Course Description

This course is a study of systematic theology. Systematic theology "seeks to apply Scripture by asking what the *whole* Bible teaches about any given subject." In Systematic Theology II we will continue our study of the doctrine of God (theology proper) and move onto a study of the doctrine of man (anthropology).

Course Objectives

It is the aim of this course that God be glorified in the student by:

- 1. Their having a solid understanding of the various doctrines of the Word of God.
- 2. Their learning to read the Bible through the grid of a Scriptural systematic theology.
- 3. Their developing a theological mind to serve them in all of life.
