As we reach the final Monday of 2025, I want to pause and celebrate the incredible ways you have served in the mission field this year. Your dedication has turned vision into reality. We owe a debt of gratitude to the Trustees of Trinity. This year, they oversaw vital improvements, including redoing the VCC plumbing and replacing our 30-year-old heating system. Thanks to their diligent study and wisdom, our facilities are now equipped to support our ministry for the next 20 to 25 years. Because of their work, Trinity remains a warm, welcoming space for members, seekers, and community partners alike.

Our vision for community beyond the sanctuary took root this year with the Trinity Educational Community Garden. Though in its infancy, we already have nine gardeners and growing interest from local neighbors and nonprofits. This outreach is more than just a garden; it is a pesticide-free source of nourishment and a place for spiritual growth.

When the government shutdown threatened SNAP benefits, Trinity's Mission Committee didn't hesitate. By opening the food pantry an extra day and providing 50 Thanksgiving boxes for struggling families, you became the hands and feet of Jesus during a time of great uncertainty.





SAVE THIS DATE!



See you there! (**Rain will cancel the clean-up.**)




TUMC Sunday School News

Rick, our son-in-Law cooked most of the Thanksgiving meal for the 12 attendees for dinner at our house. It was Thanksgiving, a great day!

On the Saturday after Thanksgiving since our grandson Matt was about 10, it has been their tradition for he and our son, Bill, to take his pickup to a Christmas tree farm in Nipomo and pick up trees for all members of the family who wanted them.

When Matt was a toddler Carole took him to breakfast at the Madonna Inn to see the Christmas decorations. It also became a family tradition, and the entire family went. This year it was more of a brunch than breakfast, with 12 in attendance.

We received a Christmas card from Jeannie and Alan Ashby, who used to be members of Trinity. They indicated Jeannie seems to be doing well, but Alan has serious health problems. One summer when I was teaching at Cal Poly, Jeannie took a class from me and sat in the front seat directly in front of me.

She said she always sat in the back, but because I was such a great storyteller, she didn't want to miss anything, so she sat in front. A Poly professor confirmed she sat in the back. My teaching career began team teaching U.S. History at Yuba City High. Our class size was around 80 and using my normal voice made my throat raw, so I used a softer voice. One of my Cuesta colleagues doing a peer review was surprised my voice was softer than when I was in my office. That might explain Jeannie sitting in front. The Ashby's now attend Atascadero UMC.

I mailed Christmas cards out, with about a week to go during Advent. When Cuesta College went to an "early start" ending the fall semester just before Christmas, I would be grading finals and figuring out grades during Advent. In one case, a woman in the Records Office gave me her home address in Morro Bay and I gave her my course grades on Christmas Eve, as her family was sitting down for dinner. Liturgically I was correct if I got my Christmas cards out during the 12 days of Christmas, and at least once I used them all, winding up on January fifth.

In Ralphs while shopping for the Social Hour layered dip, I saw Holly Holtz and her father, she gave me a big hug. It reminded me of a story Carole told how when she went into her class, our granddaughter Amanda, would always hug her. Carole asked the teacher if students teased Amanda because of the hugs. The teacher replied, no, Amanda teaches them what is proper. Holly seems to understand that, and it is great to see!


