I am presently serving as an interim pastor for two churches in Porterville (First, UMC and Grand Ave.), stepping in for a pastor who left midyear.





Home Church Visits Seven Short Prophets

The Old Testament Book of the Twelve holds the accounts of twelve prophets who spoke or wrote between the years of 750 - 200 BCE. They are sometimes called "the minor prophets" or "the lesser prophets," and they are not often read nor well known by Christians today.

Yet, they are not minor, nor lesser...they are simply shorter writings. So, from May 2 through June 13, Home Church will study the seven shortest written prophets, one each week. Pastor Mike will prepare and email study guides before each Tuesday meeting. We'll encounter:

Nahum, on May 2 from about 650 BCE Zephaniah on May 9, about 640 BCE? Habakkuk on May 16, about 600 BCE Obadiah on May 23, perhaps 580 BCE Haggai on May 30, perhaps 520 BCE Joel on June 6, perhaps 500 BCE, and Malachi on June 13, perhaps 360-400 BCE



All are invited to participate between 3:30 and 5:15 on Tuesdays, meeting either at the Eggleston - Murta home, or via Zoom.

Come any and or all Tuesdays: each session is its own topic.




