A Memorial to Charlie Kirk: Boldness and Gentleness in Sharing the Gospel

The life of Charlie Kirk was one lived with deep conviction. He strongly believed that the world needed to hear the saving message of Jesus Christ. Charlie was not ashamed of the Gospel, nor did he shy away from proclaiming it in a culture often hostile to biblical truth.

Charlie's legacy is not only what he accomplished but the way in which he carried out the calling of Christ—with boldness empowered by the Holy Spirit and with gentleness rooted in love. As we reflect on Charlie's example, we are reminded that every Christian is called to this same mission: to share our faith boldly and lovingly, so that a watching world may see and hear the hope of the Gospel.

The Call to Share the Gospel

The Scriptures leave no doubt that proclaiming Christ is the responsibility of every believer. Jesus Himself gave this commission in *Matthew 28:19-20*: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age." This Great Commission was not only for the first disciples but for all who follow Jesus today.

Mark's Gospel reiterates this mission in Mark 16:15: "Go into all the world and proclaim the gospel to the whole creation." Luke records Jesus saying in Luke 24:47 that "repentance for the forgiveness of sins should be proclaimed in His name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem." These verses remind us that the Gospel is not meant to be hidden or confined—it is a message to be declared.

The psalmist also calls us to public witness: "Sing to the Lord, bless His name; tell of His salvation from day to day. Declare His glory among the nations, His marvelous works among all the peoples! For great is the Lord, and greatly to be praised" (Psalm 96:2-4). And Peter reminds us in 1 Peter 3:15-16 that we are to "always be prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you."

Charlie Kirk understood this calling and lived it. He believed the Gospel was not a private possession but a public truth that must be proclaimed. His life reminds us that every Christian has both the privilege and responsibility to declare the glory of God and the saving work of Christ.

Boldness Through the Holy Spirit

While the call is clear, it is not always easy. The world is often hostile to the Gospel. Fear, ridicule, and opposition can silence many believers. Yet God has not left us alone. He has equipped us with the Holy Spirit to embolden us and overcome fear.

Paul wrote to Timothy in 2 Timothy 1:7-8: "For God gave us a spirit not of fear but of power and love and self-control. Therefore do not be ashamed of the testimony about our Lord." This boldness is not rooted in our own strength but in the Spirit of God working through us.

The Lord reassures His people in Isaiah 41:10: "Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my righteous right hand." In Deuteronomy 31:6 we are commanded: "Be strong and courageous. Do not fear or be in dread... for it is the Lord your God who goes with you. He will not leave you or forsake you."

Jesus Himself promised His followers that the Holy Spirit would be their helper in moments of witness: "The Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, He will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you" (John 14:26). And in Luke 12:12 He added: "For the Holy Spirit will teach you in that very hour what you ought to say."

Charlie embodied this boldness. He stepped into a polarized society, unafraid to stand on the truth of God's Word. He trusted God's promise of presence and provision. His boldness was not brashness—it was courage rooted in faith that the Spirit would give him both the words and the strength he needed.

Gentleness and Kindness in Witness

The other side of Gospel witness is equally important: gentleness. Boldness without love can harden hearts rather than open them. Scripture repeatedly emphasizes that we must represent Christ not only in truth but also in kindness.

Jesus said in Matthew 5:14-16: "You are the light of the world... let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven." Our lives are to be a reflection of God's character. Paul wrote in Colossians 4:5-6: "Walk in wisdom toward outsiders... Let your speech always be gracious, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how you ought to answer each person."

Paul prayed for Philemon in Philemon 1:6: "I pray that the sharing of your faith may become effective for the full knowledge of every good thing that is in us for the sake of Christ." Likewise, Peter exhorted believers in I Peter 3:15-16 to make their defense "with gentleness and respect, having a good conscience." And Paul charged Timothy in 2 Timothy 4:2: "Preach the word; be ready in season and out of season; reprove, rebuke, and exhort, with complete patience and teaching."

Charlie modeled this combination of truth and grace. He spoke with conviction but sought to treat those he engaged with dignity. His goal was not simply to win debates but to point people toward Christ. He recognized that the Gospel must be spoken with love because it reflects the very heart of God.

Charlie's Legacy and Our Calling

Paul declared in Romans 1:16: "For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes." Charlie lived this verse with his whole life. He stepped into a society marked by division and hostility because he knew that people needed to hear about Jesus Christ.

Charlie also lived out the words of Romans 10:14-15: "How then will they call on Him in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in Him of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone preaching? ... As it is written, 'How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the good news!'"

Charlie Kirk had beautiful feet. He carried the Gospel to places where it was desperately needed. He believed the promises of God, trusted the power of the Holy Spirit, and sought to represent Christ with truth and love. His impact was profound, but his example is not meant only to be admired. It is meant to be followed.

We, too, are called to be bold and gentle witnesses. We, too, are commanded to share Christ. And we, too, have been equipped by the Spirit of God to live unashamed of the Gospel.

Conclusion

As we remember Charlie Kirk, let us be reminded of the calling that rests upon every Christian life. We are to go into all the world, proclaiming the Gospel boldly through the power of the Holy Spirit and living it out with gentleness and kindness toward those God places in our path.

Charlie was not ashamed of the Gospel, and he lived in such a way that others could hear and see Christ through him. May we honor his memory not only by speaking well of him today but by continuing his mission tomorrow.

And may it be said of us, as it was of him, that we have *beautiful feet*—feet that carry the good news of Jesus Christ to a world that desperately needs Him.



Prayer is the most important part of OCC from the buying of the gifts to the shoe packers to the Warehouse to the transportation to the teachers, children, and their families. Miracles Do Happen! Please pray about your participation and what to pack. We have as our goal 300 boxes.

Thank you for all the items you have brought in all year - please continue.

Our Packing Party for when we pack boxes with all the donations will be Sat. Nov 8 @ 9:00 - 11:30 AM and lunch following. This party is for ALL AGES having the older work with the younger in filling all of the boxes.

In a couple of weeks, we will have our boxes out that you can take and fill up on your own. Collection Week is Nov. 16-23 and boxes can be returned anytime that week or before.

Also, \$10.00 per box is needed for shipping, handling, and ministry expenses. This can be put in the box you fill - (one check for the number of boxes x \$10.00), given in the offering box designated OCC or pay online and be able to track you box to the country it is being sent to.

Adopt a shoebox- help to pay the \$10.00 for shipping and ministry expense for all the boxes we fill at the packing party- put in the Adopt a shoebox or put in the offering box- always designate OCC.

Online shopping is available for \$25.00 a box which includes the shipping/ministry expense as well as follow your box. Go to Samaritanpurse.org or Operationchristmaschild.org

Our Collection Box is located in the foyer of the Worship Center (lower building) or the items can be brought to the office in the upper building. We have needs for the boxes we will fill at the packing party:

- Items for 2-4 year olds: crayons, sippy cups, toys, under garments, music instruments, hats, baby dolls, books, and coloring books.
- Items for middle (ages 5-9): Water color paints (no liquid), socks, hats, matchbox cars, play dough
- Items for older boys (ages 10-14): pliers, hammer, screw drivers, socks, games, marbles, caps
- Items for older girls (ages 10-14): sewing kits, beads, journals, jewelry making or hobby kits, hats, socks
- Useful and other items: flashlights with extra batteries, rope, hair brushes, combs, hair accessories, colored pencils, markers, scissors, sunglasses, solar calculators, compass, rulers, jump ropes, binoculars, soccer balls with pumps and extra needles, toothbrushes, and dental floss.

Devotional #1: Love God, by Conn Smith and Levi Willis

When you hear the word "love," what comes to mind? Culture often teaches us love is mostly about feelings, but in the Bible, love is about commitment, action, and relationship. Look up the Hebrew word "hesed" for more. Read Matthew 22:37-38. This IS God talking here. God came down to Earth with a mission, becoming human, to show us how to love Himself, His Father, and His Spirit. He tells us the main goal a human should have is to love God with everything we have. Everything else in life flows out of that. Before we can love others or even love ourselves, we must be connected to the source of love-God Himself. Read 1 John 4:19. God has always loved us. He created us for relationship with Him. Relationships take work, though. Have you ever had a friend with whom you've never spent quality time? Probably not. Have you ever had a truly deep friendship with someone who never offered to do anything for you? Probably not. Love is more than just a feeling. Feelings come and go, but real love, real "hesed" requires choices and actions. Christ loved us before we were born (John 15:13). He laid down His life to save us from our sins before they ever happened. That's real love. So how do we love God in return? God knows we can't perfectly love Him. He's not looking for that in our hearts. He's looking for repentance and acknowledgment of Him, our adoration, our devotion to Him. With our heart, God gives us ways to love Him through our affections, our passions. With our **soul**, we can love God through our identity, worship, and devotion to Him. Do you identify with God? We're all created in His image, but do you claim that as the most important part of you? Lastly, we can love God with our **mind**, through our thoughts, decisions, and how we prioritize our lives. Think of this illustration—a glass vase with stones, pebbles, and water in it. If the stones are the most important things in your life that you should be focusing on, but you put the water, the unimportant stuff, and the pebbles, the necessary but not important stuff, in the vase first, then you have no room for the stones! We're designed to put God first in our lives, but so many things in our lives can get in the way of that. We need to take ownership of that fact and accept the responsibility of the relationship with Christ. Who would want a spouse that never loved you through their action, their identity, their priorities? I ask you to **choose** to love God today, and every day after.

Questions to Ponder:

- What does it mean for you personally to love God with all your heart, soul, and mind?
- What area in your life is hard to love God in? Can you surrender that?
- Why do you think "love God" is the greatest commandment?

<u>Your Challenge:</u> This week, try <u>one</u> new way to practically love God and put Him first in your life. Prayer, fasting, reading the word, spending time in discipleship, etc. Then let someone know how it goes! We're all growing together.

Judy has stepped up and done an exemplary job of managing the many groups of 2 who come on Sunday afternoons to complete several tasks to ready the Worship Center for the huge task of vacuuming and mopping on Monday mornings. Without Coach, we would be lost!

Next, I'd like to give a heartfelt, hearty THANKS! to the worker volunteers who have been so thorough and reliable to get the Sunday and Monday cleaning done. Without these folks giving their time and lots of their energy, we would not have been able to (and to continue to) keep our church in good order and ready for the many folks who use the Worship Center each and every week. This includes our church program usages, staff uses and rental uses.

Interestingly, the majority of the uses of the Worship Center involve food in some form or another. I know Dan! If we're not eatin'.... From Sunday services snacks, to the Tuesday Family night meals, to recurring, once-a-month luncheon and dinner uses and everything in between, food is present! Food equals messy floors, tables, and chairs. General usage itself makes for messy bathrooms, diminished paper supplies, overflowing trash cans, messy halls and lobby, etc, etc, etc.

ACC employs an able crew to clean both buildings – Admin and Worship Center – once a week. This usually occurs on Friday mornings in preparation (mostly) for our Sunday morning worship. Between Friday morning and Monday morning messes happen! BOY do they happen.

Last January, following our full usage of the church at the end of the remodeling in November, we had a hard look at the condition of things after the weekends of church use and we concluded we needed to add to our cleaning schedule. We had no money available for hiring our crew to clean twice a week. Therefore, we instituted the volunteer cleaning with a Sunday afternoon crew and a Monday morning crew, effectively breaking the cleaning into 1 to 1 ½ hour intervals. Several folks volunteered to help. Over the last few months, a few have had to step away due to life needs. We appreciate every one of these folks and what we have been able to accomplish in keeping our facility ship-shape.

NOW, we need more of you to step up, especially for our Monday morning crew needs. Right now, 4 people (with fill-ins from Judy, as needed) do the work. That doesn't give them much relief from their rotations. But our Sunday and on-call people could use some respite as well.
