire and ask them to just spend time with you and help you to know the Lord the way they do. Then listen to them, try to remind yourself that you do not have all the answers, none of us do. We need each other to grow and mature. Thirdly, when you are ready to grow, begin to disciple others. Look for those who are new to the faith or struggling and offer to walk alongside them. Give of yourself, you time and talents to pour into someone else. I will tell you there is no faster way to see in the areas in your life you need to grow and trust in God more than to open yourself up to others and say "follow me as I follow Christ."

I know that many will hear the word disciple and automatically tune out. They believe that this means going back to school, lots of study and information overload. But that is not discipleship, sure there will be reading and learning, but the outcome won't be a graduation certificate and a graduation gown, it will be a heart that is closer to the Lord. How much should a true disciple desire that? Is there any price that would be too high, or any sacrifice that would be too great? If the scriptures testify about anything, its that there is nothing more valuable than finding and loving Jesus. That is what discipleship is all about, it's about finding Jesus, then loving him through following and trusting in him.

If you are ready to start, we are here to help. Right now, I am looking for 4-5 men who would like to join me in a small discipleship group. Also, I am asking for Men and Women who would be willing to lead similar groups. I have some materials we can use, but it will not be about the materials, it will be about hearts seeking to follow and trust Jesus. If you are interested, please let me know as soon as you can.

The teams she works with not only translate the Scripture but also make it accessible to each group in various media (print, audio) and teach them to study it deeply – trusting that its message will bring them into a truly life-transforming relationship with God!

Jennifer PRAISES GOD for our loving, faithful partnership though prayer and giving! She feels a part of us even across the miles.

TOPICS FOR PRAYER: TEAM: Ask God, by his Spirit, to shape, fill and empower Jennifer and the teams she works with to be faithful witnesses to who God is and what life in his Kingdom looks like.
