My brothers and sisters in Christ,

I had several people ask me to share with them the challenges I gave at the end of my sermon from the book "Ruthless Trust" by Brennan Manning.

## I. We Need Ruthless Trust in Our Salvation

Now for most of us this is a hard thing to REALLY do. To trust in our salvation. To trust that because of Christ and our surrender to Him we are free of any guilt, shame, sin, or failure. To trust that IN HIM, though our sins were as red as crimson they are now white as snow!

So, my question to all of us... Do you have 'ruthless' (unrelenting, unyielding, uncompromising) trust in your salvation?

In **Isaiah 55:8-9**, God says through the prophet;

**"My thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways," declares the LORD. "As the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts."**

You may have heard that passage before, but did you know what the context is for God's thoughts being higher than ours?

As we read the two preceding verses, we see they are about our salvation. **Isaiah 55:6,7**

**Seek the LORD while you can find him. Call on him now while he is near. Let the wicked change their ways and banish the very thought of doing wrong. Let them turn to the LORD that he may have mercy on them. Yes, turn to our God, for he will forgive generously.**

We need RUTHLESS (unrelenting) trust in our salvation. GOD – 'in Christ' has forgiven us generously... all the way, 100%, completely!

As Paul wrote in **1 Timothy 1:15-17**;

**Here is a trustworthy saying that deserves full acceptance: Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners—of whom I am the worst. But for that very reason I was shown mercy so that in me, the worst of sinners, Christ Jesus might display his unlimited patience as an example for those who would believe in him and receive eternal life. Now to the King eternal, immortal, invisible, the only God, be honor and glory for ever and ever. Amen.**

## II. We Need Ruthless Trust in Our Adoption

Paul wrote in **Ephesians 1:4-6 (NLT)**;

**Even before he made the world, God loved us and chose us in Christ to be holy and without fault in his eyes. God decided in advance to adopt us into his own family by bringing us to himself**

**through Jesus Christ. This is what he wanted to do, and it gave him great pleasure. So we praise God for the glorious grace he has poured out on us who belong to his dear Son.**

There is something special about adoption. God loved us and chose us... God decided in advance to adopt us into his own family. I would say that, while there are times when it is good to go to God as a ragged beggar might go to the King of Kings, BUT – it is vastly superior to approach God as a little child would approach his or her Father.

### **III. We Need Ruthless Trust in God’s Plan for Us**

**Ephesians 2:10 (NLT)**

**For we are God’s masterpiece. He has created us anew in Christ Jesus, so we can do the good things he planned for us long ago.**

One of the questions I often get from people is, “how do I know what God wants me to do?” Many of us want a clear sign from God before we take action. And without that type of clarity we hesitate, and usually don’t go forward at all.

In the book, there was one example that the author shared about a man who was going into his second part of his life and wanted to serve God in a different way so he went to India to help the infirmed. He was still hesitant to commit himself in any specific direction until he had clarity from God. So while he was in India, he approached Mother Teresa and asked her to pray for God to give him clarity. Manning shared the following quote on page 5;

**“Clarity is the last thing you are clinging to and must let go of. I have never had clarity; what I always had is trust. So I will pray you trust God.” -Mother Teresa**

### **IV: We Need Ruthless Trust in God’s Power**

**Psalm 66:1–7 (ESV)**

**Shout for joy to God, all the earth; sing the glory of his name; give to him glorious praise! Say to God, “How awesome are your deeds! So great is your power that your enemies come cringing to you. All the earth worships you and sings praises to you; they sing praises to your name.” Come and see what God has done: he is awesome in his deeds toward the children of man. He turned the sea into dry land; they passed through the river on foot. There did we rejoice in him, who rules by his might forever, whose eyes keep watch on the nations— let not the rebellious exalt themselves.**

As Jesus told us in **John 10:10**, **“The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full.”**

We have an enemy who is opposing God’s intentions for us... BUT, as we trust in God’s Power, we know that our God is BIGGER and BADDER than anything or anyone that comes against us!

Our Savior Jesus is not just a king but the King of Kings.

As Paul wrote in **2 Timothy 1:12**...

**I know whom I have believed, and am convinced that he is able to guard what I have entrusted to him for that day.**

We need to fully trust God in all we do, so we can live life fully as God has intended...

Recently, I investigated the weird reproductive habits of octopus. (Ha! Bet you didn't think that would be something you would read in the church's newsletter!) When a daddy octopus and a mommy octopus get together to make little octopuses, the male knows that his death is coming—either immediately after the act when he is eaten by the female octopus, or in a few months when he simply dies. For the female, death is still a certainty, but the process takes longer.

She will choose a den, carefully deposit up to 50,000 eggs, and for the next month she will aggressively protect her brood. She will waft oxygenated water over them and protect them without ever leaving to eat. By the time the babies hatch, mom will either be dead, or will soon be dead. There is a whole lot more to it and it is fascinating, if not a little disturbing, but I will leave the research to you. But what fascinated me was that octopuses reproduce once in their life and then die. They sacrifice all in order to ensure the next generation of octopuses.

Now hold on tight, because we are going to make a big mental leap. When I first heard about this, I was fascinated, but I immediately thought about the church. (I know, welcome to my strange brain....) The enormity of the sacrifice that an octopus makes to keep the species alive is striking. This leaves me with a question. What are we, as the church, willing to sacrifice to see the next generation of believers be born again?

According to recent numbers, our valley is 36% religious—not Christian, religious. This includes every form of false religion in addition to Christians. That means that there is a whole lot of work for us to do! We are called to make disciples, to bear fruit, to be witnesses of Jesus. As it says in Scripture, we are called to, “Rescue those who are being taken away to death; hold back those who are stumbling to the slaughter...” (Prov. 24), to “... have mercy on those who doubt; save others by snatching them out of the fire; to others show mercy with fear, hating even the garment stained by the flesh” (Jude 22-23). There is a lot we could unpack in these verses, but I hope we can agree, that as believers we are called to reach others for Christ, and that call is urgent.

When I think about it, I can feel overwhelmed. After all, the world is so big, the number of lost souls is staggering and we are so small, the task seems impossible. The good news is that we are not called to reach everyone alone. We are called to be faithful with the opportunities God gives us. Also, according to those who crunch numbers, if every Christian would simply reach one person a year, disciple that person, and teach them to reach others, the entire world could be reached for Christ in 37 years!

#### **Overview:**

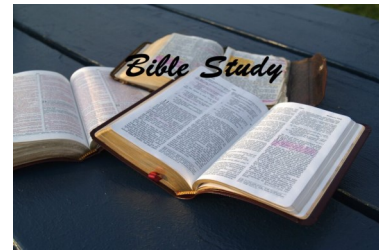
Paul's second letter to his beloved Timothy is a bold call to stand firm in the face of opposition and suffering for the sake of the Gospel.

#### **Who Should Attend:**

This 7-week study will include an introduction to the Inductive Study Method followed by 6 weeks of study. Participants will expect 30 minutes of personal study a day, one hour of group discussion and a 60-minute video lecture each week.

#### **Overview:**

Church leadership matters. Leaders in the church have a significant impact on the health and maturity of the congregation. This is why the New Testament provides such clear teaching regarding appointing leadership in the church, and why it spends a significant amount of time providing instruction to church leaders. Biblical church leadership looks very different than the leadership of the world and so it must be intentionally cultivated through the study and application of God's word. This class will provide a general overview of the understanding, knowledge, and character necessary for biblical leadership.

#### **Who Should Attend:**

Every Christian should desire to grow in character and knowledge of God's word. Therefore, this course is open to the first 10 people who sign up. The hope is that this class will give anyone who goes through it the tools and knowledge to lead in the church.

#### **Expectations/Workload:**

This class will work through a workbook together each week. In class we will discuss biblical principles of church leadership and major church doctrines. Outside class there will be Bible reading, other short readings, and questions concerning the characteristics of a leader. All of this will be discussed at the beginning of our class each week.

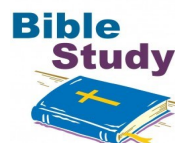
