ADOPT-A-POLL PROGRAM

The Adopt-A-Poll (AAP) program serves three very important functions: It improves service to voters by increasing the number of committed precinct workers on Election Day. • It helps maintain the integrity of the elections process by providing training and support to AAP volunteers. • It offers local organizations the opportunity to raise funds while providing a vital service to their community.

It is also a wonderful team-building experience and provides participants with a great feeling of civic pride!

By organizing a group of dedicated volunteers, your group will "adopt" a local precinct on Election Day, meaning that your group will be assigned to staff an entire poll (or serve as a Precinct Board, as it is formally known). If you're fortunate enough to have lots of willing volunteers, you can even adopt more than one poll.

On average, an organization can earn about **\$600** per precinct that they adopt. Not only can you raise money, but you can share news of your group's participation in the program with the greater community.

We have had great success with this program and know that the money earned is put to good use by many deserving community organizations. We also rely on these dedicated volunteers to bolster our efforts on Election Day. So thank you!

Your response to my email/letter in July was wonderful. Many of you contacted me to get more information or to give me information, and some of you bumped up your giving to help. ALL is appreciated!

The Finance Committee manages the money but does not decide how to spend it... we are the "accountants." I went to the Board of Trustees in early August and will attend an SPRC meeting at the end of August to fully explain the budget and help our church leaders understand where we are financially, which will enable them to make informed decisions. While we will undoubtedly still end the year with a deficit, we have not had to draw from savings recently and hoped to end the year less in the red. I did get some questions about how we are paying for the community garden, and I am happy to report that while the community garden received a little bit of money out of the Memorials account as seed money, they have done the rest with grants and donations. Ray Bracken's History at TUMC From former Pastor, Mack Mitchell

We owe to him much of Trinity's expanding ministry in the 1960s.

His wise counsel and generous sharing of his art talent enabled us to produce what some then believed to be significant enhancement to our wide variety of ministering to the community: A Festival of Arts and Sciences: art shows, concerts, a lecture on DNA, connection with the Sisters of Sacred Heart when they "kicked" the habit as I teased them, establishing an AA group, and my wife, Marjorie, a successful candidate to be a Sunnyside school board member. Ray was in the thick of all those things.

The church grew from 57 members to over 150 in those seven years. We weathered my opposition to the Vietnam War, the building of the parsonage and classrooms, the creation of the Village Children's center, a Hippie couple and their infant son sleeping on the dining room floor in the parsonage, my presidency of the county committee for a Sane Nuclear Policy, and the assertively shared views of a John Birch Society member who complained to Bishop Kennedy about my sermons and community connections. The bishop sent word through the DS he had received a complaint. But no comment from him other than that. Ray gets credit for imagining and supporting much of that ministry.

Ray's wife, Sonya, never missed a turn of a phrase or unusual pairing of words in my sermons. Her "Ha!" could be heard across the chancel from where she sat in the choir on the left side of the sanctuary. I found it a challenge to get "one by her notice" but never failed to elude her "Ha." A power couple.


