




DECEMBER ADVENT STUDY

Thanksgiving Dinner Boxes 2023



As we do each year, we ask visitors to our food pantry, during the preceding month, if they want full Thanksgiving meal kits in a box. We had 25 orders by November 17. We decided to make 28 kits. These kits contain 14 items to make a complete Thanksgiving meal. We bought 16 turkeys and 7 turkey breasts from the food bank, and 11 hams from local grocery stores. We received cash donations from the congregation of about \$400 plus a donation of \$600 from the Los Osos Kiwanis. 18 church members helped pick up most of the food items from Spencers grocery store and pack boxes on Monday, Nov 20. Then on Tuesday November 21, five church members helped deliver and hand out the boxes. On Tuesday we had an extra person show up requesting a kit, so we quickly made one more. We delivered 3 boxes; we had 3 noshows, but the 3 extra boxes were given away within 2 days as new orders came in. The extra meat that we bought will be added to our pantry. Much thanks to all who helped with this big and important annual mission project.

Les commented we need to build each other up. I built the principal up and, in turn through Matt, he built me up and we both confirmed Rev. Les' observation.

On the 12th I attended Marie Rossenwassers' memorial service, a formal event by invitation only. Marie was a Cuesta College President; I was the only faculty member in attendance. She and I had a unique relationship. As a year was winding down, she asked me to her office to tell her how it had gone. I filled her in concerning what I had done with students; hosting study sessions at our house, taking students with me to professional conferences, students helping me organize conferences, as well as what I was doing in various professional organizations related to my disciplines. Every year thereafter we met, her last year at Cuesta, she gave me \$300 from a discretionary fund, no red tape, to help students I was taking to conferences. At her service several former Cuesta administrators on the program said how she mentored them and supported their programs. I was the first member of the audience to speak and focused on how she supported my students and me. When I sat down


