



# EKKLESIA

*Swartz FBC Leader Discussion Guide*

**SCRIPTURE:** Matthew 16:13-20

**SERIES:** Ekklesia

**TITLE:** What Is a Church?

**BIG IDEA:** A Church is the people of God, built on Christ, unencumbered by death, and given Kingdom ownership.

---

## **SUMMARY**

If we are a church, what is a church? Where did we come from? What is our purpose? What is our identity? What are we supposed to do? Jesus gives us answers to these questions. The primary place is in a conversation with Peter when Peter realizes and says who Jesus is. From this confession that Jesus is the Son of the living God, Jesus says that it is on this rock (the rock of faith Peter shares in, not just the person of Peter alone) that Christ will build His church. Jesus is building a spiritual house comprised of stones (his people) built on the foundation of faith in His messiahship and inhabited by the true rock (Christ). There is a lot going on in this passage, but the intricacies and complexity bring forth a simple and powerful truth – The church will prevail because Christ has conquered. No persecution, apathy, abuse, or suffering will succeed in destroying Christ’s church. We are part of something bigger than ourselves and empowered by the Spirit of God to do His will.

## **TEXT**

### **Matthew 16:13-20**

<sup>13</sup> Now when Jesus came into the district of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, “Who do people say that the Son of Man is?” <sup>14</sup> And they said, “Some say John the Baptist, others say Elijah, and others Jeremiah or one of the prophets.” <sup>15</sup> He said to them, “But who do you say that I am?” <sup>16</sup> Simon Peter replied, “You are the Christ, the Son of the living God.” <sup>17</sup> And Jesus answered him, “Blessed are you, Simon Bar-Jonah! For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my Father who is in heaven. <sup>18</sup> And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it. <sup>19</sup> I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven.” <sup>20</sup> Then he strictly charged the disciples to tell no one that he was the Christ. <sup>1</sup>

## 2. DEATH COULDN'T HOLD JESUS; THEREFORE, IT CAN'T HOLD THE CHURCH

- What does it mean to cast our anxiety on to the Lord?

*Application Question: Are you living like death truly has no power?*

- Why is it so profound that God not only forgives us and saves us, but then grants us to have responsibility and ownership in His Kingdom?
- What does it mean to be a co-heir with Christ? (Galatians 4:7)

*Application Question: What responsibility has God given to you?*
