The fallout of Special General Conference 2019 – Part 2

The Judicial Council of the United Methodist Church completed its three-day deliberations about the constitutionality of the Traditional Plan that was passed at the Special General Conference in February. As many expected, the results are

mixed, and it will likely take some time to figure out what all this means.

The Judicial Council ruled nine of the seventeen parts of the Traditional Plan to be constitutional, and the other eight to be unconstitutional. For example, it is unconstitutional to require that prospective members of the Board of Ordained Ministry to certify their willingness to comply with The Discipline (the United Methodist Church's constitution), in its entirety, and it is unconstitutional to require them to "conduct an examination to ascertain whether an individual is a practicing homosexual." However it did rule constitutional the prohibition of bishops consecrating as bishop a self-avowed practicing homosexual, or ordaining or consecrating self-avowed practicing homosexuals as deacons or elders.

In a separate ruling, which I find confusing, the Council ruled on the "Gracious Exit," legislation that would allow local churches to "disaffiliate" with the United Methodist Church. It seems that the provisions would allow a local church to leave the denomination and takes its property and assets... but it is less clear whether a Conference or jurisdiction can Disaffiliate with the General Church.

While all this has been going on the Western Jurisdiction and our Annual Conference have considered how we may move forward. Adam Hamilton, (the highest profile United Methodist pastor in the U.S. pastor of the Church of the Resurrection the largest UM church in the country), a long-time centrist, is leading a movement of moderates who are dissatisfied with the action of the Special General Conference in ways to move forward. There are discussions being held all over the country about how best to respond.

The clergy and laity of our Annual Conference have issued a "Statement in Response to General Conference 2019 from the Undersigned People of the California-Pacific Annual Conference of The United Methodist Church" that you can read online. (You will find a link on our Facebook page).

The bottom line is that we really do not know much more than we did at the end of February. The future of our denomination and our place in it continue to be in flux. Despite all the uncertainty Trinity will continue to seek faithful witness to God in the world. We will continue to welcome the lost, to proclaim the good news that in Jesus Christ God is working the reconciliation of the world, to feed the hungry and preserve the planet, to worship, to pray, and to hope for the fullness of the reign of God.

I don't know much about the future. I do know for certain that God is waiting for us there.

#### **Monday Night Home Group Continues**

Monday Night Home Group (MNHG), which now meets at the home of Mike and Kathy Lindsay and is facilitated by their daughter Kasey, has strongly reestablished itself after the move from Jeff Manildi's home in January. We have been examining Jesus and his message through the lens of social justice and asking, "What does it mean to be a Christian in today's world?" We have also compared Jesus' teachings to those of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. King introduced the concept of the Beloved Community, a representation of Heaven on Earth, where we celebrate diversity and strive to understand our enemies and work with compassion to gain true understanding and consensus in order to combat poverty, hunger, and homelessness. At MNHG we have delved into the Sermon on the Plain/Mount to find guidance in Jesus' word for creating the Beloved Community, or the Kingdom of God, and debated whether this is something that can be achieved on Earth or exists only in Heaven. We've also considered the Golden Rule, comparing its message to similar versions in other world religions, and struggled with how to apply it in a practical sense in our lives.

But MNHG is not just a philosophical endeavor. Each week we spend time at the beginning of our meeting to check in with each other and share news, frustrations, and celebrations. We take our time settling in to the space and coming together as a group focused on building relationships between members so that we can tackle some of the difficult issues surrounding Christianity and living as a Christian in today's world. And at the end of each session, we take time for each of us to share a "Grateful," something from the week that we are thankful for.

We have truly crafted a warm, compassionate, and welcoming space in which all of us are eager to gather each week. In the crazy, busy hustle of our lives, it's comforting to come together in love to share and exercise our hearts and minds and work to bring a little bit of Heaven down to Earth.

We invite you to join in any time. We meet from 6:30 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. every Monday. 

# **Adventures in Sunday School**

Since the beginning of the year, Sunday School has been a one-room affair, with attendees ranging in age from two to fifteen! It has been an exciting adventure for all of us. I have been teaching the kids for a full year now, and watching them really enjoy our time together has been inspiring.

In January we spent a lot of time talking about Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Ruby Bridges, and aspects of race relations then and now. A heavy topic for children, but picture books and puppets made the subject more accessible, and the kids thoroughly impressed me with their understanding and compassion. One of the highlights of the discussion for me was relating young Ruby Bridge's decision to pray for the white protesters who every day threatened her as she arrived to school as the first African American child to integrate it to these words from the Sermon on the Mount in Matthew, "...love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you."

In March we grappled with the General Conference decisions regarding LGBTQIA+ clergy and marriages. Each week a different group and age-range of students end up together in the Sunday School room, so when I have older kids, we discuss these issues more directly. However, with the younger kids we talk more about how God's Love is for all and no one should be excluded from God's Table. We wrote affirmations on a full-sized rainbow flag and decorated t-shirts with messages of love.

And then in April we had our annual Easter Egg Hunt. My oldest student got the honor of hiding the eggs with me, and the rest of the kids, ages two to twelve, were challenged with finding them. It was no easy task (and hints from this Sunday School teacher were required, along with some tree-climbing), but eventually all the eggs were retrieved, including the coveted Golden Egg (stuffed with a five-dollar bill)!

It is a true delight seeing the kids each week, and I've been blessed with their enthusiasm. We have spent time together after Sunday School just sitting in the Opal Room, hanging out while we eat food from Social Hour. And I've even had a child ask why we can't have Sunday School every day! It's such a gift to be able to create a space for the children that inspires them to want to be there!



Trinity UMC offers scholarships for post-high school education in a college, university, business, or trade school. Applications and information are available by visiting our website at www.trinitylososos.org/get-involved/scholarships. Applications must be turned in to the church office or postmarked by Friday, May 17.

#### Who May Apply:

An applicant shall be an active member or constituent of Trinity United Methodist Church at the time of application or if away at school, be active in another church or campus ministry. By active, we mean participation in worship services, youth group, and/or other church activities.

Applicants must, by their family or community relationships, scholastic abilities, or church participation record, have displayed qualities of leadership and good citizenship, and must indicate, by their acceptance in the school of their choice, sufficient ability to do satisfactory work.

#### How to Apply, and Responsibilities of the Applicant

- Obtain application form and instructions from the church office or church website.
- Arrange for most recently attended school to send a transcript of your grades to the church.
- Provide two letters of recommendation to be sent directly to the church: one from school faculty or an employer, and one from your Youth Director, Pastor, or Campus Minister.
- Submit to the committee, via the church office, the completed application form, with attached biographical sketch as specified in the application.
- Appear for an interview with the scholarship committee when requested.

You may also visit these UMC-related sites to access information and applications for available scholarship funds. Eligibility requirements and award amounts vary.
